Introducing your kitten to a new environment is a very important step! As kittens arrive in their new home, they'll want to adjust to the size of the area they will be inhabiting. Consider a smaller space first and let your kitten adjust to a larger space later on.

It's important to have a calm environment with a safe space where your kitten can adjust to the new surroundings. Place the litter box in an easy to access vicinity.

Ensure food and water are available. Stainless steel water fountains are best for keeping flowing water clean. and readily available, Kittens are active and enjoy toys that stimulate their mind and get them moving around! Situate their toys in an area they are comfortable with.

Every kitten is an indoor kitten. There are many options for establishing an indoor environment that is well suited to your kittens. Including cat climbers, scratchers, cat trees, and cat furniture such as vertical climbers, which allow adequate climbing area. Cat Patios are splendid for including fresh air, exercise, and a lounging area for the kittens.

<u>Litter Box</u>

Place the litter box in a convenient, easy to access location.

Keep fresh food and water in alternate space. Refer to the kitten care recommendations on litter to suit your preferences.

<u>Introducing Other Pets</u>

First introduce the new kittens to a safe space that they can adjust to.

In addition, include any necessities such as litter box, pet toys, pet beds,

scratching posts, and food and water. Once the kittens become adjusted and have a space that is familiar, they'll be ready for additional introductions. Begin with a relaxed setting and gradually introduce your other pets.

Food and Water

Kittens require a high protein and nutrient rich diet. High quality dry and wet food is available on an every day and evening schedule. Fresh water is available constantly. I recommend stainless steel water fountains. They are easier to keep clean and maintain.

Cats enjoy having moving water and drink more water regularly with the fountain.

Grooming

Regular brushings with the recommended brushes. A water bath could be introduced with still water in a pitcher or pale. Gradually, add shampoo and rinse. You may rather have your kitten do a waterless shampoo bath.

A waterless shampoo is applied onto the hair and brushed onto the kitten.

Indoor Cats

There are extraordinary benefits for cats that live indoors. Indoor cats avoid common injuries and avoid contracting ailments. On average indoor cats live 15 years longer than outdoor cats. Indoor cats more easily avoid suffering illness and being lost or stolen.

Indoor cats thrive with indoor spaces that include vertical climbing structures and cat scratching posts that are readily available. Many cat wall climbing furniture has versatility that allows for additional climbing spaces. A safe and secure enclosed catio is a healthy option to include for your kitten's enjoyment. The health benefits for your kittens include fresh air, exercise, and a familiar lounging space. You can train your cat to walk on a harness or a leash.

Health Care

Kittens receive deworming and flea treatments as required. Vaccinations of the kitten's updated schedule is provided at pick-up. The cattery has screened for and is clear of any feline diseases. New vet checks are required.

Reducing Allergens

Bathing kittens with a wet shampoo or a waterless shampoo is recommended. Brush the waterless shampoo into the kitten's coat. Keep the litter box in an area like a garage and separate from where the food and water are. Keep the litter box clean and sanitized. Air filters can provide filtration for the room. Regular baths with regular shampoo or waterless shampoo can reduce allergens.
