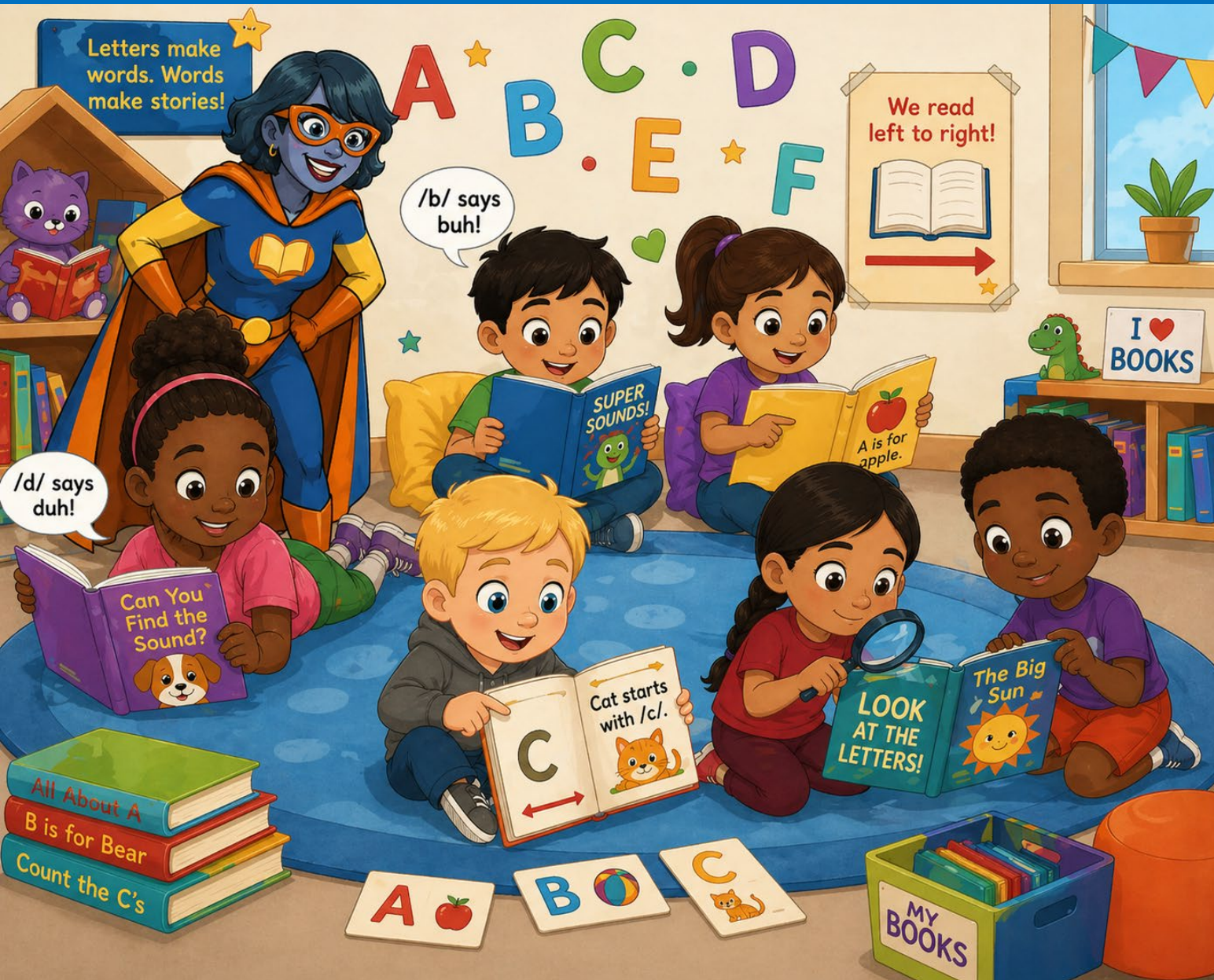

# READING SKILLS BY AGE



## Ages 3 & 4

- Have a vocabulary of 200-500 words
- Can recognize letter sounds
- Show a preference for reading
- Begin to understand the principles of print
  - Left-to-right reading direction

# READING SKILLS BY AGE

## Ages 5 & 6

- Able to read simple sentences
- Have a larger vocabulary.
- Read with increasing automaticity
  - Allows them to focus more on comprehension



# READING SKILLS BY AGE

## Ages 7 & 8

- Able to read complex sentences
- Have a larger vocabulary
- Able to read with increasing automaticity
  - allows them to focus more on comprehension



# READING SKILLS BY AGE

## In Summary

- These benchmarks are based on research and can vary by child
- As each child develops at their own pace
- These milestones are not rigid and can be adjusted based on individual progress and needs.
- Parents and educators can use these benchmarks to support children's reading development and ensure they are on the right track for reading success.
