Prof. Randall S. Abate is the Assistant Dean for Environmental Law Studies at George Washington University Law School. He has 28 years of experience in teaching, writing, managing programs, and mentoring students on domestic and international environmental law issues in various contexts.

Prior to coming to GW Law, Prof Abate served as the inaugural Rechnitz Family and Urban Coast Institute Endowed Chair in Marine and Environmental Law and Policy and a Professor in the Department of Political Science and Sociology at Monmouth University, New Jersey. He also served as the Director of the Institute for Global Understanding at Monmouth. Prior to Monmouth, Professor Abate was a full-time faculty member at six U.S. law schools. Throughout his academic career, Prof Abate has taught courses in domestic and international environmental law, climate change law and justice, ocean and coastal law, constitutional law, torts, and animal law.
