

ROAD ACCIDENTS IN BENGALURU IN 2023

Road accidents have been a bane in the city in the recent past and are a source of concern for the administration, the law enforcement department and the public alike. The absolute number of road accidents in Bengaluru City has also been growing at an alarming rate.



The proportion of fatal accidents in the total road accidents has consistently increased since 2011 from 12.6% to 19.6% in 2022. The severity of road accidents measured in terms of persons killed per 100 accidents has also increased

In the year 2023, a total of 4,499 accidents have occurred by the end of November month. Out of this, 794 were fatal crashes with 823 people getting killed. Non Fatal Accidents were 3705 in number and 3,802 people were injured in the accidents.

The fatality rate is high for Vulnerable Road Users^{*} (VRU), as sharing the same road space with other motorized vehicles increases their susceptibility to crashes.

* Vulnerable Road Users (VRU) are defined in the ITS Directive as "non-motorised road users, such as pedestrians and cyclists as well as motor-cyclists and persons with disabilities or reduced mobility and orientation"



∧ Much-awaited Whitefield-Challaghatta Metro corridor (Purple Line) was operational from October 9, 2023



∧ The Karnataka Cabinet approved upgradation of 136 traffic signals and installation of new adapative signals at 29 places in Bengaluru



- Much awaited Japanese adaptive traffic signals in Bengaluru to finally get electricity connection
- A By the end of 2023, Bengaluru had a total of 1.1 crore vehicles – Of them, 75.6 lakh are two wheelers and 23.1 lakh are cars
- ∧ Bengaluru's tech corridor, Outer Ring Road (ORR), experienced unusual traffic congestion on September 27, which prompted the traffic police to issue an advisory to IT companies to delay the logouts



"Rising Road Fatalities: Bengaluru's Struggle with Road Safety Challenges" - According to the report, Road accidents in India - 2022' published by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) released in mid-2023, with respect to the number of fatalities, Delhi recorded the highest number of deaths in 2022, followed by Bengaluru with 772 road accident deaths in the year 2022
