From the Pastor's Desk

ver the summer, the view out my office has included a variety of heavy equipment, a police car parked so the officer can work on reports, skateboarders whizzing by, cars zooming by, bikers, walkers and people coming and going into the building. Our parking lot has been busy as has the neighborhood. Construction/reconstruction on Rodney, a roofing on the Tem-



ple, working on the Cathedral spires and repaving on 11th Street. Each one has included a time of transition. None of it happened overnight. At times, it was loud and messy, distracting and annoying. But other times, it was a sign of something new coming into being!

I'm grateful for all that activity. It serves as a reminder that we too are in a process of transition. It doesn't happen overnight, it gets messy and yet...there are signs of something new coming.

What are those signs?

A key piece of the process to call a pastor in the PC(USA) is the Mission Study. This will be presented to Session this fall. That Mission Study needs to be approved by the Committee on Ministry (COM) which will happen this fall. If COM suggests any edits or changes, those are sent back to Session. When the Study has final approval from COM, only then can a Special Congregational Meeting be called to elect the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). From there, the PNC begins its work of writing the Mission Discernment Profile (MDP), it's like a resume of the church. When that is finished, the church profile is uploaded to the Church Leadership Connection website and pastors can apply for the position.

All of this is a lengthy process but then, calling a pastor is like a marriage between God and 2 people. In this case, it will be between God, FPC and a permanent pastor. This process cannot be rushed, it — like all things in transition — takes time. They happen in God's time and through the work of the Holy Spirit.

This summer there were days when the work on the road actually caused the building to shake. It was startling to feel that! Some days the work in the neighborhood was so loud with beeping, grinding and

pounding. Some days it looked like nothing was changing, nothing was happening. But that was to my untrained eyes. Then I noticed less of those noises, less of that work going on and the roadways were finished. The roof across the street at the Temple Emanu-El was completed and it all looked finished. I was so excited to see our parking lot open again, the smooth street and the roof done. One day, this interim process will finish too, and your new permanent pastor will be here.

In the meantime, trust God, pray for your Elders, Deacons and the Nominating Committee and above all...remember Deut. 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

MINUTES OF THE SESSION FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (PCUSA) HELENA, MONTANA

August 15, 2023

The regular meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena was called to order on Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at 6:35 PM by Reverend Janet Potter.

Pastor Janet opened with a devotion from Eugene Peterson's LIV-ING THE MESSAGE. The devotion was based on Galatians 5.

Pastor Janet then opened the meeting with prayer and moderated the meeting.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present: Arlyn "Butch" Plowman, Sheryl Eriksen, Barb Leland, Mary Stiles, Jeff Chaffee, Patti Borsberry, and (via phone) John Coefield. Executive Session: For a second time during the meeting, a motion to enter executive session was made, seconded, and approved. The purpose of the motion was to discuss the Worship committee now that the recent chairman has resigned.

Pastor Janet handed out copies of the committee and Sanctuary Coordinator job descriptions. She noted that the committee is extremely task oriented and that the remaining members are also paid staff. This means that the meetings are more like staff meetings rather than the meeting of a committee. She asked the Session members to think about and to pray about modifications or ideas that might be made and include input from the congregation to make this a committee rather than another staff meeting.

As part of the motion for the executive session included adjournment at the close of the executive session.

Elder Mary Stiles closed the meeting with prayer.
