Celebrating 150 Years 1872-2022

Born in the lively days of the Last Chance gold camps, First Presbyterian Church of Helena took its first collective breath Aug. 1, 1869, when visiting mis-

sionary Sheldon Jackson gathered 12 people together to worship the Lord.

However, it would take three years to secure a pastor and for the congregation to become officially chartered in June, 1872.

In the 150 years since, the congregation has persisted through seasons of growth and struggle. The history of this church is rich in stories of resiliency and faithfulness.

Thankfully, it is too long to include all of it in this newsletter! But through the efforts of church historians, we can view a snap-

shot of the unique challenges and joys of establishing a congregation in the Montana Territory of the 1800s...

Between Jackson's 1869 visit and 1872, three pastors were suc-

cessively commissioned for Montana, but none of them reached the field.

(It is interesting to note

that the Rev. George Smith, who arrived in Bannack in June,

1864, had intended

to serve in Gabon, Africa. However, after realizing it was easier for the Board to get missionaries for West Africa than for Montana, Smith agreed to hop

I will be praying for you, as a church, and individually by name. I will cherish the many fond memories I have of times here (well, the time inching through the crawl space stringing cabling is definitely "memorable" but may fall short of the "cherish" category).

Thank you for your support and love - for me and my entire family over these years. But the spring night is growing long, and I must say, "So long, farewell, auf Wiedersehen, adieu." Peace,

Camping season runs June 19-July 30. Camps are offered for children and youth from first grade to seniors in high school.



Hez has recently been inducted to the National Honor Society, recognizing his accomplishments in scholastics, leadership, character and service.




on a stagecoach bound for Montana Territory.)

Jackson returned to the Helena area in May 1872 with three pastors. Together, they organized seven churches in 16 days. James Russell of Louisville, KY, a young missionary just out of Princeton Theological Seminary, was placed in Helena and Deer Lodge.

The congregation of 20 people was chartered June 15, 1872.

Without a home, the congregation met in various locations, including the Odd Fellows Hall and the courthouse. Plans were underway for a church building when Russell left that fall.

The second pastor, the



Rev. William C. Rommel Oct. 1872 – March 1876

Rev. William Rommel, served from 1872-1876. In 1879, he wrote to thenpastor Thomas Moore: *"I recall with much pleasure my happy days in Helena. It was my first charge in the ministry and I never can forget the great kindness and love of the dear people of the First Presbyterian Church* " I recall at least one effect of a sermon on "Blessed are the pure in heart," rather remarkable; for after the sermon in a discussion resulting from it, two gentlemen engaged in a lively and vigorous scrimmage, which I helped to stop and which threatened pistols, but the result was more amusing than serious."


Under Rommel's leadership - and with the help of an enthusiastic Ladies' Aid Society (see "Early workers," p. 9) - the congregation grew and constructed its first house of worship on the northwest corner of 5th and Ewing.

It was dedicated, debt-(Continued on page 9)

First church building Dedicated Aug. 13, 1876

The first building was located in front of the courthouse, on the northwest corner of the intersection of 5th and Ewing. Ten years later, the congregation had outgrown the facility, and began planning for a new building at a new site. By 1891, it was under construction, four blocks away at 535 North Ewing. The previous building was sold and demolished.

Early workers

Mrs. Annie C. Cuthbert (left) and Mrs. Jonas (Edna) E. Pyle (right), of Helena First Presbyterian Church, 1870s. Both were included in a photo titled 'Early Workers in the Presbyterian Church of Montana.'



The first Ladies' Aid Society was formed in 1874, but the women of the church were instrumental in the earlier days of the congregation, as well. Indeed, Jackson's 1869 gathering consisted of 11 women and 1 man. Shortly after the congregation was chartered in 1872, the women planned a Christmas bazaar to raise funds for a church building. Despite the Rev. Rommel putting the kibosh on plans to include dancing and raffling, the bazaar was a success, with the ladies raising \$800 serving fried oysters. free, Aug. 13, 1876. Ten years later, a growing Sunday School compelled the congregation to consider building a new, larger facility. The present site was purchased in 1889, and the cornerstone laid Aug. 5, 1891. The new building was dedicated in 1892, and the current sanctuary was added just after the turn of the century.

MINUTES OF THE SESSION May 17, 2022

The regular meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena was called to order as a hybrid meeting on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, at 6:35 p.m., by Pastor Scott Wipperman. Pastor Scott opened with prayer and moderated the meeting.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present in the church facility: Sheryl Eriksen, Kathy Chambers, Linda Bench, Karen Witte, Carol Stebbins, Vic Reiman, Barb Leland, Rose Leavitt, Mary Stiles, and John Coefield. Attending on Zoom were: Elder Jeff Chaffee, Deacon Candace Coefield, and Clerk of Session John Gneckow. Also in attendance: CP "Butch" Plowman, and Treasurer Leo Potter. Guests included: Retired Pastor Janet Potter from Glacier Presbytery Committee on Ministry, and Elder elect Jim Meyer, Class of 2025. Elder Mary Wright was excused.

APPROVAL OF DOCKET: Pastor Scott added Dianna Goodman's request for Session recommendation and approval for her to pursue Commissioned Lay Pastor training and ordination. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the docket as amended.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of April 19, 2022, as presented.

PASTOR'S ANNOUNCEMENT: Pastor Scott informed Session that for a variety of reasons, he is resigning as Pastor of FPC Helena and his last day as the Pastor will be June 12, 2022. His planned sabbatical is cancelled.

Reverend Janet Potter expressed thanks to Pastor Scott for his ministry here in Helena at First Presbyterian Church.

A congregational meeting will be held June 5, 2022, following the worship service to dissolve the call between Pastor Scott and First Presbyterian Church of Helena. Reverend Risa Paul will moderate. A farewell celebration will be held following the meeting.

CP "Butch" Plowman will still serve as pulpit supply and moderate Session as planned during Scott's sabbatical.

A COM Transition Team member will be appointed to work with Session. Presbytery Executive Beth McCall, Marsha Ripley, elder, and Rev. John Richie will be available to answer questions until then. A COM member will meet with Session to develop the Interim Job Description and walk alongside the congregation during this time.

Pastor Scott, Session, and COM will work together to settle the terms of dissolution of call to include that the pastor will fully break from any ministry-related contact with the congregation for one year from the termination date.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Scott reported that April was a good month financially due to a generous donation of \$35,000. The intention of the gift was to help ensure that FPC makes its faith budget in 2022.

We are still in the Season of Easter until Pentecost on June 5.

After Andrew Christofferson's message to the church on April 24, some members have expressed interest in supporting his efforts in an on-going fashion.

Repair work on the collapsed basement wall has been completed. Cost of the work is approximately \$12,000.

A memorial service for Joyce Berry was held for April 29, with a reception and graveside service following.

CLERK'S REPORT: The Clerk reported that FPC received a thank you note for a recent donation from the Mission committee. The Clerk also reported that a new account has been opened with Vanguard, funded with money received from the Howdy and Myrtle Murfitt Trust.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration Committee: Elder Linda Bench reported, and a written report was submitted.

Leo Potter opened the meeting with prayer. The committee approved using Anderson Trust to purchase the Bible study materials used in the Presbyterian Women Circles. John Warren will replace Mary Wright as a check signer on the church checking account. Leo Potter will be given authority to electronically view the church's bank account. **ACTION ITEM**: Approve Vic Reiman as a member of the Admin Committee. Motion carried.

Building and Grounds: Elder John Coefield reported, and a written report was submitted. John opened the meeting with prayer. The repair work necessitated by the cave-in along the foundation on the north side has been completed. However, we need to reconnect the air conditioner or replace it. The current A/C unit is 20 years old and will cost \$800 to reconnect. A new more energy efficient unit will cost \$6,300. No action taken pending receipt of more information.

As the committee has concerns about the condition of the public sidewalk(s) on

church property, the city sidewalk coordinator and B&G will do a walk-around to determine what work is needed and what assistance is available to pay for the work.

Christian Education Committee: Elder Mary Stiles reported, and a written report was submitted. Pastor Scott opened the meeting with prayer.

The Sermon on the Mount study began May 5. Several individuals have agreed to conduct workshops on assorted topics important to seniors. The workshops will be open to the local community.

ACTION ITEM: Approve Joy Edgar as a member of the Christian Education Committee. Motion carried.

Congregational Fellowship: Elder Linda Bench reported, and a written report was submitted.

A discussion was held regarding the 150th church anniversary celebration scheduled for June 12. "Butch" Plowman was recommended as the point person for coordinating the event. Hand and Foot resumed May 6. Bingo Night is scheduled for May 20 and June 10. Lost Soles hikes are scheduled for May 22 and June 12.

Sheryl Ericksen was elected as the new Committee Chairperson for 2022-2023.

Mission Committee: Elder Kathy Chambers reported. Kathy thanked the congregation for its support of the various missions of the church. Karen Witte asked if it is possible to add an option in the Giving program for people to donate to Andrew Christofferson's mission work. The Clerk of Session will look into it.

The Refugee Food Basket Giving Catalog project is being initiated in May and will run through July. This was done to obtain matching funds from the national mission agency.

Memorial Committee: Session was shown the memorial plaques that the committee purchased for Leah Lona Albright and Court Bourne. They will be installed in the near future.

Nominating Committee: No activity to report this month.

Personnel Committee: Elder Carol Stebbins reported that no meeting was held this month.

Worship Committee: No Committee representative attended the Session meeting, although a written report was submitted. Dianna opened the committee meeting with prayer. Various members of the committee were thanked for their contributions to the FPC worship services.

The choir will be wrapping up for the summer on Pentecost Sunday. Various individuals will be asked to provide special music during the summer.

Deacon Report: Deacon Candace Coefield provided a verbal report of Board activities. Communion was served at Touchmark and the Masonic Home. No meals were provided to any FPC members during the month. No hospital visits were done. Candy will continue as Moderator for 2022-2023, Joy Edgar will serve as Vice-Moderator, and Patti Borsberry will continue as Secretary.

Covid Task Force: The Task Force is no longer meeting but is continuing to monitor the situation in the Helena area.

Old Business: The Session reviewed ideas for the 150th anniversary celebration of the establishment of the church. We need help and ideas from people not on Session to make this celebration meaningful.

New Business: Dianna Goodman has indicated her desire to become a Commissioned Lay Pastor. She has completed her bio and will start "Enquiry" soon. **ACTION ITEM**: Motion to recommend and support her pursuit of this goal. Seconded and passed.

Andrew Christofferson's presentation on the work he is doing in India was well received. Several church members have asked if FPC can provide ongoing assistance to his work. **ACTION ITEM**: Motion to provide \$500 per quarter to Andrew Christofferson's mission work. Seconded and passed.

We need Committee Chairpersons for Administration, Personnel, and Worship for 2022-2023.

There being no further business, it was moved and seconded at 8:30 p.m. to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. Mary Stiles closed the meeting with prayer.


