Then it is hard to get a good job if you have lost your driving privileges because of addiction. Without a license, and a car a new location doesn't help much. Then, if a person is on probation, it's expensive to transfer to another county or state AND there are supervision fees. God only knows the struggles of having to wear a GPS monitor and live in that little circle you are allowed to travel in. Then, add in the burden of paying child support or alimony and it gets worse.

For an addict to break free from the chains that keep him in bondage he needs a hand up much more than a handout. This is the power of salvation and transformation available through this ministry. We love to say that this is where **HOPE HAS AN ADDRESS**.

The new partnership with Sandhills Adult & Teen Challenge is breaking some of these barriers the men will face upon graduation. The ability to leave with a skill in HVAC or welding is critical to their continued success.

Employers now see them in a different way than before. They can earn a decent paycheck which will allow them to pay off old debts and get driving privileges again. Eventually, they get married, have children, drive nice cars and buy a home.

This process takes time, but the benefits are wonderful. Just ask Billy who graduated and worked here for four years. He got his drivers license straightened out, went to college and got a great job in HVAC services. A beautiful lady came into his life and now they are married. The process works when God is put into the equation.
