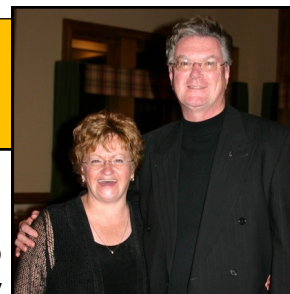

Preacher David's Corner

"Discipleship and Disciple Maker"

Growing up Southern Baptist I had a drug problem. My parents drug me to church on Sunday morning, Sunday night and Wednesday night! On Sunday night we had Discipleship Training. Jesus spoke the words to His disciples just days after He had risen from the dead. We commonly call these words "[The Great Commission](#)." In this charge, Jesus commands all His people of all times to their great task – that of making disciples. If you have turned from sin to trust Christ fully, then you are a Christian, and by definition, a follower of Jesus Christ. When you hear the word discipleship, what thoughts come to your mind? Like other words, it may have lost the significance of its original meaning. In the church you attend do believers tend to think of discipleship as knowing facts about Jesus or following Jesus in a personal, dependent, obedient relationship? Biblically, discipleship is not a program but a process of becoming Christlike and being zealous to see others become disciples also. Training in those days and even today, we learn about following Christ and doing the things He taught His disciples to do. Mathew 28:18-20 is mandatory, therefore we have a job to do as a lifestyle. It is an opportunity for you and I concerning disciple-making to learn how the process of disciple-making works, to make it reproducible and equip disciples who make disciples. New believers and new members require more than a handshake. Are we someone who can walk side by side with them? Most church studies have shown that if a new member does not establish a meaningful relationship within six months, they are likely to quietly exit through the church's back door. That is happening too much because disciple-making is not happening as it should in the churches we attend. Now is the time to take another look at disciple-making and use the model that Jesus used to insure success. For me, the goal of disciple-making must include maturing as Ephesians 4:13 and 15 share; to mature a man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ....we are to grow up in the aspects into Him who is the head, even Christ. Also one of my favorite verses is 2 Timothy 2:2, Things which you have heard of me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also. A disciple is a person who is following Christ, is being changed by Christ and committed to the mission of Christ. A disciple-making culture happens when the values and ministry focus of a church results in a lifestyle of disciple-making behaviors on the part of the church members. Remember that disciple-making is a relational process where disciples of Christ share the gospel, people come to repentance and faith in Christ, new disciples are taught to obey commands of Christ and mature in Christ, new disciples share the gospel with others and repeat the process. May we share the good news, connect folks to small groups and even individuals who are trained in disciple-making help folks to minister and release them to be a disciple maker. This does not happen over night. It takes time as we spend time with folks that God has called us to be in contact with. It could be one person, three persons or even 12 persons in a small group setting. Linda and I have does this since the 70's in churches and now in the Ashe Baptist Association. We encourage you to be a disciple-maker and if you need help to learn and grow, contact the associational disciple making team. They are ready to help in any way they can. Now is the time!

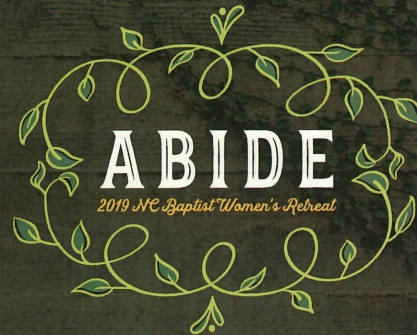

We would like to encourage all of the volunteers to mark your calendars for that date.

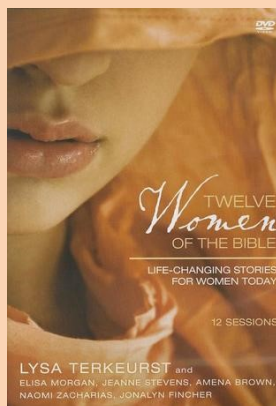

Earnestly believe that God exists, that I matter to Him and that He has the power to help me recover. (Step 2)

Happy are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Consciously choose to commit all my life and will to Christ's care and control. (Step 3)

Happy are the meek.

Openly examine and confess my faults to myself, to God, and to someone I trust. (Steps 4 and 5)

Happy are the pure in heart.

Voluntarily submit to any and all changes God wants to make in my life and humbly ask Him to remove my character defects. (Steps 6 and 7)

Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires.

Evaluate all my relationships. Offer forgiveness to those who have hurt me and make amends for harm I've done to others when possible, except when to do so would harm them or others. (Steps 8 and 9)

Happy are the merciful. Happy are the peacemakers.

Reserve a time with God for self-examination, Bible reading and prayer in order to know God and His will for my life and to gain the power to follow His will. (Steps 10 and 11)

Yield myself to God to be used to bring this Good News to others, both by my example and my words. (Step 12)

Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires.

GuideStone Financial Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention was founded on the idea of serving those who gave sacrificially to spread the Word of God. Even though it has now become one of the largest denominational benefits organizations in the world — offering an array of retirement, life and health, and investment options — the heart of our work is still providing relief to thousands of aged ministers and their widows.

What we do

GuideStone's financial assistance program distributes more than \$500,000 a month to over 2,000 retired ministers and their widows. Qualified recipients of Mission:Dignity funds receive \$200 per month for an individual or \$265 per month for a couple. (Recipients must meet guidelines for income, assets and years of Southern Baptist service.) Often, this small monthly income makes the difference in paying the electric bill or getting needed medication.

More than \$6 million is paid out annually in assistance to help retired servants of God pay for the basic necessities of life.

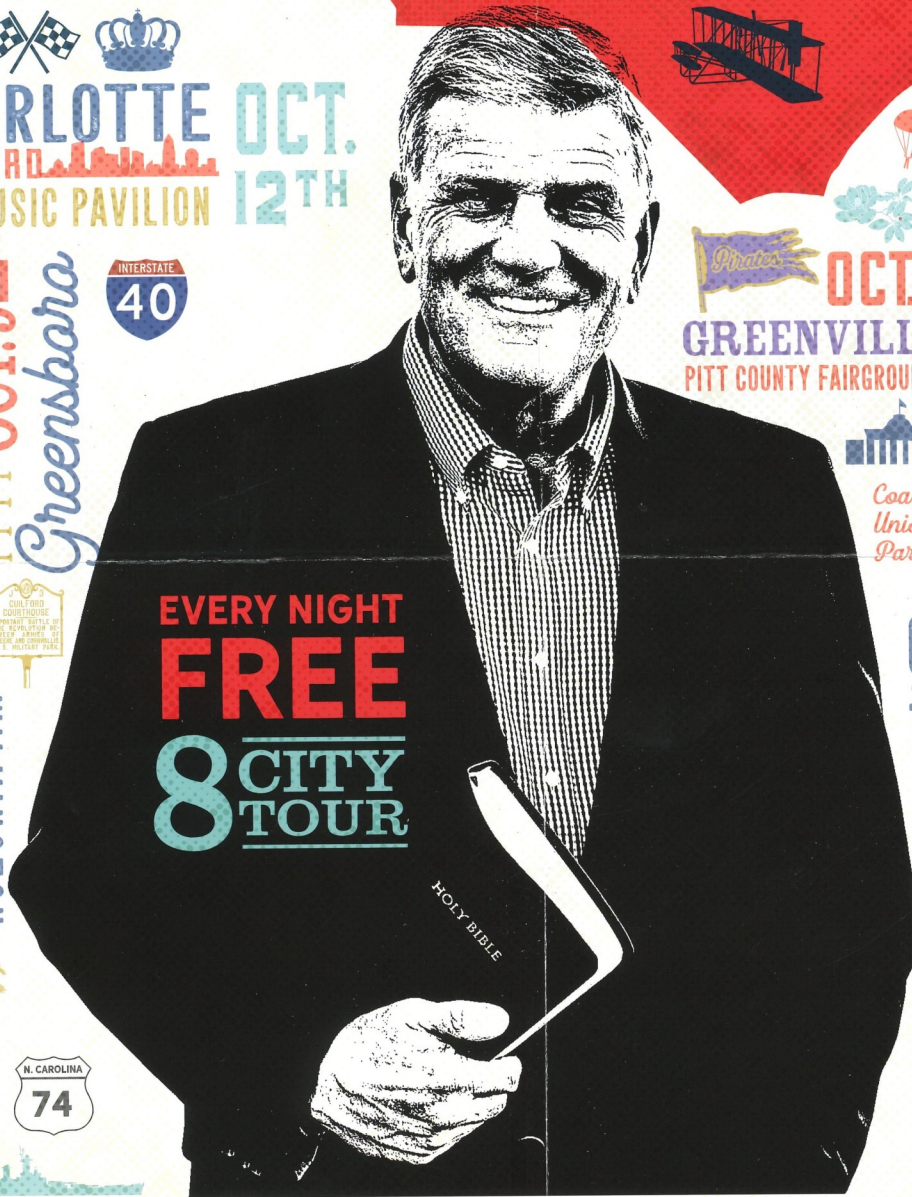

Discipleship Thought of the Month

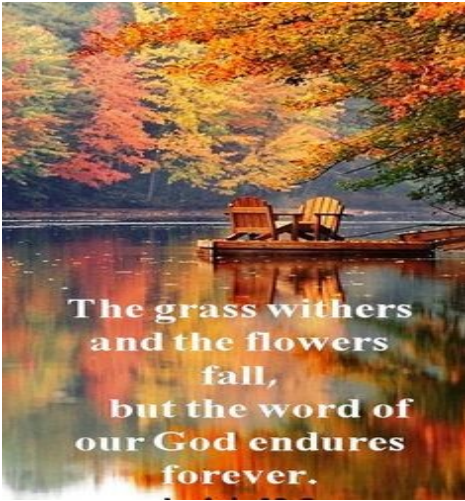
Successful Service
