Dear Parents

I trust you are all well.

On behalf of the BASM staff and community I would like to say thank you for your support since the school reopened in September. As a staff we have been working hard to fulfil our mission, providing a rigorous and engaging curriculum and promoting student wellbeing.

We have also been establishing key routines for learning throughout the school and developing students social and emotional wellbeing through our pastoral program. The establishment of a strong and supportive pastoral program begins when the students arrive to school and begin their day during Class/Tutor group activities. We have also established a regular schedule for assemblies, including whole school assembly on Friday afternoon where we focus on celebrating student successes. Our Personal Social Health Education, (PSHE) curriculum is delivered through dedicated timetabled lessons in each year group, these lesson focus on personal, physical, social, and emotional development appropriate to each age group, and take a thematic approach, this term the focus has been on Relationships, Tolerance and Respect of Others.

Within our week we have also built-in enrichment activities, these are linked to our values, current affairs, and include STEAM, (Science Technology English Art Maths) activities. We have introduced student leadership opportunities with the formation of the BASM Student Council, with representatives from each section of the school, Primary and Secondary. We will be introducing Extra Curricula Activities, (E.C.A.s), after half term, these will take place on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday each week and provide students with the opportunity to sign up to several different clubs including Sports, Arts, Wellness, and Homework support, more information to follow later this week. In all areas of the school, we are encouraging students to be creators and innovators and supporting students personal and emotional development.

New learning management systems have been introduced this year include:

iSams- (MIS)Management Information System being rolled out, currently used for storing school data, recording, and analysing school attendance, reporting and assessment data. Over the course of the next half term further developments and use of the system will be implemented and rolled out. Please note we will shortly be sending out a request to confirm student information and updates for parent/guardian contacts, this is to ensure the data we have in our system is accurate and up to date. Tapestry- Learning Journal EYF and Primary- Learning communication platform

This has been introduced and is currently in the pilot stage, after half term parents will be introduced to this platform which will open the flow of communication.

Monster Phonics: Supporting Literacy and language development in Early Years and Key Stage 1.

We also continue to use the Google for Education platform- Google Classroom, specifically in secondary for communicating lesson information and homework.

Teaching and Learning

Curriculum review took place to introduce consistent practice across the school, this included

- Introduction of subject exercise books, specific colours for each subject.
- Student progress tracking sheets
- Student school dairy for home school communication
- Homework timetable
- 6 week learning cycle, including key assessment points
- CAT 4 Assessments- for students in Year 2-10

Assessing student progress:

This year we introduced GL Assessments, standardised tests, Cognitive Ability Tests, (CAT 4), for all students in years 2–10. In reception and year 1, teachers conducted baseline assessments linked to core foundation areas. These assessments have provided staff with data to support curriculum planning and target setting for students in each subject area enabling progress to be measured at key points throughout each term and on-going formative assessments to take place regularly in lessons.

In the last two weeks students have participated in assessments, enabling teachers to formerly assess the progress of the students. After half term you will be invited to discuss your child's progress with their teachers. Please refer to the table below for the dates and times for each section of the school.

Staffing:

Recruitment of new staff is ongoing; we thank you for your trust and support as we work to engage fully qualified international teachers to add to our academic team. We will continue to keep you updated as we engage new staff. October 17th
