

#### "NO PLACE LEFT"

This is a movement of movements. I too believe that there is "NO PLACE LEFT" that the gospel of Jesus Christ should not be shared. Even in Ashe County and



beyond! I have a responsibility to share Jesus because of what Christ has done in my life and because I live in Ashe County. A new generation of people need to know Christ and his forgiveness. We need to tell our personal story and disciple another person so they can disciple another person, so they can disciple another person. It's a God-sized task but is commanded by Jesus in Matthew 28:18-20. Churches can multiply but more importantly souls can be won to Christ and then they have the opportunity to learn, grow and disciple. For some of us, the Holy Spirit has spoken and convicted us in regard to the lostness in Ashe County and beyond. Of the 27,281 folks in Ashe County, surveys show that 60% are not in church on Sunday. I believe to impact lostness we must lead churches to become Disciple-Making Churches and develop a Disciple-Making Strategy that will work in the area that you live in. It is that area that God has called us "ALL" to become a disciple maker. A church should be known as a disciple-making entity! (Disciple-Making Culture). Therefore we must go forward with an emphasis on impacting lostness through Disciple-Making! From our seats to the streets we must build an Army to impact lostness. Boots on the ground is necessary for all of us. Paul too taught us in 2 Timothy 2:2 "things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." A disciple is one who follows Jesus, whose life is being transformed by Jesus, and who embraces the mission of Jesus. The scriptural basis for this is Matthew 4:19. "And He said to them, follow Me and I will make you fishers of Men." New believers and other members of the church require much more than a public welcome and a handshake when they join the church. From the very first day, they need a Christ-centered friendship with someone who is prepared to walk by their side and help them feel genuinely welcome and answer their questions and to lead them to small group Bible Study. Studies have shown that new church members who do not establish meaningful relationships within six months, are likely to quietly exit through the back door. Personal training combined with traditional small group teaching, is vital. When we read in Matthew 28:19 "Go....make disciples" that is what it means. Are we doing that? If the answer is no, why are we not doing what Jesus commanded us to do? Fear? Lack of training? Because we have not been discipled? The Hope for the Mountains Disciple-Making Team is ready to help you to be a disciple-maker! For three years we have been preparing to share with you what can be done to help yourself and or the church you attend to have a plan of action forward disciple-making. Sixty-two folks representing twenty churches are coming together for a Dinner at Timber Rivers Event Center on March 2nd at 5:00. At this meal we will be sharing exciting new opportunities for you concerning disciple-making; including steps for the reproducible process of disciple-making: equipping disciples who make disciples! We have room for more folks if you would like to attend. Just call the Ashe Baptist Office and let us know. I believe this event will help Ashe County to do what Jesus said "Feed my Lambs". He also said "Do you love me?". Peter said yes; will you say yes? I look forward to the results of churches who implement a disciple-making process in this coming year. Thank you Linda Blackburn, Myra Phillips, Christina Wagoner, Trina LaFrance, Rev. Steve Allen, Glenn Miller, Rev. John Elledge, and Rev. Joshua Hernandez for spearheading this time of Go, Share, and Rejoice. Who is your one to disciple?

Thanks to all of the churches that participated in our annual Souper Bowl collection of soup and other items. So far we have collected 3,097 items along with \$1,119.50!!! As of today some churches have not been able to get their items to the ARC due to bad weather. We will give a final total on David's radio announcements when everything has come in. We appreciate all that you do to keep your mission going and able to meet the needs of our community.







# GOT A HURT, HABIT OR HANG-UP?

#### What are Hurts, Habits and Hang Ups?

A HURT is an emotional reaction to another person's behavior or disturbing situation.

**Some common HURTS are:** Abandonment, Abortion, Abuse, Adoption, Betrayal, Dysfunctional family, Neglect, Rape and Rejection.

A HABIT is an unhealthy pattern that often starts as a perceived remedy for some problem in your life, but ends up turning into a chronic bad behavior or addiction.

Some common HABITS are: Abusive behavior, Alcohol, Bitterness, Affairs, Critical spirit, Drugs, Eating disorders, Gambling, Gossip, Homosexuality, Isolation, Lying, Pornography, Selfmutilation, Sex addictions, Spending problems, Stealing, Unforgiveness, Wasteful pursuits and Workaholism.

A HANG-UP is a negative attitude used to cope with adversity. Some common HANG-UPS are: Anger, Anxiety, Codependency, Control freaks, Depression, Fear, Greed, Impatience, Laziness, Materialism, Perfectionism, Pride, Procrastination and Shame.

# What does a Friday night at Celebrate Recovery look like?

6:30-7:00 - Fellowship Meal

WE EAT TOGETHER, talk and fellowship. We meet new friends and catch up with old friends.

7:00-8:00 - Large Group Meeting

THE LARGE GROUP MEETING is our general meeting, where all men and women participants gather for a time of worship through music, followed by either a testimony or a teaching. This is a totally relaxed, non-threatening gathering where someone can come and see what recovery is all about.

8:00-9:00 - Open Share Groups (men/women)

AT THE CONCLUSION of the Large Group meeting, participants dismiss to attend small groups that are divided by men and women. These groups are a safe, non-judgmental and confidential place to share life's struggles and victories. Sharing is completely optional at this meeting.

**ANONYMITY AND CONFIDENTIALITY** are basic requirements of Celebrate Recovery. **Anyone** you see here and **anything** you hear here, stays here!

# CELEBRATE RECOVERY A CHRIST-CENTERED RECOVERY PROGRAM

What is Celebrate Recovery?

Celebrate Recovery is a Christ centered recovery program designed to help people address a variety of HURTS, HABITS, and HANG-UPS.

What is the purpose of Celebrate Recovery?

The purpose of Celebrate Recovery is to celebrate God's healing power in our lives through the Twelve Steps and Eight Recovery Principles. This experience allows us to be changed. We open the door by sharing our experiences, strengths, and hopes with one another. We become willing to accept God's grace in solving problems in our lives.
