Foster Home understands and agrees:

- That Texas Cattle Dog Rescue is the sole and rightful owner of the foster dog and that all decisions regarding the dog will be made by Texas Cattle Dog Rescue. The Foster Home will temporarily house and care for dog belonging to Texas Cattle Dog Rescue. The care of the dog is not transferable.
- To treat the dog in a humane and loving way at all times, and to make sure that anyone temporarily caring for the dog will do the same.
- To provide dog with proper veterinary care as is recommended. This includes a monthly heartworm and flea prevention, which is provided by Texas Cattle Dog Rescue. Foster Home agrees that all veterinary expenses must be pre-approved by a Texas Cattle Dog Rescue board member, even in an emergency. Expenses that are not approved may not be reimbursed.
- To make certain the foster dog wears the Texas Cattle Dog Rescue ID tag on its collar at all times. (ID tag will be provided by Texas Cattle Dog Rescue.)
- To never allow the dog off leash when it is outdoors, unless it is in a fenced in area or fenced yard. The Foster Home must take extra precaution to prevent the dog from getting loose outside or running out of a door that was left open. Should the dog go missing, the Foster Home will contact a Texas Cattle Dog Rescue representative immediately and will aid in the search for the dog.
- To ensure the dog will reside in the home, not outside. The dog must be confined in a securely fenced area if left outdoors unsupervised.
- To keep the dog clean and well-groomed at all times, feed a wholesome, quality dog food, and have fresh water available at all times.
- Texas Cattle Dog Rescue is not responsible for any damage caused by the dog while in foster care. Therefore, Foster Home agrees to confine the dog to a crate when it cannot be directly supervised. Loaner crates are available from Texas Cattle Dog Rescue.

- That it is often the Foster Home's job to determine or learn the temperament of the dog they are fostering. Texas Cattle Dog Rescue has no way of knowing the temperament of most of the dogs coming into the program. Therefore, Foster Home agrees to use due caution when first handling the foster dog. Further, Foster Home is fully aware that any dog may bite if provoked. Foster home also agrees to never allow any stranger or child to be near the dog until the dog is trusted, and will never allow any child to threaten, squeeze, poke, step on, or otherwise pose a perceived threat to the dog. IF Foster home determines the dog to be a biter, or a bite risk, they are to contact Texas Cattle Dog Rescue immediately.
- To notify Texas Cattle Dog Rescue immediately if the Foster Home decides it would like to adopt the dog. This must happen before a potential adopter makes plans to meet the dog. We will not cancel an adoption in progress.
- To allow a representative of Texas Cattle Dog Rescue to visit the home at any time to check on the wellbeing of the dog.
- To return the dog to a member of Texas Cattle Dog Rescue within 24 hours of being asked to return the dog. If Foster home is unavailable at the time the dog is needed, Foster Home agrees to make the dog available for pick up within the 24-hour period.
- To immediately notify Texas Cattle Dog Rescue and return the dog if for any reason he/she is unable to continue to house and care for the dog.

**APPLICANT/FOSTER further understands and agrees that fostering a dog involves certain inherent risks and dangers of accident, injury or even death. I/we understand and agree that I/we fully and freely accept all responsibility for any injury which may occur to me, my pet(s) and/or my property and that Texas Cattle Dog Rescue Inc., or any other member, volunteer, director, employee, agent, servant, partnership, business entity or person associated with Texas Cattle Dog Rescue Inc. cannot be held responsible in any manner, even for their own negligence, for any injury of any nature to me, my family, my pet(s) or my property.**

**APPLICANT/FOSTER further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless, Texas Cattle Dog Rescue Inc. or any other member, director, employee, agent, servant, partnership, business entity or person associated with Texas Cattle Dog Rescue Inc. for their own negligence and any injuries, death, or damages which may be associated with such negligence regardless of whether such injuries, death, or damages are caused in whole or in part by the negligence of any of the parties herein indemnified.**

**APPLICANT/FOSTER acknowledge that I have read and understand this agreement, the intended effect of which is to RELEASE from liability, even for matters that may occur in the future, Texas Cattle Dog Rescue Inc., or any other member, director, employee, agent, servant, partnership, business entity or person associated with any of those named and that this agreement shall be binding upon me, my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns. I further waive my right to sue in the event of injury, any of those persons named above, or anyone acting through them or on their behalf.**
