MINUTES OF THE SESSION FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (PCUSA) HELENA, MONTANA October 18, 2022

The regular meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Helena was called to order on Tuesday, October 18, 2022, at 6:30 PM by Reverend Janet Potter. Pastor Janet opened with prayer. Pastor Janet guided us through Ezekiel 37:1-14 using "Dwelling on the Word" followed by prayer. Pastor Janet moderated the meeting.

There was a quorum with the following Elders present in the church facility: Elders Sheryl Eriksen, Karen Witte, Rose Leavitt, Carol Stebbins, John Coefield, Barb Leland, Mary Stiles, and Jeff Chaffee. Also in attendance: Treasurer Leo Potter (on zoom), Deacon Joy Edgar, and Clerk of Session John Gneckow. Elders Vic Reiman, Mary Wright, Jim Meyer, and "Butch" Plowman were excused.

APPROVAL OF DOCKET: The docket was amended to include addressing the resignations of Elders Vic Reiman and Mary Wright from Session and Deacon Marie Fuhrman from the Board of Deacons. Elder Karen Witte requested Session discuss evangelism. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the docket with the additions.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes of September 20, 2022, Session meeting as presented.

CLERK'S REPORT: The Clerk reported that FPC received thank you notes from Intermountain Children's Home and two from Food Share.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration Committee: John Gneckow reported for the Committee Chairman and a written report was submitted.

Jim Meyer opened the meeting with prayer.

Treasurer Leo Potter reported that preliminary report shows a small operating income for September, but a full financial accounting was not available as of the meeting.

The value of the Vanguard accounts dropped markedly in accordance with the stock market.

The church has been given an extension until December 15 to respond to the lawsuit filed by Farmers/Truck. We are still investigating obtaining an attorney to represent us in this action.

The plan for the stewardship campaign, is similar to the recent years when we will ask people to send in their pledge sealed in an envelope. However, we will not mail the pledge back as we have done in the past. We need to contact Pastor Janet to schedule a stewardship Sunday.

Approved \$600 from Anderson Trust funds to purchase Advent books for the congregation.

Review of Northwestern Energy bills show that the solar panels offset 50-60% of our current use compared to 2019.

Marsha Davis closed the meeting with prayer.

Building and Grounds: Elder John Coefield reported and a written report was submitted. John opened the meeting with prayer.

Brotherhood Mutual has finished the review of the flooding from the roof on July 3 and sent a report and a check for \$10,000. Now we can pursue getting the flooring and edging repaired.

The sprinklers have been blown out.

Training is being scheduled for John C, Julie, and Pastor Janet on the building alarm.

Because of cleaning cost increases, we are still considering the possibility of hiring a custodian.

Mark closed the meeting with prayer.

Christian Education Committee: Elder Mary Stiles reported and a written report was submitted.

The FPC workshop Future Vision was a success with 12 attendees and 5 presenters. The attendees included people from the community in addition to church members.

Congregational Fellowship: Elder Sheryl Eriksen reported and a written report was submitted.

Kathy opened the meeting with prayer.

The church will have a potluck on October 30 following the Sunday service. The congregation is being asked to bring a main dish, dessert, or salad.

The next church group walk is scheduled for November 13 (if the weather is still nice) at the Folf Course on Saddle Drive.

The next date for bingo and pizza is November 18th at 6:00 pm in the Fellowship

area.

Kathy closed the meeting with a Thank You Prayer.

Memorial Committee: Does not meet on a regular schedule. Meetings are held when business dictates.

Mission Committee: Elder Karen Witte reported and a written report was submitted. Karen opened the meeting with prayer.

We will be promoting Food Share in November. Town Pump will match our contribution

ACTION ITEM: To hold a Warm Hearts Drive in January. Donations of blankets, towels, etc. will be solicited for Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Associates of Helena, who will distribute them in Helena to needy people. Motion passed.

Deacon Joy Edgar closed the meeting with prayer.

Nominating Committee: The committee has started reviewing church records for candidates for Session and Board of Deacons.

Personnel Committee: The committee did not meet.

Worship Committee: Pastor Janet reported. She has met with the committee to review Advent plans. These will be finalized once she is back in Helena.

Deacon Report: Deacon Joy Edgar provided a written report of Board activities.

Communion was served at Touchmark and the Masonic Home. No meals were provided to FPC members during the month. One hospital visit was done.

Deacons made 220 contacts with their flock members.

Covid Task Force: The Task Force is no longer meeting but continues to monitor the situation in the Helena area.

Old Business: There was an error in the contract. Christmas day is Sunday not December 26.

Motion made, seconded, and passed to correct the December error.

John Coefield noted that the money from Brotherhood Mutual was received and a contractor hired to work on the carpeting and molding. John Coefield, John Gneckow, and the Treasurer are to meet in the next week or so to look for some funds to pay for some additional work in the church.

New Business: Session reviewed the resignation request of Marie Fuhrman from the Board of Deacons. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept her resignation with regrets and thanks.


