"The Lazarus Moment In our Time"

We are all familiar with the passage of John 11:1- 45. This is the story of Lazarus who died and Jesus brought him back to life. You and I may feel like Lazarus because of the stay at home orders that we had to live by. All the changes such as social distancing, wearing a face mask (although that may help our looks), no hugs, no handshakes, no meetings in person are just a few. Wash our hands often is the first habit we were to be careful doing and the list goes on. People like Mary and Martha were looking for answers. They go to Jesus, the chain breaker! I believe that is who we need to go to as well. Jesus shared with Martha in verse 25, "I am the resurrection and the life; he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live!" People all though the United States and around the world are hearing the word of God and many are believing on Jesus! It is a Lazarus Moment for them and for us. Isn't it amazing the number of Pharisees and Chief Priest that are still alive today? Verse 53 shares "Then from that day forth they took counsel together for to put him to death". There are folks who want the churches and Christians to just go away. How sad, "They need a Dose of the Ghost!" I believe Jesus is on the way for us in more ways than one! Verse 25 shares; "When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still in the same place where he was". Time is not a factor for Jesus. He knew all things are under the control of His Father in Heaven. We too must wait if we are to experience the Lazarus Moment! The whole world has the opportunity to experience this Jesus of Nazareth. As we prepare for the Lazarus Moment in our life, family, with our friends and church may worry, negative thoughts, burdens, and apprehensions be placed upon the shoulders of the one who can bear them for us. I know that I can not add one cubit to my stature nor my ability if I try to bear them. Let us walk with our hands in His, whether we be on the mountain top or in the valley. Jesus help us be aware that thou art walking by my side as you did with Mary and Martha. They were on the way to a Lazarus Moment and you and I are too! Ask God to give us calmness and confidence as we trust in Him. Let us just live one day at a time! I may not know you because you are wearing a mask but know that God does. I look Forward to the Lazarus Moment!

As our world has been turned upside down let us look to the one who made heaven and earth and everything therein. As we struggle with everything that is going on in our world today and everything seems so uncertain let us remember who is in charge. With families staying at home and children are being home schooled everything is confusing and also frustrating. As families and a country we are learning patience and a different way of doing things.

We have continued to be open for families who are in need of food. We have stopped allowing our neighbors to come in to look at clothing until things calm down. Those who have appointments are told to pull up to the door and open their trunk, we then bring out their food boxes and put them into their vehicle. We are trying to keep everyone as safe as possible during this time.

We have struggled some to keep enough food for all the families who have appointments and also those who call in needing food. We have went to the grocery store trying to find the food that we are out of. Sometimes we are able to get a few cans of each item and sometimes there is nothing left on the shelf. Second Harvest Food Bank is also struggling to send food from Winston-Salem. Our salvage boxes have been cut down from 12 a week to 6 a week. We have not gotten any meat in two weeks from Second Harvest Food Bank. The driver said that we would not receive any meat or eggs for the next few weeks. We are thankful to some in our community who have brought us fresh eggs and to Food Lion for the daily products that we have been getting. We were also blessed with a lot of meat from our County Extension Office. God is our provider and He knows what we need and He blesses us with items to give out.

As we work through this situation please remember to pray for families, be patient and keep a smile on your face so others can se God's love through you. If you know of someone that needs help please give the office a call.





Bandana Facemask:

Step-by-step instructions for making your own face mask:

First, fold your bandana into a long rectangle, wide enough from top to bottom to cover both your nose and mouth, and extend slightly under your chin.

Then, slide your hair ties around either side of the bandana, about one-quarter of the way in from each end. These will be the hooks that go around your ears to keep the bandanna on your face.

Next, fold the bandana in one side, at the point where you've placed the hair tie. Do the same thing with the other side, tucking that side into the opening of first flap you folded in.

This side that you've been working with will be the side that goes against your face, as you loop the hair ties around your ears to keep it in place.

That's it, you did it! You made your own face mask that you can now wear in public while you have to do essential things that might bring you in close contact with others, like when you have to go to the grocery store.

What to Do If You Test Positive for COVID-19

COVID-19 cases are rising across the country. Large-scale efforts like lockdowns and social gathering bans are helping slow the spread, but containment efforts shouldn't stop at your front door.

According to the CDC, if you or someone you live with tests positive for COVID-19, or is exhibiting common symptoms like cough, fever and shortness of breath, you should stay home and contact your doctor or local health department.

If possible, ensure that the person who is sick stays in a separate room away from other people - even pets. Pets will not get sick from the disease, but can transfer the virus from person to person through contact, similarly to shared surfaces.

It's important to call ahead before visiting the doctor. Health officials say this allows the doctor to take proper precautions to protect other patients and health care workers. It also can prevent increasing strain on emergency and healthcare systems.

Don't share household items, such as food, drinks, or personal care items. Wear a mask if you're sick or if you're directly caring for someone who is. As always, cover coughs and sneezes, preferably with a tissue -and wash your hands right after you cough or sneeze. Washing your hands is one easy to implement step that can drastically slow down the spread of COVID-19. After you use a tissue, throw it away immediately into a lined trash bin.

Wash your hands often, using soap and warm water - scrubbing for at least 20 seconds. Disinfect high-touch surfaces often, like doorknobs, phones, and counters.

If you develop serious symptoms like difficulty breathing and a fever of 104 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, contact your doctor or emergency services.


We need another church to take the Oct 17 date to mow. If you can help out, let us know.

Leave your concerns with him. "With thanksgiving ... " (vs. 6)

Meditate on good things. "Think about the things that are good and worthy or praise" (vs. 8)

Celebrate. Ask. Leave. Meditate. C.A.L.M."



Wonderful advice, wouldn't you agree? One more thing, and it is my prayer that you will allow the Holy Spirit to remind you of this today: "to wait, biblically speaking, is not to assume the worst, worry, fret, make demands, or take control. Nor is it inactivity. Waiting is a sustained effort to stay focused on God through prayer and belief. To wait is to 'rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Him. (Psalm 37:7)'"

Dear friends, we do not know what today or tomorrow hold, but we know who does, and we know who holds our hand!

Well, we are listening and empathize with your struggles! After all, we're Sista's here, right?






