"Can't We All Just Get Along?"

These famous words from the 1992 Los Angeles riots may be something many of us resonate with. To be correct, these were not Mr. Rodney King's words. His actual words were, "People, I just want to say, you know, can we all get along?"

Notice the difference? The negative contraction is missing. This difference matters because Mr. King's original expression, one that is positive, hides a painful reality. Despite Mr. King being a victim of violence himself by abusers of power and privilege, he felt he must remain positive (*and silent*) about the very situation which caused the outburst.

More cynically, I believe he was convinced (by persons of privilege) to take such a position in order for the media to portray his positive demeanor and calm people's nerves. By the way, that is how oppression works. Tell the victim that they must change in order to fix what was wronged to them. (Another example, tell the raped woman that it was her fault. She should have dressed more appropriately. Ugh.)

The truth is, for most of us, we all want to get along. We all want to be able to move past our division and hate. It is likely why we remember this quote the way we do. "Can't we all just get along?" As in, "Why can't we?" We should be able to. (cont. pg 5)

Can't We All Just Get Along? (cont.)

It has been nearly 30 years since the Los Angeles Riots, and regretfully, we are in no better a place. Racism is just as prevalent and pronounced. Hate crimes and hateful speech still increase, now extending beyond the black and white narrative, to the brown, and most recently, to the yellow.

Perhaps, just being quiet and playing nice is not an effective strategy. It may be that by choosing to be silent or to be positive at the cost of reconciliation that comes from recognition, we are also choosing to ignore the suffering, which does not lead to healing but even more suffering. True reconciliation comes only after we fully recognize the harm done by our actions.

American abolitionist Frederick Douglass once said, "Those who profess to favor freedom and yet depreciate agitation are people who want crops without ploughing the ground; they want rain without thunder and lightning; they want the ocean without the roar of its many waters. The struggle may be a moral one, or it may be a physical one, or it may be both. But it must be a struggle. Power concedes nothing without a demand. It never did and it never will." More than 200 years later, his words are prophetic in our age.

I hope to become reconciled. I pray that we would be moved by the Holy Spirit to face the truth, despite how difficult, uncomfortable, or inconvenient it may be.
