While returning from an emotional 11-hour road trip to Alabama to visit with my dying mother, I got a phone call that a student was walking away. The news was NOT what I needed to hear while traveling. My thoughts wrapped around ONE QUESTION, “Who hurts the worst when someone walks away?”

The first person that comes to mind is the mother who gave birth to someone who simply chooses to NOT do the right thing. I’ve seen mothers cry in despair. Maternal love coupled with rejection, cuts to the core of a parent. It hurts to hear one say, “YOU’RE ON YOUR OWN SON, BECAUSE I’VE DONE ALL I KNOW TO DO”.

Another person who gets hurt is a loving Pastor who has laid their life on the line for their sheep, and one of those has gone astray. Jesus identified with this in John 6:67 when the crowds were scattering because of the persecution and He asked His disciples, “Are you going to leave too?” When the going gets tough, some people bail out on a good thing.

My staff, who gives tirelessly and serves those who are struggling with unholy affections, get hurt. Sometimes they ask if there is a reason we put up with all the rejection. The good result in this is they remember “but for the Grace of God”, they were in the same situation just a year or two prior to this today. Somehow, they buck up under the load and move on to the next challenge.

I can’t leave this without saying, I get hurt when the enemy wins one. He throws it up in my face that I failed this one. He tries to say, “we have to give in to the culture”. He says, “We need to change what we are doing to suit the addicts wishes”. The accusations run hard and cut deep; but, I know there is a better day coming. The Bible says, “Be not weary in well doing, for in due season you will reap if you don’t give up too soon”.

Finally, the one that walks away gets hurt the worst according to the scriptures. Jesus taught that if a house (addict) is swept clean and a guard is not put in place (Jesus), the demons will return and see the house empty and gather up 7 more demons and return; so, the end is worse than the first. One of the lessons in the 38 year old lame man at the Pool of Bethesda was in Jesus words, “leave your life of sin”.

Yet, another student will show up that will accept the gift of eternal life and a new life in Christ. This is the hope we live for and the hope we share.
