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

### MISSION TEAMS VISIT SAINT VINCENT

During the first week of March, a team of 16 people visited SVC from the West Tennessee Haiti Partnership (WTHP) and Friends of Saint Vincent (FOSV). Bringing 30 suitcases of donations with them, the group consisted of doctors, nurses, researchers, medical and pharmacy students, an educator, pharmacist, occupational therapist, an artist, and other enthusiastic volunteers. While on site, the group ran a general medical clinic for the students and staff. In the afternoons, team members led art activities for the children.

During their visit, the medical clinic provided care for 214 patients, 44 of whom were adults. The children were given wellness assessments and treated for issues like ear, skin and respiratory infections. The adults were screened and treated for high blood pressure, diabetes, and arthritis. Several children identified with more serious medical issues were referred to local Haitian medical facilities for follow-up and further evaluation. Most of the medications and supplies were purchased locally in an effort to support

the Haitian economy. (A reflection by team leader Dr. Susan Nelson is on p. 3.)

The art activities gave the blind and deaf students an opportunity to make more than 100 pairs of earrings for all the female staff members at SVC. Sonya Yencer (FOSV) says, "Working one-on-one with an interpreter, each student chose a set of earring components. In each set, one earring was pre-strung so they could feel the beads and their sequence. The loose beads were placed into trays where students searched for the first bead. For some, this was a BIG challenge, but their perseverance won!"

Both the FOSV and WTHP have been supporters of SVC for many years. We continue to be grateful for their partnership and look forward to the future. Thank you to all who so generously donated their time and expertise to this venture!

# Partnership With CMMH

In a memorandum of understanding with the Saint Vincent Centre's Board of Directors, the Children's Medical Mission of Haiti (a 501(c) (3) charitable organization) has agreed to function as the fiscal agent for SVC. # All the latest information about the board of directors, strategic plan and future move

On March 7-8, 2017, the SVC Board of Directors held its spring meeting at the Hotel Montana in Port-au-Prince. The board currently has six Haitian members and four members from the United States. They schedule two face-to-face meetings each calendar year, with additional meetings taking place as needed via conference call.

Agenda items included updates on new construction in the Santo 17 operation of the finance, medical, education and development committees. The strategic plan for Saint Vincent's was reviewed in detail, with board members reaffirming their commitments to a number of key areas, "This is a ceremony including: of hope."



- Strengthening enrollment policies to align with the SVC mission, with careful attention paid to all potential students' physical, educational and financial needs.
- Providing all students with medical and dental care, nutritious food, and the necessary resources to help them be successful.
- Improving teacher standards and establishing an educational plan for each student enrolled.

- Continued strengthening of the organizational structure, including improving staff alignment, training, and accountability.
- Solidifying formal financial procedures, reliable budgets for each program, and firm financial controls.
- Achieving a fundraising goal of \$245,000 to support critical daily operations and the unfolding needs of the Centre.
- Completing a successful relocation of all school programs to the new facility at Santo 17 by September.

Also on March 8, board members joined a number of SVC supporters at a blessing and dedication of the new school property in Santo. Calling it a "ceremony

of hope," Bishop Jean-Zaché Duracín opened a service which included prayers, presentations about the new school, and special music by a group from Saint Vincent's. Tours of the property followed.

The SVC Board of Directors continues to work diligently on all aspects of the Centre. They look forward to the changes coming in the future, mindful of the need for stability and a strong sense of community. With their guidance and strong leadership from the staff, 2017 promises to be an exciting year for Saint Vincent's.



## "THINGS DONE AND LEFT UNDONE" by Dr. Susan Nelson

Medicine is said to be a humbling profession. That is never more true than in Haiti.

Awake early this morning, I run through yesterday's events in my mind. We have seen about half of the children so far, and about 20 adult staff. Yesterday during Morning Prayer we prayed the General Confession, asking God for forgiveness for things done and left undone. I told my team then that I always have this feeling of regret as the last day at the school approaches. I realize that we won't be able to evaluate every child. I pray that the truly sick children will find their way to the clinic. I recognize my own limitations in the face of so much need.

We all bring our best to this work, our particular skills and knowledge. Whether a doctor, a nurse, a retired paramedic, a graphic artist, an occupational therapist, a deacon, or a sign language teacher, we all pour our mental, physical and emotional strength into the week at St Vincent's. It is never enough, and yet it is more than enough. We have only our best to offer, and the grace of God makes it enough.


## ALMOST HOME...
