Helena Habitat for Humanity workday Aug. 3

A new volunteer program will help HHH prepare for our workday. It is a preregistration process that allows the organization to have proper staffing for the day.

HHH also uses the preregistration program to keep track of the hours that have been spent working on the six homes it is currently building. Those hours are given to Habitat for Humanity International. The hour tracking helps the organization to successfully apply for AmeriCorps members from across the country to come build with them for a 10 ½ month term.

The preregistration program is called "Volunteer Hub." You are required to create a profile and register at least 24 hours prior to the August 3 date if you plan to participate. The registration will close at that time.

appy Summer! If we look out our window, we see...green trees, green grass and beautiful flowers with green leaves. I am thankful for the rain we've had lately which will keep Mother nature lush and green. As nature is green in the summer season, the church clothes (paraments) in our sanctuary are also green. The church season is called "ordinary time." Days seem the same, like a record on



repeat. But, this time of year in the church or in life is anything but ordinary!

Rev. Kathleen Long Bostrom wrote about this "in-between season": "The Scripture passages assigned to Ordinary Time set the tone. They focus on the day-to-day life of Jesus. We read what it means from a practical standpoint to follow Jesus and the social and practical implications of doing so. Scripture and sermons focus on building a community of believers, people who would be Jesus' wounded hands, aching feet, awkward elbows and soothing voice. Jesus told stories and broke bread with a few folks at a time, not always the boisterous crowds. He listened carefully and hung out with the no-names. He fell asleep in a boat during a storm. The ordinary abides in the extra ordinary, and vice versa. Ordinary Time is a time for us to discover that in Christ, our lives are filled with grace, forgiveness and hope. We live as people of faith, "new creations in Christ," not just on Christmas and Easter, but also during the times in between where most of life takes place." (Presbyterianmission.org)

As you go about your everyday life, remember you are doing what Jesus did for his friends and family. When we listen carefully to a friend, or provide food, or pray for those experiencing heartache or uncertainty or need comfort, you are doing what Jesus has called his followers to do. This is how we worship God every day.

Paul wrote in Romans 5:1-2 "So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you." (The Message Version.)

Enjoy these regular days, go spread the good news of the gospel everyday with your love, words and actions and let everything be done for the glory of God. Then these "ordinary days" will be anything but ordinary!

Pastor Janet opened the meeting with prayer followed by a worship service that included a Scripture reading from Mark 4:35-41 and a time of reflection from the Scripture. Pastor Janet concluded the worship service with communion and opened and moderated the business meeting.

APPROVAL OF DOCKET: Pastor Janet added the information from the ad hoc Building Use committee to Old Business. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket as amended.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of May 21, 2024, regular Session meeting and the Special Called Congregation meeting of May 26, 2024, as presented.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration Committee: Chair Jim Meyer reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Treasurer Leo Potter provided a written report. For May FPC had a net operating revenue of -\$3551.11. YTD operating revenue is -\$6930.

Vanguard accounts increased by \$12,798.76 in May while the YTD funds increased \$22,165.44.

Chair Jim Meyer contacted Emily to see if face painting of kids by 4H or some other activity on Pumpkin Patch Day October 19 would be possible.

ACTION ITEM: Recommend to Session that the PILP loan be paid off at this time and the excess remain in the PILP account.

The next Administration meeting: August 14 at 4:00 PM.

Building and Grounds: Chair Arlyn "Butch" Plowman reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

A building use agreement has be executed with Thrive Girls.

FPC has agreed to rent Narrate Church our bounce house for \$50.00 to use at their Vacation Bible School.

Butch will contact Clark's Plumbing to address several issues in a single service call—faucets in the kitchen and women's bathroom, an outside hose bib, and under the sink issues in the fellowship room.

Mark will contact Alan Hibs to repair woodpecker damage to the building stucco, and Pane in the Glass for an estimate for window washing.

A railing has been installed east of the piano. A thank you note will be sent to Joe Nielson of Artisan Iron Works for the better-than-expected pulpit handrail designed, fabricated, and installed.

ACTION ITEM: Session approve Les Cramer as a member of B&G committee. Passed.

Christian Education Committee: Did not meet in May.

Congregational Fellowship: Chair Sheryl Eriksen reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

Carnations, a card, and candy were presented to all men at worship in celebration of Father's Day.

The next 5th Sunday Potluck will take place on June 30 following the worship service.

A boat tour of the Gates of the Mountain is planned for July 14 from 1:00 to 3:00 PM. A supper is planned afterwards. Barb Leland has tickets to pre-purchase for the trip.

The annual picnic will be in the Spring Meadow Lake shelter at Spring Meadow Lake August 11 following worship. The main entrée will be furnished. Please bring a side dish.

The next meeting will be on July 10 at 2:00 PM.

Memorial Committee: Did not meet.

Mission Committee: Chair Karen Witte reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Father's Day donations were divided and distributed to God's Love, Good Samaritan and Our Place.

Kid Packs (a Helena Food Share program) will be the recipient of Pumpkin Patch profits obtained from the sale of pumpkins during the Pumpkin Patch Fun Day October 19 between 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM.

The congregation will be encouraged to participate in a special donation on October 20 for Food Share Kid Packs.

ACTION ITEM: Session permission to give profits from the 2024 Pumpkin Patch to Helena Food Share Kid Packs. Passed.

ACTION ITEM: Session permission for a one-time special offering from the congregation October 20, 2024, for Food Share Kid Packs. Passed.

ACTION ITEM: Session approval to offer a matching donation to the Pumpkin Patch proceeds for Food Share Kids Packs using a combination of the congregation's offering and undesignated Mission Committee funds. Tabled.

A Habitat for Humanity-FPC workday is scheduled for July 27. (Note: This has since been changed to Saturday, Aug. 3.) The new vests will be available to wear for that event.

The next meeting is August 12, 2024, at 1:00 PM. There **will not** be a meeting in July.

Nominating Committee: No meeting was held.

Personnel Committee: Chair Jeff Chaffee reported no meeting was held.

Worship Committee: No meeting was held.

Deacon Report: The minutes of the June 9, 2024, meetings were submitted to Session and included the May 31, 2024, activity report.
