Sunday June 8 is Pentecost! "On the Day of Pentecost, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit descending in a mighty rush of wind and flame to inspire the church's proclamation of Christ's rising and to empower its mission and ministry to the world." (Presbyterianmission.org). Pentecost is often called the birthday of the church as over 3000 people repented and were baptized in response to Peter's speech. (Acts 2)

The Greek word "ἐκκλησία" is commonly translated as "church." Ekklesia means "In a Christian sense, those who anywhere, in a city or village, constitute such a company and are united into one body" (blueletterbible.org). The church has always been a gathering of people for worship in a religious meeting. But "Church" does not just refer to the building! As the song goes, "The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple....the church is a people!" (We are the Church by Avery & Marsh). Recognizing how First Presbyterian is a congregation of people, on Pentecost we will celebrate the choir and the gifts of service.

Again this year, Pentecost will be the choir's final Sunday before their summer break. It is always a blessing when the choir presents its gift of music and voice to the congregation. Thank you to each member and to our music staff- Les, Ann and Merle!



#### MINUTES OF THE SESSION

May 20, 2025

The regular meeting and worship service of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena were called to order on Tuesday, May 20, 2025, at 6:35 PM by Pastor Janet Potter, Interim Pastor.

Pastor Janet opened worship with prayer followed by Scripture from Matthew 14:22-33 with a time of reflection. Worship concluded with communion.

Attendees included five new members and incoming officers. After a "get to know you" time, new members were excused.

Pastor Janet then opened and moderated a Session meeting, asking for a motion to accept Alysia and John "Mitch" Ryan by letter of transfer, and Max Oliver, Wanda Jewell, Sharon King, and Sylvia Huntsman by affirmation of faith into membership of FPC Helena. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to accept them as members.

After the new members departed from the meeting, Pastor Janet accepted a motion to accept Carol Gneckow as an Elder, Class of 2028, and Ria Caussyn and Art and Rena Bumgardner as Deacons, Class of 2028. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present: Arlyn "Butch" Plowman, Barb Leland, Sheryl Eriksen, John Bryan, Karen Witte, Jim Meyer, Patti Borsberry, Jeff Chaffee, and John Warren. Clerk of Session John Gneckow, Treasurer Leo Potter, and Deacon Ward Stiles were also in attendance.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to give Joy Edgar voice and Elderelect Carol Gneckow voice and vote.

**APPROVAL OF DOCKET:** Pastor Janet asked for any additions to the docket. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket as presented.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of April 22, 2025, regular Session meeting as presented.

#### **INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT:**

Pastor Janet attended Committee meetings: Deacon, Building and Grounds, Admin, Worship, Session, Scholarship, CE, and did visits to the hospital and homes.

Joy Edgar and Pastor Janet will lead a study on "The Gift of Empathy" on Sundays May 25, June 1, June 15, and June 22 following worship. Lunch will be provided.

A New Member class was held on April 27 with 5 interested persons. John and Vicky Bryan joined us. Pastor met with Sharon King on May 8 about membership.

A commissioning blessing and prayer for Dianna Goodman was held on May 4 during worship. Dianna presided over communion that day.

She attended several meetings in April regarding the location of Spanglish.

The potential daycare tenant remains interested in the first floor. However, due to unexpected issues from the county Licensing office, we have not finalized the lease.

The May Session meeting will include incoming Deacons and Elder, and new members. Thank you, Sheryl Eriksen and Karen Witte for their many years of service.

#### Looking ahead:

June 1-ordain and install new officers, welcome new members, and communion.

June 8-Pentecost Sunday will include a time to celebrate the work and service of the congregation.

Pastor Janet will be out-of-office June 11-15. Dianna will preach and lead worship on June 15.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Administration Committee:** Chair Jim Meyer reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Treasurer Leo Potter provided financial reports. He noted that in April, FPC had a good month financially with donations of \$22,299, bringing the YTD net income to \$10,226.

One Great Hour of Sharing had donations of \$1,690.

Vanguard accounts showed a loss of \$4,482 for April. The YTD change in value is \$18,220.73.

The Memorial Committee did not meet.

Adjustments to new transaction detail report was introduced and is thought to make it easier to follow transactions.

#### **B&G** Projects:

Discussed the fund raising for parking lot maintenance and kitchen renovation. Pastor Janet will be talking with some people in the congregation to be on a

committee to spearhead this.

Work needed on the Bell Tower for repairs from the ice jam will be approximately \$10,500.

The city is still pushing for repairs to the sidewalks. We have not received a bid from the potential contractor.

The next Admin meeting will be June 11, 2025, at 4:00 PM.

**Building and Grounds:** Co-Chair Butch Plowman reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

Sean Miller of Concrete Coatings Solutions has completed work on the decorative ramp, steps, and landing.

The new kitchen stoves have been installed. However, the fire suppression system has not been installed as the contractor is waiting for a permit from the city building department.

The van has been donated to the Flathead Bible camp (ELCA).

Committee members met with Darron Ramos, a Helena Sidewalk Technician, and Tyler Gauthun to inventory necessary repairs to bring the sidewalks up to code. We are waiting for an estimate from TAG Construction for the repairs. The City wants a plan for the sidewalk repairs by May 29.

Yellowstone Pavement Solutions will be sealing and striping the parking lot beginning June 11.

Approved a building use permit for Emma Watne to hold a 50-person anniversary celebration in Richardson Hall in June.

Approved John Keck's request to rent a parking space.

Next B&G meeting: June 11 at 10:00 AM.

**Christian Education Committee:** Co-chair Joy Edgar reported. A written report was submitted to Session.

This was the committee's first meeting to hopefully get the committee back on track and to work on the various things we are called to do according to the Book of Order. FPC currently has two Bible studies going—one led by John Coefield and the other by John Bryan. Pastor Janet and Joy Edgar plan to lead a pilot study on the "the Gift of Empathy" beginning May 25.

Joy would like to see a Youth Group revised. Vicky Bryan indicated an interest in leading one.

Pastor Janet noted that the committee still has a budget.

Next meeting: Monday July 14 at 12:00 PM.

**Friendship Committee:** Chair Sheryl Eriksen reported and a written report was submitted to Session.

Special treats were offered for the Easter Sunday service and were well received.

The Friendship Committee helped the Worship Committee with celebration of Dianna's commissioning as a CLP.

On Mother's Day May 11 the committee provided fresh flowers to the women and special friends who could not attend the service.

An outing is planned Saturday, July 19, to go to the First Peoples Buffalo Jump in Ulm. Dinner will be at the Tap House in Craig.

The FPC summer picnic will be held August 24 after worship at Kennedy Park in East Helena. Friendship will provide fried chicken. The congregation is asked to bring a dish to share. While there are tables in the shelter, participants are encouraged to bring their own chair due to limited seating.

June 8 is Pentecost and Service Recognition Sunday. Special treats will be provided for the social hour.

June 15 is Father's day. Special treats will also be available to honor our fathers and special men in our lives.

The fifth Sunday potluck will be held in Richardson Hall on June 29 following the worship service.

Next Meeting: June 1 at 1:00 PM.

Memorial Committee: The committee did not meet.

**Mission Committee:** Chair Karen Witte reported that the Committee did not meet.

Nominating Committee: No updates this month.

**Personnel Committee**: Chair Jeff Chaffee reported that the committee did not meet.

Property Oversight Committee: Elder John Warren reported.

The Committee is still looking at ways to get the Day Care Center into the church.

County daycare sanitation codes require appropriate handwashing and bottle washing stations in rooms used by children in diapers. If no children require diapers, is there still a need for the sinks in the rooms? Would the owners of the day care be willing to not take children with diapers?

The plumber indicated that the vent stack would be the costly part of the sewer hook up as it would have to go through the ceilings and roof. Some ideas were offered, one of which appears feasible although still incurring some expense. This would entail locating and connecting to a vent stack from the existing bathrooms.

Because the lease papers specify that the lessor is to pay the bill for modifications, a question was posed whether or not the church could pay for all or part of the costs. Doing so would also make the church more enticing to future potential lessors should the space become available in the future.

Also, Spanglish will not be able to continue using the second floor when they reconvene in Fall. The area currently has neither sprinklers nor DIRECT outdoor access in the event of an emergency.

Meanwhile, we will look for tenant(s) in the event the facility is unable to com-

ply with the city licensing requirements for day care. A suggestion was made that we might accept one tenant per available room rather than one tenant who needs all of the rooms.

**Synergos Committee:** John Warren reported that there is one candidate available for a call. FPC will interview the individual Thursday, May 22, on zoom. The Synergos board is looking at ways to expand the pool of applicants. Pastor Jessica Crane-Munoz will visit FPC on June 29 to explain the program.

**Worship Committee:** A written report was not submitted to Session. Co-Chair Patti Borsberry reported.

June 8th (Pentecost Sunday) will be the last Sunday that the choir will sing before its summer break. FPC will focus on all the various ministries of the church and those who serve.

The Committee is considering providing an outdoor service in August or September.

Deacon Report: A written report was submitted to Session.

During April, communion was served to no people at Touchmark, none at Son Heaven, and none at home. Two people were visited in the hospital. Four meals were supplied to homebound individuals.

A memorial service for Marsha Davis will take place on June 18 at 11:00 a.m. There will be lunch afterwards. Church members are asked to bring a side dish.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the committee reports.

**Old Business**: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve John Gneckow as Clerk of Session, John Coefield as FPC Helena Commissioner to Glacier Presbytery, and Leo Potter as Treasurer for 2025/2026 church year.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to revive the Christian Education Committee. Members will include Dianna Goodman, Joy Edgar, Vicky Bryan, John Coefield, and Deb Whitcomb. John Bryan will be Chairperson.

**New Business**: Committee chairs were appointed and approved for 2025/2026: Jim Meyer-Administration; Arlyn "Butch" Plowman-Building & Grounds; Barb Leland-Friendship; Carol Gneckow-Mission; Jeff Chaffee-Personnel; Patti Borsberry-Worship; John Warren-Nominating; and John Bryan-Christian Education.

There being no more business to conduct, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was closed with prayer at 8:50 PM.

The next Regular Session Meeting: June 17 at 6:30 PM.
