- Genesis 3:19
- Job 42:3-6
- Jeremiah 6:26
- Daniel 9:3
- Matthew 11:21

In addition to our Scripture readings, there will be a Lenten devotional available to all to help us on our journey through Lent.

We invite you all to an Ash Wednesday Service March 5, 12:00 noon. This will be a more contemplative service preparing us for Lent. As we come forward, we will receive the imposition of ashes upon the forehead in the sign of the cross. The ashes are from last year's palm branches that have been burned, as is our custom. The words spoken to each person comes to us from the book of Genesis: "You have come from dust, and to dust you shall return."

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 5, 2025. Please plan to attend the service at noon as a way to begin preparing for dying with Jesus on the cross and then to Celebrate the Resurrection on April 20, 2025.



There are 6 weeks between March 5 and April 20. How will you continue in preparation for both participating in Christ's death and in Christ's resurrection?

Traditional Lent practices of prayer, spiritual practices, study and fast/giving are ways which help guide us through this season.

Here are some options to assist you!

- 1. Attend "Lent: Connecting to God" to explore different methods for prayer. We will meet Thursdays starting March 6, at 11 a.m.
- 2. Pick up the Lent devotional "There in God's Garden" which follows along with the scriptures in Luke. (or find another online option)
- 3. Attend worship! Commit to coming to worship for six weeks straight.
- 4. Choose to fast by giving as God instructs in Is. 58:6-7:

"No, this is the kind of fasting I want: Free those who are wrongly imprisoned; lighten the burden of those who work for you. Let the oppressed go free, and remove the chains that bind people. Share your food with the hungry, and give shelter to the homeless. Give clothes to those who need them, and do not hide from relatives who need your help."

As we spend the month of March in Lent, please join me in prayer for God to provide three significant needs of this congregation. Let us continue to pray for the Synergos program and our future pastoral resident, pray for the right group to lease the unused space in the "new building," and pray for God to build up this congregation.

#### MINUTES OF THE SESSION

## First Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) February 18, 2025

The worship service and regular meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena were called to order on Tuesday, February 18, 2025, at 6:33 PM by Pastor Janet Potter, Interim Pastor

Pastor Janet opened the meeting with prayer followed by worship. Pastor Janet asked, "Where have you seen God in your life in the last 24 hours?" After several people responded, two people read Scripture from Luke 6:20 -28. After a reading of the Scripture followed by a time of reflection, Pastor Janet asked: 1) What caught your imagination? 2) How might the Spirit be encouraging us? After discussion by Session members, conclusion of worship, and communion, Pastor Janet opened and moderated the business meeting.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present: Arlyn "Butch" Plowman, Barb Leland, Patti Borsberry, and John Bryan. Elders present on Zoom: Karen Witte, Jim Meyer, and Jeff Chaffee. Clerk of Session John Gneckow and Deacon Ward Stiles were also in attendance. Elder Sheryl Eriksen was excused. Guest: John Warren.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to give John Warren voice.

APPROVAL OF DOCKET: Pastor Janet added discussing immediate ordination and installation of John Warren as he is filling the remainder of Linda Bench's term on Session. A second addition to the docket was the status with leasing of church property. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket as amended.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of January 21, 2025, regular Session meeting.

#### **CLERK'S REPORT:**

The Clerk read thank you letters from Kendall Van Aken and Carver Van Aken, both of whom were given Linton Scholarships to assist them in pursuit of their college degrees.

The Clerk reported having filed the required annual report with the Montana Secretary of State's office.

**INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Janet expressed her thanks to the Session for the much-needed break. She and husband Leo spent time

vacationing and visiting family in Colorado and Oregon.

Moving forward with Lent and Easter, Dianna Goodman will lead the March 5 Ash Wednesday service. Pastor is also planning a Lenten class on prayer—time to be determined.

She is also preparing the materials for training the newly elected Elders and Deacons.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Administration Committee:** Chair Jim Meyer reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Treasurer Leo Potter provided financial reports. Net operating revenue for January 2025 was \$4,792. Giving for the month was \$17,072. Expenses were decreased for January secondary to the interim pastor's leave of absence.

Vanguard accounts increased in value approximately \$6,200.

PILP funds remain after paying off of the loan. Church needs were discussed as was the original intent of the PILP loan.

# ACTION ITEM: Recommend renaming the PILP Loan funds as the Building Reserve Fund. Motion passed.

John Warren reviewed the Synergos program. There is a concern about the amount allowed for the housing expense. The concern is that the formula does not provide an adequate housing expense for the Helena area. This is being researched further and will be discussed at the next meeting.

A letter was received from an insurance company in Billings that specializes in church insurance. Butch will investigate this further.

Noting that the committee is made up of four men, an appeal is being made for some women to join the committee.

The next Administration meeting: March 12 at 4:00 PM.

**Building and Grounds:** Co-Chair Butch Plowman reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

The city has notified FPC that there has been a complaint filed about the sidewalks on Ewing Street and Tenth Avenue. FPC applied for and was accepted for the city sidewalk replacement program in the amount of \$10,000 for 10 years with no interest. The repayments would be included in the yearly property taxes/fees. The city has since revised the estimated costs upwards to around \$50,000. The city has been notified that FPC is

working on fixing the sidewalks.

B&G is having a contractor look at and bid on the sidewalk work before proceeding with determining the payment methodology.

The parking lot needs its periodic patch and seal work. Yellowstone Pavement Solutions will be visiting FPC this spring to offer ideas and costs.

Mark and Vic will consult with the Fire Marshall regarding standards governing the exhaust hood and fire suppression system in the kitchen.

Girls Thrive asked permission to use the parking lot for a ten-year anniversary celebration in August. Permission granted.

Next meeting: March 12 at 10:00 AM.

Friendship Committee: Chair Sheryl Eriksen reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

FPC will have a fifth Sunday potluck March 30 after the church service.

Worship committee will host the coffee and cookies after the Ash Wednesday service March 5<sup>th</sup>.

March meeting: Lunch out meeting at 11:30

Memorial Committee: Did not meet.

**Mission Committee:** Chair Karen Witte reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

The committee has received several suggestions for use of Mission Tithe funds that were approved at the Congregational meeting of February 16.

The Point-In-Time Dinner only served half as many meals this year compared to last year. Overall, the numbers of meals served were down everywhere.

The committee agreed to make 100 new cuddle buddies beginning in February.

The next meeting: March 10, at 1:00PM.

Nominating Committee: No updates this month.

**Personnel Committee**: Chair Jeff Chaffee reported that the committee did not meet.

**Property Oversight Committee:** Chad Adams has reviewed the lease. In the future if a for-profit entity leases space, they will pay their own taxes. If a nonprofit leases space, they will need to pursue their own tax exemption.

**Worship Committee:** Patti Borsberry reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

The Lenten season will begin on March 5<sup>th</sup> Ash Wednesday. Dianna will once again arrange for palm fronds and ashes that will be used at the Ash Wednesday service. She will also be handling the service. The Deacons will set up the Communion.

Dianna will also handle the Maundy Thursday service which will be held at 7:00 pm and will include Communion.

Dianna will be in the pulpit for Good Friday services. The service is at noon.

Les is purchasing new Easter music.

Liturgist training/refresher course is planned for March 23rd. Contact Joy Edgar if you would like to participate.

Worship will take over the Kids' Packets. "Little Kids' Bibles" will be added to the packets and the kids will be able to take them home.

The next Worship committee meeting: March 11 at 10:00 AM.

**Deacon Report:** A written report was submitted to Session.

Moderator BJ Burns opened the meeting with prayer. Deacon Carole Massman shared a devotional from Jesus Calling.

During January, communion was served to six people at Touchmark, two at Son Heaven, and none at home. No one was visited in the hospital. Two meals were supplied to homebound individuals.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the committee reports.

#### **Old Business:**

John Warren was elected as an Elder to replace Linda Bench at the February 16 Congregation Meeting. John has indicated his willingness to start serving now. March 2 has been selected as the ordination and installation date. A motion was made, seconded, and passed.

#### New Business: none

There being no more business to conduct, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting was closed with prayer at 7:38 PM.
