New Year Plans and Key Dates

Safeguarding:

The safety and well-being of our students are of paramount importance to us. We remain committed to upholding the highest standards of safeguarding within our school community, ensuring that all students are provided with a secure and supportive environment in which to learn and thrive.

School Crossing

Regarding safety around the school premises, we have implemented measures such as repainting pedestrian crossings and installing relevant signage to ensure the safety of both students and parents during drop-off and pickup. We urge all parents to adhere strictly to these measures and set an example for others to follow. Furthermore, we urge you to collect your child from inside the school gates, in alignment with our safeguarding protocols. Security staff are stationed at the main gate to uphold security protocols, and we ask for your full support and cooperation with this matter.

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Health and Safety

Finally, we kindly remind parents to always supervise their children after school hours, (2:15 pm for Nursery, 3:15 pm for all other students). Running around the premises and climbing on railings may pose potential risks to their safety. Your vigilance in ensuring the well-being of our students is greatly appreciated.



Focus: Keeping children safe online.

Over the holidays, it is likely that children will be spending more time online. Whilst the online world offers

a great deal of entertainment and information for children, it does come with risk. Here are some top tips

for helping children stay safe online:

- 1) Talking regularly with your child is the greatest tool to help keep them safe online. Talking regularly and making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your
- child feel relaxed. It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you.
- 2) Manage the amount of time your child is online. Balance it with other activities that are away from a screen.
- 3) Set up parental controls to block any upsetting or inappropriate content. Information about setting up parental controls can be found here: https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keeping-children-safe/online-safety/parental-controls/
- 4) Give your child the strategies they need in case something concerning happens whilst they are using their device. This could be to lock the screen and tell an adult, to make a report to the platform they are using, or to block the user.
- 5) Talk to your child about how they communicate online and remind them that anything they put online, whether it's via WhasApp, Instagram, TikTok or YouTube, can be shared widely. Is what hey are sharing kind? True? Helpful? Safe?
