Pentecost

The Pentecost offering helps guide young people in Christian formation from their earliest years to young adulthood. On July 7, 2007, JD and Nikki Carabin opened their garage to skaters on what would become the first Friday Night Skate. Soon, close to 20 came each Friday night. Many of these kids would show up right after school and stay till midnight. No one was calling to see where their kids were. No one was checking to see if they had eaten. JD confessed, "My wife and I sold anything we had of value to fund the ministry. Eventually, we sold our home as well." Over the next few years, a dozen kids stayed with the couple to escape substance, physical and emotional abuse. Today, JuJu meets in a new space at the Gateway Mall. The group's mission: Serious JuJu is an indoor skatepark that creates a safe and healthy space. We see, feed, and strengthen youth and families through the actions of God's love.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration Committee: Chair Jim Meyer reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Treasurer Leo Potter noted FPC had a net operating revenue of \$880 for March. YTD operating revenue is negative \$2629. Donations for the month were \$16,383 to the general fund with total revenue of \$22,961.99.

Vanguard accounts showed an increase of \$10,437.48 in March.

The Memorial Committee did not meet during the month.

Premiums for Brotherhood Insurance are increasing.

ACTION ITEM: Session approve an increase in the budget for this year to account for the increase of \$2,117 for insurance. Motion passed unanimously.

Approved the use of Anderson funds to pay for books and tuition for Dianna Goodman's CLP training.

The Ad Hoc committee on sharing the FPC campus is receiving interest in the space. The committee has been receiving assistance from attorney Chad Smith on zoning and other legal issues needing to be addressed. Chad also recommended that FPC produce a fact sheet to provide interested parties and also help us focus on what we have available for an outside party to utilize.

Building and Grounds has reported that FPC had a fire inspection recently. Most of the deficiencies are being addressed by our handyman and a committee member. Two things need special attention: a fireproof curtain for the stage in Richardson Hall and the North door opening on 11th Avenue needs to be able to be used as an emergency exit in the event of fire. A follow-up inspection is scheduled for May 14, 2024.

The next Administration meeting: May 8 at 4:00 PM.

Building and Grounds: No meeting while Chair John Coefield is gone. The next meeting is scheduled for April 24, 2024.

Christian Education Committee: Did not meet in March.

Congregational Fellowship: Chair Sheryl Eriksen reported, and a written report

was submitted to Session.

The next 5th Sunday Potluck will take place on June 30 following the worship service.

The congregation is being asked to donate miscellaneous toiletries and personal hygiene products for women through May 12th as part of Mother's Day activities. The collected items will be given to the YWCA, Florence Crittenton, and the Friendship Center.

Similar to the Mother's Day activity, for Father's Day, the congregation will be asked to donate socks, shaving products, and grooming items for men from May 19 through June 16. Collected items will be given to God's Love, Our Place, and Good Samaritan to distribute.
