HOW CHAPLAINS SUPPORT EVERYONE IN THE ORGANIZATION – A MINISTRY OF PRESENCE CHAPLAIN ANDY FOREMAN

CHAPLAINCY IS A MINISTRY OF PRESENCE

The major premise of chaplaincy is presence. "The ministry of presence" is immediate, humble, and intentional. Chaplains step out of their comfort zone and intentionally meet people where they are whether at work, school, in crisis, danger, pain, loss, or grief. Chaplains come along side those in need and overall concern for the emotional and spiritual support, regardless of religious affiliation or absence of belief. Chaplains are present for all! As emotional and spiritual caretakers, Chaplains are often pictured as providing a calm presence, nonjudgmental listening, and caring attitude.

WHAT IS A CHAPLAIN

- A Chaplain is a spiritual leader and counselor that supports the organization and all those to whom the agency provides a service.
- While the Chaplain is affiliated with a faith, he/she is **directed by the organization** not his/her local church leadership, while serving as a Chaplain.
- Are legally ordained and licensed as clergy, thus providing confidencality needed by those seeking guidance.
- Chaplains serve at the **invitation of the organization** and therefore are under the direct supervision of the organization's supervisory structure.
- The Chaplain's commissioning body retains ecclesiastical oversight of the Chaplain's work and life as a representative of the their faith. This ensures the Chaplain is held to the highest standards.
- Most chaplaincies must be reviewed and renewed annually.

WHO CHAPLAINS SERVE

- Persons who seek the Chaplain's services.
- Provides for religious accommodations regardless of faith.
- Those who have **no religious preference** or may be hostile to religion.
- The focus is not simply on those who respond to the chaplain's presence, but to all persons within the chaplain's sphere of influence (the organization).
- The Chaplain's Ministry supports:
 - All persons of the organization.
 - All persons that organization seeks to serve.
 - The <u>free exercise of religion</u> within the organization being served.

WHAT CHAPLAINS DO

- Provides emotional and spiritual support.
- Provides uplifting support in time of need.
- Practices the "Ministry of Presence".
- Listens!!
- Provides hope.
- Provide proactive programs to increase the emotional and spiritual strength of those he/she serves.
- Meets immediate physical needs (part of the crisis team).
- Provides encouragement.
- Practicing God's presence in suffering and service.
- Pray with those desiring prayer.
- Provides comfort in grief.
- Accommodates the free expression of religion.
- May provide funeral services and/or marriage ceremonies.

CHAPLAIN VERSES PASTOR

CHAPLAIN

- Serves people they have never met or do not know very well. Except while serving an organization.
- Serves a wide variety of cultures and ethnic groups.
- Ministers to many different religious traditions.
- Serves people who do not know "what" a chaplain provides.
- Are given authority by an organization.
- Receives specialty training in areas of focus.
- Serves victims who do not call them or choose them.
- Serves people who are in crisis.

PASTOR

- Ministers to one group of people on a long-term basis.
- Know the people fairly well or very well.
- Ministers in "ordinary" times.
- Ministers to a group of people who have similar religious beliefs.
- Ministers to a group of people who have chosen to be a part of this group.
- Ministers in the context of common cultural identities.
- Are given authority by a congregation or ecclesiastical body.

HOW A CHAPLAIN SUPPORTS ORGANIZATIONS

- Emotional support/comfort for employees.
- Spiritual support for employees.
- Emotional support/comfort for those who are served by the organization.
- Spiritual support for those who are served by the organization.
- Spiritual/inspirational messages at organizational meetings.
- Provide prayer, as requested.
- Provide worship/marriage services, as requested.
- Provide accommodations for those desiring any type of worship service.
- Provide training for emotional support e.g. suicide prevention and awareness.
- Provide a confidential listening ear and guidance.
- Provide memorial services, when required,.
- Coordinate local religious leadership support.
- Provide programs to strengthen the emotional and spiritual wellbeing of those they serve.

- Provides for legal status as clergy.

- Training (Conferences, Conventions, Orientations).
