



140	General Crook Trail	5.6 Portion shown on Bear Canyon Lake trails map (Total trail length on Black Mesa = 58.4 miles)		More Difficult	The General Crook Trail is Arizona's first designated State Historic Trail, a 113 mile trail built by Gen. George Crook in the 1870's, during the Apache War. Crooks trail crosses the Black Mesa Ranger District through mixed ponderosa pine & Gambel oak. On this map, this portion of the trail begins at the district boundary on the west side and continues eastward to the See Canyon Trailhead.	<p>General Crook Trail Profile</p> <p>Profile depicted on graph is just the portion of General Crook Trail shown on the Bear Canyon Lake Area Trails map.</p>
292	Horton Springs Trail	0.3		More Difficult	This trail begins along the General Crook Trail (140) at the Horton Trailhead. Trail proceeds south and connects with the Horton Springs Trail on the Tonto National Forest.	<p>Horton Springs Trail Profile</p>
506	Bear Canyon Lake Trail	1.6		More Difficult	This trail begins at the northern end of Bear Canyon Lake and follows the lake shore line and connects to the Two O Eight Trail (112). Provides access to fishing along the lake shore.	<p>Bear Canyon Lake Trail Profile</p>
538	Mallard Trail	0.1		More Difficult	This trail begins at the Mallard Trailhead located in the parking loop and provides access down to Bear Canyon Lake. The trail ends at Bear Canyon Lake trail (506).	<p>Mallard Trail Profile</p>
539	Merganser Trail	0.2		More Difficult	This trail begins at the Merganser Trailhead located at th parking loop at end of FR 89A. This trail provides access to Bear Canyon Lake shore and provides access to the Mallard Trail (538).	<p>Merganser Trail Profile</p>
