Greetings in the resurrected Christ,

I deeply appreciate your trust, support, and prayers for my participation in the PIM (Partners In Ministry) in the Western Jurisdiction Leadership and Young Clergy Retreat of the DSW (Desert Southwest Annual Conference). Both of them were new to me; it was only possible for me to attend after moving to Tucson and serving the First Church of Tucson.

Even though I needed to work on April 17th until midnight for next Sunday's worship, I was excited to meet other Korean pastors to get connected in PIM. On Monday, April 18th, at 6 AM, I drove to the airport in Phoenix, AZ and began my week-long journey with Halla.

My body was almost dead because I was too tired to get everything that needed to be done. However, once I arrived at the place and joined other pastors (most of whom I didn't know), I was able to get to know the pastors in the Western Jurisdiction Korean Ministries. Connectionalism is so powerful in the Methodism movement.

The founder of PIM is pastor Woongmin Kim who was a District Superintendent. Whenever he visited small churches or churches far from the Korean communities, he felt sorry and wanted to help them. He initiated building up strong relationships with pastors who are eligible to help others to set up some bridges between the two. So, they became partner churches to one another. Since 2016, PIM is one of the powerful ministries models that has modeled and influenced other ministries at the California-Pacific Annual Conference.

I experienced the radical hospitality the hosting church had provided for all the participants for four days, which was outstanding, so I am so grateful that I am part of the PIM. Partner churches discussed ways we can work together to build God's kingdom and do the mission of Christ together. Please continue to pray for this amazing partnership in ministry. Our partner church is Holliston United Methodist Church-Dream Church in Pasadena, CA.

From Friday through Sunday, Halla and I participated in the Young Clergy Retreat of the DSW. As you know, I haven't had many chances to get to know the clergy and their families in AZ since I moved to Tucson. So it was a perfect time for us to get to know each other and meet each other's colleagues. Also, Halla could make friends who are also PK (Pastor's kid). Several girls there are in the same grade as Halla so she was so happy to be there. There is an old saying in Korea, "가화만사성 (Ga-Hwa-Maan-Sa-Seong)," which means you will do great in other places if your family is in peace.

SOUL KITCHEN

Chicken Cordon Bleu Rice Casserole

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp olive oil ½ onion, diced
- 2 Tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1 c chicken broth
- ½ c milk
- 2 c shredded deli rotisserie chicken
- 1 c chopped ham
- 2 c cooked rice
- 1½ c (6 oz) shredded Swiss cheese
- 3/4 c Italian style bread crumbs
- 1 Tbsp melted butter Chopped fresh parsley for garnish, if desired

Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 400°F. Lightly grease a 10-inch round baking dish with olive oil; set aside.
- 2. In a 10-inch skillet, heat 2 Tbsp olive oil over medium-high heat. Add onion; cook until tender and translucent, stirring occasionally. Add flour; stir to make a roux. Cook roux 1 to 2 minutes or until lightly golden. Gradually beat in broth with whisk, followed by milk, and simmer until slightly thickened into a gravy.
- 3. In large bowl, mix chicken, gravy, ham, rice and 1 cup of the cheese. Spread evenly in baking dish.
- 4. In another bowl, mix bread crumbs and butter to coat well. Add remaining ½ c cheese. Top casserole with bread crumb mixture; bake about 20 minutes or until top is crisp and golden and casserole is bubbling.

Note from Tripp:

"I made this on Monday night with some alterations: Cheddar and Colby Jack instead of Swiss, double the amount of onion, and panko instead of bread crumbs. It turned out so delicious and filling! Just don't forget to season the food at each step of cooking–skipping the salt would leave this dish too bland to really enjoy."

Animal Holidays - A Week at a Glance

April 26 - National Audubon Day



This day honors ornithologist John James Audubon, a well-known wildlife illustrator and naturalist. He painted, cataloged and described the birds of North America. He was born on April 26, 1785. He became famous for his 435 paintings that described 700 bird species with his book "Birds of America".

April 26 - National Help a Horse Day

This day was created in 2013 by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA). Their goal is to create awareness to help promote protection of neglected, unwanted, and abused horses in the U.S. There are programs that promote horse rescue, rehabilitation, and adoption.



April 27 - World Tapir Day



This day was created in 2008 to bring awareness and help protect the tapir from going extinct. There are five species of tapir found in Central/South America and Southeast Asia. They are considered to be endangered or vulnerable. Celebrate this day by going to the zoo or donating to tapir conservation.

April 27 - International Guide Dog Day

This day was created in 1992 to celebrate and honor the hard-working dogs who help the visually impaired. Guide Dogs provide services such as leading visually impaired people around, picking up dropped items, alerting them to danger, assisting with tasks, and of course as emotional support.





April 27 - Marine Mammal Rescue Day

This day was created by California Senator Tom Atkins on April 27, 2017. To recognize the efforts of wildlife biologists, veterinarians, and animal care specialists who rescue marine animals along the entire California coastline. There are 8 member organizations in the Marine Mammal Stranding Network.

April 30 - Save the Frogs Day

The 14th Annual Save the Frogs Day was created to bring awareness and conservation efforts to the frogs of the world. There are over 5,000 species of frogs in the world and over 500 species that are considered to be critically endangered. Celebrate by learning about your local frogs.
