Following lunch, I sat in on Andy's session, Staff/Pastor-Parish Relations Committee Training. I have copies of his power-point presentation, if anyone would like a copy please let me know.

He offered the definition of the committee as the administrative unit in the local church where staff and congregational interests are integrated to focus on the mission of the church. He went over ¶258.2 in the *Book of Discipline*, Committee Basics, and where noted a youth may be on the committee, he highly recommended this NOT take place. Please read ¶258.2 for more information.

Andy wanted to make sure everyone was aware the Pastor does not need a job description as theirs is in the *Book of Discipline*, ¶340. They are responsible for Word, Sacrament, Order, and Service.

S/PPRC Functions—what really matters: 1) ¶258.g1 "To encourage, strengthen, nurture, support, and respect the pastors and staff and their families;" Listening to pastor, to staff, to congregation; Fruitful ministry: Making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world; Advocating for the pastor, for the staff.

On Saturday, March 2, laity from all churches in the West District are invited to participate in the Basic or Advanced Courses for Lay Servant Ministry.

The Basic Course is the foundational course to acquaint laity with their spiritual gifts, John Wesley doctrine, organization, and ministries of the church. This course focuses on the many ways Lay Servants are called to be in ministry through Caring, Leading, and Communicating.

The Advanced Course focuses on the ministry of the Lay Servant who either regularly or occasionally leads a group, class, organization, or the congregation in worship. A Certified Lay Servant is laity who completed the Basic Course and the Advanced Course. Certified Lay Servants are to serve within and beyond the local church. To continue to be a Certified Lay Servant, you must complete an Advanced Course every three years.

Therefore, Lay Ministry Training – Basic and Advanced – are being offered Saturday, March 2 at FUMC Eldorado, 15 N. Divide, Eldorado, Texas, with registration beginning at 8:30 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall.

Sessions are open to anyone interested in learning about Lay Ministry. To be a Certified Lay Servant you must complete the Basic Course and the Advanced Course. To continue your certification, you must complete an advanced course every 3 years.
