Dear Members and Friends of the Desert Southwest Conference,

In the familiar Christmas song, French composer Adolphe Adam wrote these words of encouragement: "A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices, for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn!"

In these weeks of Advent, we light successive candles and hear messages in scripture, song, and word about hope, peace, joy and love. We look toward December 25 with faithful anticipation of the birth of the Christ child!

Likewise, with a spirit of expectation, news of the COVID-19 vaccines brings hope to a weary world. It is right and just that medical care workers are among the first to receive the vaccine. We pray that they will be protected even as they continue to care for many who are hospitalized or in need of medical assistance. Even with this new hope in the vaccine, we watch as the rates of COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths continue to rise to alarming levels in Nevada and Arizona. Many churches that began offering some form of in-person worship (outdoors, drive-thru, or socially-distanced indoors) have scaled back and are returning to primarily online, virtual worship. This is a safer and more responsible practice in our communities at this time.

Please keep our commitment to "Do no harm" and care for others by observing these safety precautions: wear a mask, practice social distancing, stay home as much as possible, wash your hands. Please continue to practice the procedures in your local church's comprehensive plan and covenants. And keep praying fervently for an end to this pandemic.

There is hope! But we must continue to do our utmost in these next weeks and months. As we celebrate a very different Christmas, New Year and Epiphany, here is a prayer that brings hope to my heart:

A Blessing - With a Touch of the Miraculous



He in fact was kind enough to retrieve it along with the customer service person.

Now there was no question about talking to God! How amazingly blessed I was to not have to go through all the steps one needs when their money, property, and identity is stolen. I'm feeling this might even fit into the category of 'amazing grace'.

Ongoing Work of The INN

"Our church has been a blessing to asylum seekers, as this Christmas tree photo shows from last December. Since the winter of 2016, thousands of lives have been touched. As an update--U.S. agencies stopped bringing families to our shelter in March of 2020. Pastor Paul. Gretchen Lopez, and other Board members have met every month via zoom with a heart to learn and help. Migrants wait in very hard circumstances south of the border and in US detention centers. FUMC graciously provides storage, and with the help of partners-- hygiene

products and baby items have been delivered to several camps.

What next? Policies will shift again. Volunteers will be needed. Pray as we work to find a new shelter site(s) to provide hospitality, but much differently, given the need for separation of guests and volunteers during the pandemic. The song Shine, Jesus, Shine, also known with its first line Lord, the Light of Your Love, was written by Graham Kendrick in 1987 and published the same year by Make Way Music.

Graham Kendrick (1950) is an English singer, songwriter, and worship leader. Kendrick was trained as a teacher, but in 1972 he started writing songs and until now he has composed more than 400 hymns. Undoubtedly, his most successful composition is *Shine*, *Jesus*, *Shine*. In 2005, in a survey by the BBC's Songs of Praise program, this joyful song was voted tenth of the United Kingdom's favorite hymns.

This hymn has been performed in several important events around the world; its words of hope and joy have been translated to various languages, arriving to thousands of people worldwide. Enjoy!

Lord, the light of your love is shining In the midst of the darkness, shining; Jesus, Light of the world, shine upon us, Set us free by the truth you now bring us. Shine on me, shine on me.

Shine, Jesus, shine,
Fill this land with the Father's glory,

RESPONDING

Respond to the reflection through the guidance from the Holy Spirit.
