As I have announced previously, there are several spiritual challenge practice programs during this Lenten season. One of them is to walk in the Labyrinth at Rio Vista Park. I was so glad that I didn't need to worry about rainy days in Tucson, AZ, between March and April. Instead, I needed to consider the hot days sometimes. However, I became humble from yesterday until today, worrying so much about why it doesn't rain opposite to the weather forecast because I switched the place of spiritual prayer from Rio Vista Park to the Tea House Chapel in the church.

Unfortunately or fortunately, there was very little rain here in Tucson today. While I was driving to the church, I thanked God for the sprinkling rain because I didn't want to be a person who made a wrong decision. Also, I admit we can't control the weather at all; it entirely depends on the will of God.

How little control we have, and how helpless we as human beings are! How great and amazing our God is!

Since we met this morning at Tea House Chapel, we were able to compare our experience of the spiritual practice inside with being outside walking the Labyrinth at the park. available. The Labyrinth is often found at hospitals, retreat centers, prisons, churches, and many other places.

"The Labyrinth is a sacred place set aside for you to reflect, look within, pray, negotiate new behavior. The rhythm of walking, placing one foot in front of the other, empties the mind, relaxes the body, and refreshes the spirit. Unlike a maze, a Labyrinth has no blind alleys or dead ends" (Rev. Heesoon Kwon) because the Labyrinth has only one path, which leads us to the center.

Spiritual direction is about "holy listening," presence, and attentiveness (from the book 'Holy Listening' by Margaret Guenther). Spiritual direction is not psychotherapy nor an inexpensive substitute for pastoral counseling. Spiritual direction is the way for us to be driven to God, from wandering around to being intimate with God. Practicing spiritual direction is a way of seeking the expression of great trust and the immediate reaction to the person or situation to be reminded of the trust God has in us.

You and I are not trained spiritual directors. However, God loves all the amateurs. I hope and pray that all of you continue to claim yourself as an amateur seeking God's help and guidance in spiritual formation. It doesn't mean that we are useless or helpless. Rather, it means that we can help others at any time with the help and wisdom of God as long as we are humble and try to grow in spirituality.

Let us continue to have a journey exploring more spiritual practice and direction!

Animal Holidays - A Week at a Glance

March 30 - Manatee Appreciation Day



This day was created by the conservation organization "Save the Manatee Club" founded by Jimmy Buffet and former senator Bob Graham. This day is celebrated to bring awareness for the endangered manatee through education and protection. They are endangered due to pollution, loss of habitat, global warming, boating accidents, and hunting. Ways to get involved include learning

about them and donating to manatee rescue groups.

April 2 - National Ferret Day

This day was created by Carol Roche of the American Ferret Association (AFA) in 2014 to celebrate these wonderful domesticated pets. They have long slender bodies and are about 20 inches long and can weigh up to 4 lbs. Ferrets only have one breed and can come in seven different colors or patterns. Ferrets are legal as pets in all states except California and Hawaii.



April 3 - World Aquatic Animals Day



This day was created in 2020 by the Animal Law Clinic at the Lewis & Clark Law School to raise awareness of the importance of aquatic animals and how to protect them. The goal of this day is to have worldwide involvement in creating laws, policies, and education to help protect aquatic animals for future generations. Ways to get involved include watching documentaries

on sea life, donating, or writing letters to representatives to change laws.

April 4 - World Rat Day

This day was created in 2002 by rat enthusiasts who wanted to change the way people viewed rats in the world. This day celebrates them in a positive and respectful way to promote their care and welfare as pets. They are clean and sociable animals that can make great pets. There are more than 60 species of rats in the world, with only seven types of rats considered to be pet rat breeds.



April 4 - World Stray Animals Day



This day is to educate and bring awareness to the overwhelming problem of stray animals around the world. The World Health Organization estimates that there are more than 200 million stray dogs around the world, and CAROcat estimates more than 480 million stray cats in the world. In the US there are more than 70 million stray dogs and cats. Some of the ways to help include adopting or fostering a stray; donating; volunteering; getting animals spayed/neutered; and keeping your pet for life.
