On Friday August 16 at the Liberty Grove Baptist Church the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina sent nine representatives and the Executive Director Treasurer, Rev. Todd Unzicker to share insights, offer guidance, and provide encouragement to the association's messengers. Their presence underscored the importance of unity and collaboration in facing the challenges of today's world. On Saturday August 17, at Friendly Grove Baptist Church, nineteen local associational leaders also took the stage, shared stories of what God was doing in their churches, communities and around the world. A recurring theme throughout the meeting was the importance of missions. From local outreach efforts to international initiatives, the association's dedication to helping others was evident. Stories of lives touched by their work, both near and far, filled the churches with a sense of purpose and determination. The our work is far from over. As the cold months approach, we anticipate that need to increase drastically. All this is possible through the generosity of our Association's churches and other community members donating funds, and goods, as well as volunteering their time.

FaithHealth Connector Report

I had always loved the mountains, but I started to have a deep longing to live in the mountains about 25 years ago. My wife, Cindy, and I started to make plans to make a move to the mountains of N.C., but the plans were put on hold for many years as we cared for elderly family members in South Carolina. I have often wondered why I, and thousands of others, have been drawn to these mountains. In reality, there is and has always been, a longing in the hearts of people for the mountains all over the world in every generation. Why do mountains so mesmerize us? Where does this desire come from?

The United Nations declared 2009 "International Year of Mountains" and dedicated it with the slogan, "We are all mountain people." That phrase summarizes well the role mountains play in Scripture. From start to finish, the story of the Bible swirls around mountaintops, and the people of God truly are mountain people. The Bible uses the words Mountain or Mountains 624 times. In contrast, Love is used only 504 times.

Genesis 31:54. "Then Jacob offered a sacrifice on the mountain, and called his brethren to eat bread. And they are bread and stayed all night on the mountain."

Exodus 19:20. "Then the Lord came down upon Mount Sinai, on the top of the mountain. And the Lord called Moses to the top of the mountain, and Moses went up."

Isaiah 2:2. "Now it shall come to pass in the latter days *That* the mountain of the Lord's house Shall be established on the top of the mountains, And shall be exalted above the hills, And all nations shall flow to it."

As we leave the Old Testament and move to the New Testament, we continually find the prominence of Mountains in the ministry of our Lord Jesus.

Luke 9:28-29. ^{"28} Now it came to pass, about eight days after these sayings, that He took Peter, John, and James and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ As He prayed, the appearance of His face was altered, and His robe *became* white *and* glistening."

Luke 6:12. "Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God."

The earthly ministry of our Lord Jesus concludes on a Mountain as He gives the Great Commission to His Disciples. Matthew 28:16. "Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them."

The Holy Scriptures close by declaring the eternal City of God and our eternal home is to be on a high mountain. Revelation 21:10. "And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great, high mountain, and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God."

How do we ensure that our final home will be on that great mountain? We humble ourselves and bow at the foot of another mountain---Mount Calvary. The Mount on which the Son of the Living God shed His blood on a cruel Roman cross for the sins of the world. Let us all be certain that we bow at that Old Rugged Cross where our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, offered Himself as a sin offering for us all. This is the true call of the Mountains to each of us.





Families Change Tomorrows

As many of you know, the opioid and methamphetamine crisis continue to destroy homes and displace children here in Ashe County. We are thankful that there are grandparents who are stepping up to the plate in their latter years to care for their grandchildren and keep them from going into the foster care system. With this commitment, there are many challenges as well as blessings. Grandparents are often on a fixed income, and many return to work to provide for their expanded families. Many grandparents are unable to physically participate in activities, causing the children to miss out on everyday activities and adventures other children can experience. However, studies show that keeping children with their families in a familiar environment is beneficial to them. High Country Caregivers is here to support these kinship care families. We provide experiences the children may not otherwise get to participate in. We provide support groups that are beneficial to both the grandparents and the children. We connect families with needed resources. We follow our kids until adulthood with programs aimed at guiding them in the right direction. It is our goal to point all children in our program to a path that leads to success! We also teach the children to "give back" to the community to show their appreciation for the community. Ashe County has 180 children and 52 families currently in the Kinship Care program. We have been designated as a nationally Exemplary Kinship Program. Our goal is to turn these kids' lives around so they can be successful and valued members of our community. To do this, we need your support!
