In this project the accident analysis report was used to identify 10 accident black spots in Bangalore for and remedial recommendations were given, a pilot project, Blackspot treatment was initiated.

A 10-pronged approach was adopted and counter measures were developed under all the four E's - Engineering, Enforcement, Education and Emergency to tackle the accident blackspot

An in-depth analysis of the accident blackspot is carried out in terms of drawing stick and collision diagrams, arriving at dominant accident pattern, after understanding the problems faced by road-


A holistic package of possible counter measures is suggested and the costs thereof are worked

the implementation strategy is planned with roles of various implementing agencies and Earmarked budgets are planned for each of the implementing agencies

Road Accidents in Bengaluru have been gradually increasing this year compared to the previous years. Within the first months of 2024, Bengaluru witnessed 170 fatal cases and 700 nonfatal cases out of which Devanahalli Traffic Police Station Limits noticed a maximum of 16 fatalities due to high speeds on the elevated corridor followed by Electronic City TPS limits with 12 and Kengeri TPS Limits with 9 **fatalities**
