TIHAN Needs Our Help

What is TIHAN? It is the Tucson Interfaith HIV/AIDS Network. RMN has partnered with TIHAN to further their goals of HIV education and support.

MISSION: TIHAN provides community resources and caring support so that people with HIV can live well. Through education, we work to encourage everyone to get tested, get involved, and reduce the stigma of HIV.

VISION: Creating a community where everyone knows their HIV status, and where every person – regardless of status – is supported and affirmed to live as well as possible and stay healthy and engaged in the community.

The statistics are saddening: In Pima County alone, there are approximately 3,000 people living with HIV. 38% of new HIV infections here occur in those under 30 years old, and 47% occur in people of color. Furthermore, 67% of people living with HIV that TIHAN serves nationally met the 2019 US poverty guidelines. 1 in 7 Americans with HIV do not even know they have the virus.

SOUL KITCHEN

Garden Quiche

Ingredients

1 tsp olive oil

6 cups fresh spinach

2 eggs

1 cup half-and-half

1 cup Monterey Jack cheese, shredded

1 cup Swiss cheese, shredded

1 tsp onion powder

½ tsp salt

¼ tsp black pepper

1 (9 inch) ready-to-bake deep-dish pie crust

1 cup cherry tomatoes, sliced

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat. Add spinach and cook 1 minute, just until spinach starts to wilt.
- 3. In a large bowl, beat eggs and half-and-half until well combined. Add cheeses, onion powder, salt, and pepper; mix well. Stir in spinach and tomatoes and pour into pie crust.
- 4. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until firm. Let sit 5 minutes, then cut into wedges and serve.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

John 2:13-22

The story we find in the Gospel of John is famous because of the emotions we find Jesus displaying. Contrary to the gentle, kind, meek, compassionate, loving image of the good shepherd, we see frustration, anger, and a whole lot that is left to interpretation based on his actions. It is so unlike Jesus' character, it almost leaves us with a sense of awe. What was Jesus so angry about?

The problem was not in the money changers or the marketplace that had been set there. These were necessary functions in order for the passover requirements to be met. The problem was two fold. First, those who were in power (sellers, exchangers, or the temple representatives) were taking advantage of the vulnerable, those who had traveled long and hard, those who were non-natives, those who were required to make an offering, but had no power as to set the rates of exchange nor the cost of the animals. Second, those who participated were forgetting their original purpose of responding to God's mercy but were more focused on what was convenient or how the market value was.

Perhaps, we are due for a temple cleansing of our own. To lay ruin to the function of a soulless ritual and return to the heart of worship for God in thanksgiving for God's love and grace made known in and through Jesus Christ.
