



Principal's Message





In 1966 she enrolled at L.T.I. to prepare herself for college. She suddenly became ill on May 13, 1967 and died May 20, 1967.








MRS. SIGRUN SUNDAR Wife of Rev. Paul Sundar, Mother of 4 children and the Business Manager of the Mission Station.
