Wear a Mask; Show You Care

Hello, friends. I pray you are faring well (and have sufficiently thawed out!). Robyn and I are well. Like most of you, we experienced a few days mostly without electricity during a deep freeze, and without water. It was a minor inconvenience, but we recovered pretty quickly and we fared better than many of our neighbors. Fun fact: it snowed four times in Kerrville between New Year's Eve and February 18.

Our family has also been blessed that no one in our immediate families has tested positive for Covid-19, and most of the vulnerable adults in our circle have been vaccinated. (I will receive my second dose next week – Yay!) We attribute our good fortune to the safety protocols we observe. We avoid public gatherings, restaurants, stores, etc., as much as we can. We practice social distancing when we are around others, and practice rigorous hand hygiene. And I never go out in public without a mask – or two – covering my mouth and nose. Also, the Conference office has picked up some of the statement's language to make the following announcement about continued precautions at the Conference Center:

On March 2^{nd} , Governor Abbott announced lifting the state-wide mask mandate and public capacity limits effective March 10^{th} . At the same time, the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has warned that relaxing protective measures now could subject the country to a "fourth surge."

While the number of cases has dropped after the holidays, and COVID testing has become much more accessible, many in our community are still waiting on vaccines, and broad community protection from the virus is still weeks or months away.

Therefore, based on the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control, the Rio Texas Conference Office will continue to maintain current safety protocols, including requiring all staff and visitors to wear masks in the building. Please be assured, the Conference remains steadfast in our safety protocols in mitigating the spread of COVID-19 especially as variants of the virus emerge.

We appreciate your continued efforts to keep safe by wearing masks, maintaining social distancing, temperature checks, and washing hands frequently.

I share this as a template you may want to modify for use at your church, if your church leadership determines to observe such protocols, which I strongly recommend you do.

I wear a mask because I care about the health and well-being of folks around me, and for my own protection. It is simple and proven.
