Last month we were able t help 122 families which touched 277 individuals with food and other items. We were also able to help 168 individuals with clothing items for their family. Thank you for all of the prayers, donations and support that you give to the ARC. Thanks for collecting items for the Souper Bowl! We received 3063 canned items and \$2,668 to help stock our shelves. We still have two churches to bring their items in so that is not our total amount collected. Thank you so much.

Some items in need are: Jiffy Corn Mix, Saltine Crackers, 16 oz. peanut butter, Can Sauerkraut, Poptarts, small boxed Cereal. Another need is a couple of men to be put on the list to help pick up food from Food Lion and maybe one or two to be certified to pick up from Second Harvest Food Banks drop off area. Without the volunteers helping to pick up the food, we would not be able to feed those that come in needing assistance.

I am in the process of training Twila Miller, the new ARC Director. She will be working in the mornings until the end of May, then she will be going full time. I know that with your help she will be able to keep the ARC moving forward for the Kingdom of God!!!!! It has been a Blessing to have worked with the churches and I will miss you and the "Neighbors" who come into the ARC. I hope to volunteer at the ARC some and maybe I will see you there. God Bless you!!!!!

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity [disbelief], it was the season of light, it was the season of darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us, we were all going direct to heaven, we were all going direct the other way". Charles Dickens, "A Tale of Two Cities". Life is like a quilt---with threads of happiness as well as sorrow; success and failure; love and heartbreak. Without the worst of times, the best of times would have little meaning. Difficulties and hardships make us appreciate the seasons of joy and contentment even more. They offer us opportunities for growth, pushing us out of our comfort zones and helping us develop greater inner strength. The best of times and the worst of times are not always isolated events; they often occur simultaneously and are intertwined like a rope.

As the Faith-Health Connector for Ashe County, I see these paradoxes and complexities nearly every week. I observe those struggling with physical infirmities, financial hardships, and relational strains; that are at the same time receiving supernatural spiritual and emotional strength from the Lord. These same people regularly tell me of a new and deeper understanding of God and His Word through their struggles. Difficulties and trials are often married together with an increase in inner strength and knowledge of the Lord, His ways, and His Word. The Book of James gives us this instruction, "My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have *its* perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing." The Book of 1 Peter gives us similar instructions. "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith, *being* much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ."





What is true religion?

Perhaps the first scripture that comes into your mind is James 1:27. "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction and to keep himself unspotted from the world"(KJB). I particularly like the King James Version because it is keyed to the Strong's Concordance. To really understand the meaning of biblical scripture one must go to the original languages. The Strong's Concordance states "visit" means " to inspect, i.e. (by implication) to select; by extension, to go to see, relieve:--look out, visit.

In our everyday lives when something is not working or growing we go to inspect it. When our churches or congregants are not growing or those planted in the House of God are withering on the vine, we must inspect the situation and find the answer in the Word of God. 2 Peter 1:3 states, "For His divine power has bestowed on us [absolutely] everything necessary for [a dynamic spiritual] life and godliness, through true *and* personal knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence" (Amplified Bible)

Life is challenging and becoming increasingly more so. We believers need each other more than ever. Hebrews 10:24 states, "Not forsaking *or* neglecting to assemble together [as believers], as is the habit of some people, but admonishing (warning, urg-ing, and encouraging) one another, and all the more faithfully as you see the day approaching Amplified Bible)."

It is often difficult for single mothers and fatherless children to fit into a modern congregation. Acts 6:1-7 is our example of addressing this need. I personally have only known four churches in my forty years in church who have "appointed godly men over this business" as the Book of Acts instructs. How many of us currently know the people in our churches like family? Do we know what their needs are? What is challenging them in their walk? Do you take the time to know them more than just on Sunday morning?

Last Fall I had the opportunity to have a meeting under a tent in West Jefferson titled "Testimonies from the High Country". By inviting people during my everyday activities I found that most of the people to whom I was sharing the event had lost someone close to them on drugs or had a child addicted to drugs or die from an overdose. Some shared the heartache of losing someone to suicide. Many said," thank you for doing this" but they did not attend. Many have been wounded in church or feel shame in their circumstances that prevents them from coming into the fold.

We had fourteen different churches represented. The largest nightly attendance was twenty-five. It was incredibly cold that week but it was a start. The saddest thing to me was that those who needed to hear the testimonies and be prayed for by those who overcame addictions were not there. Saints testified of their victories in Christ.

Currently our minds are filled with stressful thoughts of a changing American culture. We all have our personal problems, just as the early church did. If we look at individual churches one might say "we only have fifteen people what can we do"? However, looking at the Body of Christ as a whole, we have numbers, we have influence and we have power.

God did not make men and women the same on purpose. Women and children are weaker vessels in physical strength. Women are being injured and are dying in women's sports now by men presenting as women. Even the word "woman" is trying to be usurped by deceived men. Right now the biggest fight presented to the church in my opinion, is defending women and children .The Word of God focuses a lot on women and children. Part of the tithe is to be set apart and given to women and children in need. Every third year the entire tithe is to be given to qualifying women and children.

We need to guard our children more than ever. Men have a role and women have a role. Combined as one they become a whole. If we go to the Greek to the scripture about women being "keepers at home" that word in the Greek is a "oikourgos". It means "guard". God is telling women to guard the interior of the home. Men on the other hand, have a different musculature, beards and demeanor to be outside the home and protect the home from invasion.

I believe it is increasingly becoming critical to have a specific outreach to women and children. We can't leave it all to Social Services. The Mormons don't. The Muslims don't. I could follow with a list of groups that reach out and supply the needs to their own people. That is what God instructed we Christians to do in His Word.

There are more slaves in America now than any other time in history. There are approximately 27.5 million victims of human trafficking at any point in time in the world. The US figure alone is 5.1 million. The vast majority of them are women and children. The statistics concerning our youth coming from single mother homes is alarming:

- 63% of youth suicides are from fatherless homes.
- 90% of all homeless and runaway children are from fatherless homes.
- 85% of all children who show behavior disorders come from fatherless homes.
- 80% of rapists with anger problems come from fatherless homes.
- 71% of all high school dropouts come from fatherless homes.
- 75% of all adolescent patients in chemical abuse centers come from fatherless homes.
- 70% of juveniles in state-operated institutions come from fatherless homes.
- 85% of all youths sitting in prisons grew up in a fatherless home. (Fixfamilycourts com)

America has the largest number of single mother homes in the world. About one in four homes are single mother homes. Many children are in daycare or after-school programs or are "latchkey kids" from birth to the time they leave the nest. They spend very little time with their parents. Social media now instructs them and they are exposed to every kind of evil befalling them. The sins of Sodom listed in Ezekiel are very present today. Will America escape judgement? I believe that depends on the churches' response.

We will all be grateful when the Lord returns and removes us from this time waxing worse and worse. But He also asked what will He find us doing when he does return? Will we be working for Him? Will we be evangelizing the lost? What will you be doing the second the sky opens up? That's a question each and every one of us must answer.

Addressing the needs of our culture as Christians takes more than just hearing the Bible. It's more than attending church a couple hours a week. It's applying the Word of God in our lives and doing it I'm asking you to pray about how you can as a church or as an individual support and outreach to women and children in Ashe County.
