Teaching and Learning

Students attend VGV every day in classrooms for face-to-face teaching and learning with Rhode Island certified teachers in the core subjects of ELA, math, science, and history. Classes are 60 minutes long except on Wednesdays where they are reduced to 40 minutes to allow for schoolwide clubs to occur before the end of the school day. The VGV teacher's role is part skill gap interventionist and part data analyst as they support students progressing through their rigorous college prep program of study.

VGV uses *IL Classroom's* (formerly LearnZillion) state approved high quality *Illustrative Math*, *Odell ELA* curriculums, and the *Edgenuity* e-courseware platform for science, history, and electives (VGV was chartered in 2013 to specifically develop and use the Edgenuity e-courseware for a high school 4-year program of study). In addition, all VGV teachers use *Google Classroom* for their own created assignments aligned with the aforementioned curriculum platforms to supplement materials to enhance student engagement and achievement. Special attention is given to providing supports to our special population students including MLL students and students with IEPs and/or 504 plans.

Teaching and learning in VGV involves a combination of teacher-led and student paced learning (SPL), the VGV teacher's role is part skill gap interventionist and part data analyst as they support students progressing through rigorous coursework. Students attend Chromebook-outfitted classrooms specifically designed hold a maximum of 16 students. Two large learning spaces referred to as *Learning Centers* each are designed with 32 partitioned workstations to simulate an adult office working environment.
