

Nigeria's current fleet (47 ships, over 200 boats) predominantly patrol vessels plus two ex-USCG cutters (NNS Thunder & Okpabana). Recapitalization of Nigerian Navy significant since mid-2010s, mostly offshore & coastal patrol vessels from France, China, UAE, Turkey, and Nigeria, plus UAVs & helos.



May 2022 - Nigerian Navy received LST Kada. Second on order from Damen in UAE. Frigate Aradu not seaworthy and not yet in planned refit or replaced.




**Eqt. Guinea** received a refitted Bulgarian frigate, *Wele Nzas*, in 2014 to go along a Bulgarian-built corvette (*Bata*), delivered in 2012.

One of three CMN Ocean Eagle 43 ocean patrol craft delivered in 2015 as part of the Privinvest "Tuna Debt" scandal, only settled in 2023. Many of the smaller vessels delivered to **Mozambique** in this deal are non-operational.





Angola is in a major naval recapitalization process, with a first French-built 70-meter LST joining fleet in 2023 and another scheduled for 2024. Three BR71 Mk II corvettes plus additional smaller boats are on order from UAE.
