Annual Meeting Sunday, Feb. 12

The annual meeting of the congregation will be held Sunday, Feb. 12, immediately after the worship service.

At the meeting we will vote on proposed bylaw changes. Copies of the bylaws with proposed changes were sent to active members last month. Copies of the changes are also included in the 2022 Annual Report, available Feb. 5 at the church.

There are two areas of change:

- The first area is under Article VII--Committees, Section 4, Nominating Committee on page 8 of the bylaws.
- The second area is under Article VIII--Board of Deacons, Section 1, page 9. We will also elect new Elders and Deacons, receive reports and conduct any other business of the church. This year, the Feb. 12 worship service will be a celebration of the ways the church has served the Lord in 2022. Your congregation has been actively serving as the heart, hands and feet of Jesus.

MINUTES OF THE SESSION FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (PCUSA) HELENA, MONTANA

January 17, 2023

The regular meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena was called to order Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at 6:40 PM by Reverend Janet Potter. Pastor Janet opened the meeting with prayer and moderated the meeting.

Pastor Janet led the meeting attendees in reading Psalm 146 and asked each attendee for one word that stood out to them.

She then read Ephesians 4:17-32 and asked, "Where have you seen God at work recently?" Various examples were given ranging from something personal, something observed or heard, to something involving a church committee they serve on.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present in the church facility: Jim Meyer, Arlyn "Butch" Plowman, John Coefield, Barb Leland, Sheryl Eriksen, Karen Witte, Mary Stiles, Rose Leavitt, and Carol Stebbins. Elder Jeff Chaffee was present on zoom. Also in attendance: Treasurer Leo Potter, Clerk of Session John Gneckow and Deacon Joy Edgar.

APPROVAL OF DOCKET: The docket was amended to include discussion of the air cleaners in the Sanctuary, the Annual meeting, frequency of CLP candidate Dianna Goodman's preaching, and a suggestion that FPC offer a new member class. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket with the additions.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of December 20, 2022, Session meeting as presented.

The Clerk reported that FPC received thank you notes for donations from Good Samaritan Ministries, God's Love, Intermountain, the YWCA, Glacier Camp, and the Salvation Army. FPC also received Christmas cards from the Theological Education Fund and from the Basin Presbyterian Church with a check enclosed as a thank you for our support during 2022.

The Clerk of Session and John Warren, the FPC dB administrator, recently compared the electronic list of active members to the Church Registry hand-written list. The lists agree on the number and names of active members.

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COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration Committee: Elder Jim Meyer reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

Leo reported that the end of year income was \$7608. Also, FPC spent approximately \$26,000 from restricted funds. During the past year, the Vanguard accounts lost more than \$100,000 combined value.

ACTION ITEM: Vanguard Account #1 incurred an approximate loss in value of \$22,000 from end of year 2021 to end of year 2022. Because of the loss, and the Committee's interpretation of the motion establishing the Mission Tithe, the committee voted to recommend no Mission Tithe donation in 2023. The Session approved the Action Item.

The Committee discussed a proposal to primarily provide the monthly Mustard Seed newsletter to interested parties via email to reduce the church's monthly mailing expense. A printed will be available to those who prefer it or do not have an email account and still want a printed copy.

ACTION ITEM: Recommend that Session ask the Deacons to contact each member of their flock to update current information (mailing address, email, and phone number) and preference (printed or email) for their copy of the Mustard Seed. Session will contact the remaining people on the Mustard Seed list to update the information and interest in receiving the Mustard Seed. The motion was tabled.

FPC received an anonymous donation of \$5,000 from an estate. The money was placed in Memorial Funds per the estate directions.

FPC received 36 responses to the stewardship letter.

Building and Grounds: Elder John Coefield reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

The HVAC filters have been changed from MIRV 16 to MIRV 11 in the sanctu-

ary furnaces.

A spring all church clean-up is being considered.

Elder Jim Meyer has completed repair of the vandalism damage to the Memorial Bookstand.

The building alarm system has been activated. Pastor Janet and Julie have been trained in its operation.

Christian Education Committee: Elder Mary Stiles reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

Les Cramer is reviewing curriculum materials for a youth program. He hopes to have a decision by next month.

The committee is advertising the Seeley and Linton Scholarships. They noted that last year there were three applicants. Depending on the number of applicants this year and the amount of money available, they are considering supplementing the total amount using some of the Pumpkin Patch money.

Congregational Fellowship: Elder Sheryl Eriksen reported, and a written report was submitted to Session.

A fifth (5th) Sunday potluck will be held on January 29, 2023.

Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday February 22, 2023. FPC will hold a luncheon at noon to be followed with services at 12:30 PM.

Future activities include possibly showing the series movie "Chosen" and a soup and pie lunch/sale following the February 19th church service.

Memorial Committee: The Committee provided battery-powered hand-held candles for the Christmas eve service.

Mission Committee: Elder Karen Witte reported and a written report was submitted to Session.

At Pastor Janet's suggestion, the committee approved the purchase of gift cards for local charitable agencies to give out to people needing assistance.

There are currently 6 or 7 families being hosted through Family Promise. FPC's next hosting will be February 26 and 27.

The **Mission Outreach Team** is doing well. It approved the YWCA and Friendship Center as recipients of a "Cards & Candy" outreach.

January recipients of financial donations were Glacier Camp (\$600) and Good Samaritan (\$500) for use in rent deposit.

Personnel Committee: Elder Rose Leavitt submitted a written report to Session.

The committee discussed changes to the Personnel Policy Manual to clarify staff time off when a church authorized holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

Pastor Janet reminded the Committee that Office Coordinator Julie Young should have had a performance evaluation at the end of her 4-month probationary period and also noted that Les is due a review soon.

ACTION ITEM: Approve Vic Reiman as a member of the Personnel Committee. Motion passed.

Worship Committee: Pastor Janet reported. A written report was provided to Session.

The Christmas Eve candlelight service was well attended.

The Committee is working on plans for Lent. Pastor Janet will choose the Lent devotionals.

Les is preparing the choir for the music.

Les Cramer is our Lay Liturgist Coordinator. Vic Reiman has joined the Lay Liturgists group.

Merle Korizek will continue to fill in for Ann as pianist the last Sunday of each month.

Deacon Report: Deacon Joy Edgar provided a written report of Board activities to the Session.

Communion was served at Touchmark, the Masonic Home, and The Legacy. Three people were visited at the hospital. Two meals were provided to members during the month.

Deacons made 984 contacts with their Flock members during 2022. This was an increase of 132 contacts compared to 2021.

Covid Task Force: The Task Force is no longer meeting but continues to monitor the situation in the Helena area.

Old Business: The annual Congregational meeting will be held on February 12, 2023

following the morning worship service. Instead of each Committee Chair reading their annual report to the attendees, we will point out the reports are in the meeting packet, allow a moment for questions, and vote to accept the reports. The Committee Chairs will briefly describe "How God is working in or through their Committee" during the worship service preceding the meeting.

New Business: John Coefield suggested that it is time to hold a new members class. During discussion it was suggested that we consider advertising the class in the newspaper and invite anyone in the community who might be interested in joining FPC to attend the class.

John Coefield reported that since the air filter noise is distressing to some wor-

ship attendees, we will move one or two machines to the side and turn off the rest during worship.

Pastor Janet led a discussion regarding Dianna Goodman's role in worship, especially as to doing sermons. She is required to do some preaching as part of the program to be ordained as a Commissioned Lay Pastor (CLP). Session members indicated their support of her pursuit of the studies for CLP and have been pleased with her sermons.

There being no further business, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to adjourn.

Pastor Janet closed the meeting with prayer at 8:10 PM.

Larry Linton Scholarship

Larry Linton provided a scholarship gift of \$10,000 to the church several years ago. This gift was invested and is earning interest. As sufficient interest becomes available, funds are to be awarded to students for attending or planning to attend post-secondary school.

Criteria:

Student must be a member or related to a member of First Presbyterian Church

Minimum grade point average of 2.0

Demonstrated financial need

Demonstrated good character

Application Process:

Submit a letter of interest to FPC with your name, address, email, and phone number. Indicate the current school you attend and the school that you plan to attend (must be accredited.)

Attach a current transcript and estimated expenses for your year of college (tuition, room and board, books and supplies.)

Attach a letter of recommendation from an individual who can address knowledge of your academic ability and character.

Address the following essay questions.

- 1. What are your current academic goals?
- 2. What are your career goals once you have completed your degree?
- 3. What is your involvement with the First Presbyterian Church?
- 4. This scholarship is for students with financial need. Please describe your financial situation and how the scholarship can help you meet your academic goals.

Deadline is March 17, 2023.

Scholarships Available

Applications are now open for the Seeley Family Memorial Scholarship and Larry Linton Scholarship. The scholarships provide assistance to students who are members of FPC or related to a member of FPC, and can be used toward post-secondary education. Seeley Family Memorial Scholarship

Eve and Nelson Seeley, members of the Helena First Presbyterian Church, created an endowment at the Montana Community Foundation in 2015 called the Seeley Family Memorial Scholarship. This endowment will provide annual scholarship awards in perpetuity to benefit members of the church who are attending or planning to attend post-secondary school.

Scholarship Criteria:
