A Word from Ken:





Camp Awesomeness Rocks! 2020

For the past several years, the Hill Country and West Districts have sponsored a tween camp known as Camp Awesomeness. Early each year, the Camp Awesomeness Team of Bethany Graham, Celia Halfacre, Leigh Lloyd and Glenn Luhrs meet to pray, discuss, plan and pull together Camp Awesomeness.

The year 2020 calls from all of us flexibility and creativity. In early May, the Camp Awesomeness Team came to realization that holding an inperson camp was not practical or safe for our campers and staff. Suddenly, all of our previous plans and experience meant nothing. We were entering new territory. We asked ourselves, "Can we really do a virtual camp? What does that look like?" Ultimately, our goal was to find ways to include what we considered to be the most vital aspects of camp: fellowship, fun, food, Bible study, small groups, crafts, recreation and Christ Candle.

From May to until **literally** the very last minute in July, the camp staff planned and created content to put together a camp experience. The camp theme for 2020 was ROCKs, Radical Opportunities for Compassion and Kindness, which allowed us to create content that would work online

and offline. We had online large group and small group time, twice a day, with numerous activities that the campers could complete at anytime with their families. We uploaded videos of the staff doing all of the activities, so everyone got the most out of their camp experience.

Each camper received a "Camp Awesomeness Rocks Box" filled with all the things they needed for camp: a t-shirt, craft supplies, snack supplies, a song sheet, science experiment supplies, and a camp handbook with all the instructions for all the activities.

During our live time, we had fun, laughed, told jokes, watched silly videos, sang silly songs and worshipful songs, prayed and shared our lives together in community. We praised God and learned to look for the radical opportunities to show God's compassion and kindness to those around us.

We asked for and received pictures of our campers completing their various camp crafts and activities and shared them with all of the campers.

On the last day, just like always, we were sad to see Camp Awesomeness Rocks 2020 end. Yes, camp was different in 2020! And YES – it was another powerful experience for campers and staff alike.

Next year, we hope to return to Slumber Falls, outside of New Braunfels for Camp Awesomeness 2021.
