We appreciate all of the churches who have donated for this food collection. This helps to stock our shelves and we are able to give out plenty of food to our neighbors who come in.

Some items that we are in need of are: 16oz. Peanut Butter, can potatoes, can carrots, can sauerkraut, can mixed vegetables and can tomatoes. Thank you for helping to stock our shelves!!!

Continue to pray for God to send the ARC the person that He wants to be the next director. We want the ARC to continue being a blessing to the community and to the families that are in need.





Transitional Interim Ministry training is a two-day event that equips pastors to serve as an interim pastor with churches in pastoral transition. You will be provided effective tools that can be used by either a traditional or a transitional interim pastor, as well as the pastor search committee. The training is from 9 am to 5 pm each day, with lunch provided.

The experience of hundreds of congregations and their leaders confirms that what is done in the transitional period between the departure of one pastor and the calling of another greatly influences the future of the church. The \$75.00 registration fee covers materials, meals and snacks.

The training is taught by Allan Blume, contract worker for the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, retired pastor, and former editor of the Biblical Recorder.


