


Best Kept Secret is now out! The Library at Ashe Baptist Association Office

In the small, picturesque town of West Jefferson, nestled in the rolling hills of North Carolina, the Ashe Baptist Association Office sits as a beacon of faith and community. Hymnals and choir songs fill the shelves, their pages worn from years of use as well as some new books. The library's collection includes a diverse array of cantatas from classical masterpieces to contemporary works, ensuring that the musical needs of every church can be met. Every Sunday the choir's harmonies can fill the sanctuary, lifting the spirits of the congregation. Here at Ashe Really Cares, we are in the sowing business. Every day at ARC, volunteers give their time, community members bring food, clothing, and monetary donations, churches in our association collect funds or budgeting monthly donations. The point of this effort, to further the mission of the ARC: to meet the needs of the community and share the love of Christ; to sow the many seeds so the harvest will be bountiful.

In April, we provided food for 285 individuals in a total of 125 households including 5 new households. We had a total 207 households utilize our clothing pantry.

Pastor Steve and Pastor Chris from Midway Baptist brought their Youth on May 1st for a quick spring clean. They spread mulch, cleaned off debris from the roof, thinned out brush, washed bins and carts, and replaced our screen door donated by Midway. We are so grateful for their time, effort and great attitudes!

Current pantry needs: 15 oz cans of: carrots, mixed vegetables, and sauerkraut, 6ct toaster pastries, diapers (of any size) and wipes.
