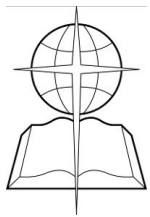

Revival Flames

For the first time in a long while, I feel we are in revival and it is spreading. Many different places the Holy Spirit is hard at work. Asbury University, Cedarville University, Times Square New York, lots of churches, several foreign countries and the list goes on. God is not dead. God is very much alive. His Holy Spirit is touching a lot of people. Linda and I had the privilege to go to Calvary Baptist Church in Winston-Salem, NC for the Disciple-Making Conference. Revival was going on there. On Mission Together with hundreds of church leaders and the staff of the NC Baptist State Convention. Our speaker for the meeting was Robby Gallaty, Senior Pastor at Long Hollow Church in Hendersonville, Tennessee. Over 1500 folks have been baptized at Long Hollow Church recently. Even with covid going on the revival started. Folks from 17 different states came to Long Hollow to be baptized. Even folks who watched on Facebook at their Church Service came between the two services of worship, during Sunday School and asked to be baptized. He stated that he wanted to say it was his great preaching and their great programs that caused the surge of people but it was the moving of the Holy Spirit bringing folks to know Christ and then giving them the desire to be baptized. He commented on five things that causes Disciple-making in the local church. He talked about a different scoreboard that the church should use. Pushing the finish line back beyond activity. Busy does not get the work of Christ done. We need to perfect the work of the saints, do the work of the ministry and edify the body of Christ. Staff burn out when they do all the work. Equip coworkers to do the work. Become a hero maker and call people to action. He asked the question; why are you here and what does God want you to do? Are we Spirit lead or church led? Do what God has called you to do. Equip saints-do not entertain them. Come alongside folks and create a disciple-making plan that is theirs to own. They own it not the church because they have created it for themselves. Push back the finish line. Make a training center to empower each one to create a plan they own. Too much activity and too much salt causes confusion. Of the 100% of folks that attend church, 50% of them connect but only 25% serve. We are all called, should be discipled and then sent out to work for the cause of Christ. God using Covid has changed the need for a new pathway. We are doing things now we never did before. Perhaps that is a good thing. We need to grow and to be stretched. Ownership changes the way folks serve. Some folks think they are in a pit and cannot get out. We need to be better discipled (Spirit Led), have realistic expectations and a map on how to get these things done. This is what helps folks get out of the pit. It gives them freedom to serve. We need to be faithful, not famous. Who is on the throne room of your life? Rockstar personally is killing the church. Is there a cross in your hand when you look at it? **Look and see!** God can do in a moment what we can't do in a lifetime. You can have as much of God as you want. We can't be full of self and be full of God. Remember blessings come down when praises go up. When the people of God pray that is the beginning of revival! I saw folks standing on their feet, lifting their hands to God and folks kneeling in the altar which was so full that they knelt in the isles and at their seats praying to God. Is revival winds blowing in our area? I think so. Let God work and equip folks to serve. Take advantage of this unique time of being revived. I have seen revival come and go in my lifetime. Enjoy this time, God is a work! Be missional, be accountable and be reproducible disciples that will produce disciples that produce other disciple makers. See you at the revival!!!!

Although I have been an Ashe County resident for a relatively short time, I have already learned to greatly appreciate not only the beautiful mountains and scenery, but also the people. I have found the great majority of Ashe County residents to be very friendly, kind and gracious to newcomers like my wife and I. I have found these qualities not only in those with plenty, but also apparent in those that are needy themselves. The needs are many—food, clothing, shelter, medications, utility bills, and other basics of living. I am so thankful for the generosity of so many in this county as they reach out to their neighbors in need. The Christian foundations that were placed in previous generations in Ashe County are still bearing fruit. As the FaithHealth Connector for this County, January was a busy month. We have connected clients with resources to help with medication bills, sitters to relieve the exhausted caregivers of loved ones, providing rides for patients to physician appointments, and referrals to those needing counseling. I gave a presentation on FaithHealth to two groups and a short overview on the local radio station. We are trying to get the word out that FaithHealth is in Ashe County and can assist and connect residents in need with numerous resources that are available.

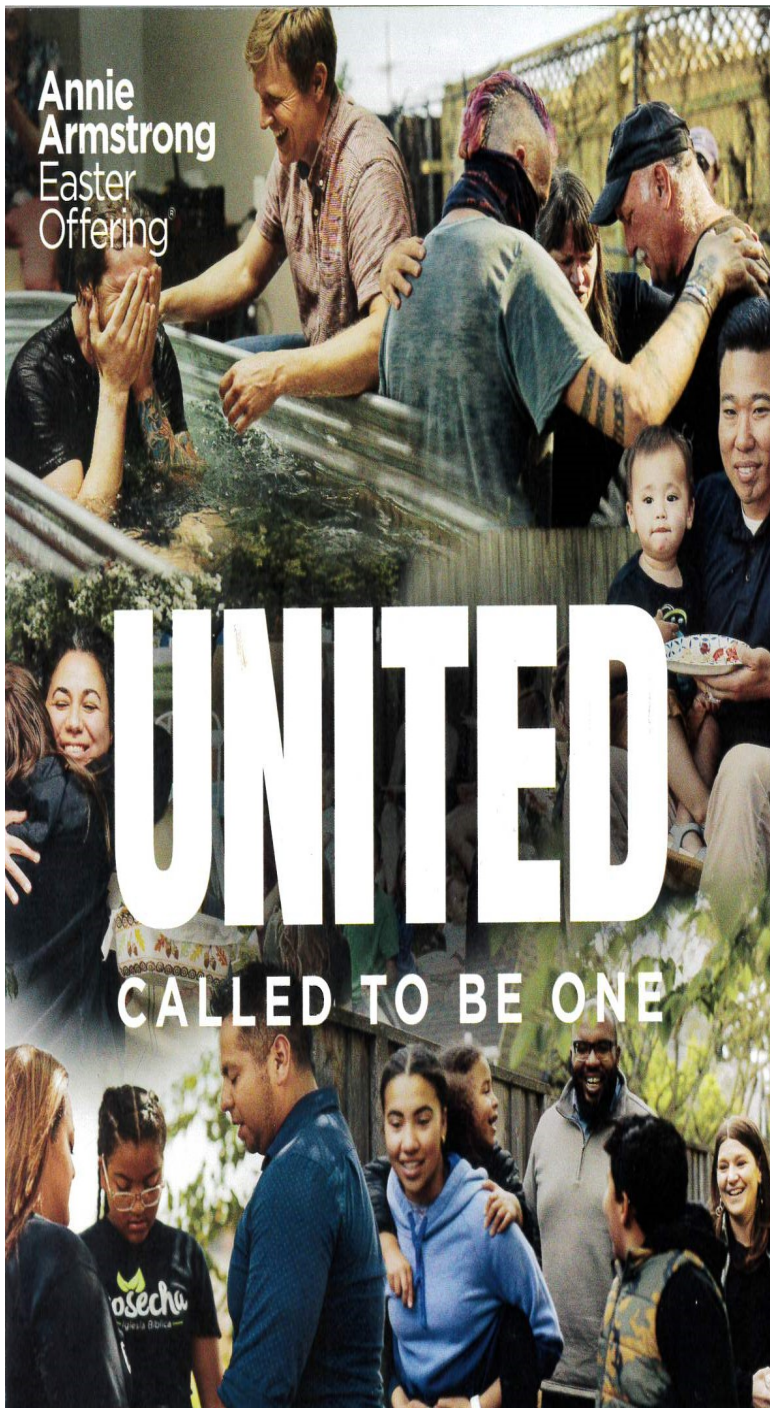

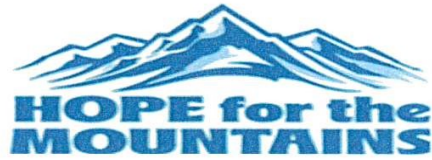

The Steps for Success!

HOW TO BE A PART OF THE FOOD ROUNDUP



1. Spread the word. Food Roundup flyers (see enclosed sheet), ads, slides and other downloadable resources are available. Use them in your printed and email newsletters. Share the flyer. Post the Food Roundup on social media! Find resources at bchfoodroundup.org

2. Encourage your members. Publicize the needs list (see enclosed sheet) in your church and encourage them to collect. Share your church's plan for participating. **Note:** Due to licensure regulations, we cannot use outdated food. Check expiration dates and buy food that has the longest shelf life.

3. Find out where to deliver your collection. A pick up point is designated for your area. Contact your association office to find out where to take your church's collection. Pick-up points will appear in the April edition of Baptist Children's Homes' (BCH) **Charity & Children** newspaper and on the Food Roundup website. You will need to find out the last day your collection point will accept food deliveries.

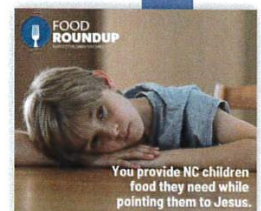
4. Who do you know that can help? You may have a connection with a distributor who would be willing to donate items from the needs list. If so, please reach out to them or send their contact information to Alan Williams at 336-474-1277 or awilliams@bchfamily.org

5. Rally your volunteers. Recruit missions, youth and other volunteer groups to help at pick up points to box and load items onto delivery vehicles. Call the contact person for details. A list will be in the April edition of BCH's **Charity & Children** newspaper.

6. Box it up. Sort and place the food/supplies in sturdy boxes for loading and transport.

7. Trucks & drivers needed. We are in need of large trucks to help with pick up. If you know someone who has access to a truck that could help with pick up and/or delivery, contact Alan Williams at 1.800.476.3669, ext. 1277 or awilliams@bchfamily.org

8. Share the video. The 45-second video is ideal for sharing your church's impact through the Food Roundup. Go to vimeo.com/bchfamily/fr22 to download it. Please share it in your services, e-mail newsletter and on social media.

Change the View of Worship

To change in the church from funnel fusion to engagement fusion is the goal . We have folks who come to church and they make up 100% of those folks in church. 50% of those folks will connect with the church in some manor. Only 12% serve in some capacity. In the model that Jesus gave us he had lots of folks following Him(100%). He had 12 disciples connected to His ministry. But from those deacons we have more than 12 % of folks serving in our world today. People are called, they need to be trained as those deacons were, then sent out to serve and helped others to be engaged. It is a clear picture and a clear process.
