arch 2024 brings a time change (spring ahead!), a continuation of Lent, Spring arrives, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter Sunday (with a brunch-themed potluck!) Wow! March 2024 also brings the reminder of 3 years ago when everything shut down as that mysterious, novel and potent (often deadly) virus made its way across the country.



Shutting down, wearing masks, social distancing, hand sanitizing, zoom worship were new things to figure out. And, we did. One way or another, these changes were incorporated into our personal lives and the lives of the congregation. Worship happened without choir anthems or congregational singing; communion elements were little packages of juice and wafer; the peace was passed through the sign of peace or love and coffee hour was cancelled. Uff! But, like the Israelites in the wilderness, we got through it (though the covid virus is still around.)

Not an easy time to remember....but in retrospect, there were lessons learned. We discovered relationships between family, friends, co-workers and neighbors really are important. Worship can glorify God even without music! Online worship allowed people to attend worship that were previously unable to do so. In many situations, God pried our fingers off of traditions and the "way we've always done things." God was doing a new thing and shaking up our ways during the pandemic. God is always about doing new things, shaping and molding God's children to become more like Jesus.

As this season of Lent continues, we have an opportunity to dig deep and ask questions. How is my relationship with Jesus? Where is there a need to repent or to ask forgiveness? Is God trying to do a new thing in my life? How is God working in my heart or my life to be less self-centered and more neighbor-centered?

What is my cross to bear with Jesus? What are my fingers clutching to that God is trying to pry off? Take one or two questions and explore them through prayer and by talking to others. What lessons is God trying to teach me? For me, I thank God for the lessons of that pandemic and how we might continue to apply them, in our lives and in this congregation. In good times and in hard, God loves us all the way to the cross.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present: Sheryl Eriksen, Barb Leland, John Coefield, Karen Witte, Arlyn "Butch" Plowman and Jim Meyer. Elder Jeff Chaffee attended on Zoom. Elder Patti Borsberry was excused. Also in attendance: Clerk of Session John Gneckow, Treasurer Leo Potter and Deacon Joy Edgar.

**APPROVAL OF DOCKET:** A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket as presented.

Vanguard accounts showed an increase of \$4,970.49 for the month.

One nonprofit has toured a portion of the church for possible leasing as office space.

**ACTION ITEM:** Requests Session appoint an ad hoc subcommittee for the shared use of the campus. We request that Linda Bench, John Warren, and John Coefield be appointed as members of the committee and the Treasurer (Leo Potter) be included as an ex officio member. Motion passed unanimously.

Building and Grounds: Chair John Coefield reported.

Active Shooter training is set for February 27 at 2:00 PM in the fellowship area.

DPHHS has requested building use. Okayed 50% off.

Contractor has been notified that snow removal on Sundays is a priority.

The next meeting is March 13, 2024.

Christian Education Committee: Chair John Coefield reported.

Vicky Bryan connected FPC to the Legal Services Developer Program DPHHS which is interested in hosting three (3) events at FPC.

In March, Estate Planning 101 open to the public free of charge.

In April, a one-day training for professionals in the aging services field.

In April, a free clinic to assist registered clients with estate planning documents—to be drafted and notarized free of charge.

Chair John Coefield proposed the Pumpkin Patch be moved to Mission and Outreach committee.

**ACTION ITEM:** The committee requests Session approval of the Nursery Care Job Description. Motion carried. NOTE: an adult volunteer church member will also be in attendance.

Congregational Fellowship: Chair Sheryl Eriksen reported.

A 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Potluck will take place on March 31 following the worship service. The theme will be "Brunch" consisting of breakfast casseroles or dishes, fruit trays, donuts, bagels w/crème cheese, jam, or peanut butter.

**ACTION ITEM**: Committee requests approval of Ria Caussyn as a member of the committee. Motion carried.

Hand and Foot card games continue every Friday at 1:30 pm.

The next meeting will be on March 13 at 2:00 PM.

Memorial Committee: Did not meet.

Mission Committee: Chair Karen Witte reported.

Mark Nay, Street Minister for Good Samaritan, was our guest. He described his work with the unsheltered and the challenges they face in their efforts to find shelter in Helena. He stated that in the long run it is more costly to NOT help them than it is to help them.

Joy Edgar reported that Panda Express is holding a fund raiser on February 24. A portion of the day's receipts will be donated to Family Promise.

The Mission Committee approved a donation of \$200 to be used for a newly established First Nation Scholarship fund. The scholarships will be used to send First Nations youth to the 4H Congress at Bozeman for leadership training.

FPC collected funds for Energy Share on February 18<sup>th</sup>.

Our next hosting of Family Promise will be February 25 and 26.

100 cuddle buddies will be presented to Alayna Hutchings for her Mission of visiting children in various hospitals.

Disbursement of the Tithe Funds from the Vanguard funds was discussed. The committee is looking at sending the funds to a hospital in the Gaza strip area if we are confident the funds will reach and be used for those in need.

The next meeting is March 11, 2024, at 1:00 PM.

Nominating Committee: No meeting was held.

Personnel Committee: Chair Jeff Chaffee reported no meeting was held.

Worship Committee: No report submitted to Session.

Lent Planning Team: A report was submitted to Session.

The committee discussed the meaning of Lent and felt that giving and serving others and repairing/restoring relationships would be more in keeping with Lent. They discussed including prayers specifically for those different needs.
