"Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker!" Psalm 95:6

"...put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:14-17

Worship is foundational to our life together as a community of faith. That is a statement with which I think all of us can agree. The challenge comes when we all try to articulate what meaningful worship is to us.

The challenge has many levels. They include what our worship experience was in our formative years, special moments when a sermon, hymn, or special music touched us, our level of comfort and ease at participation in worship and even the preferred time when we choose to attend worship. Beyond those challenges are generational preferences for what meaningful worship looks and feels like. Some prefer the newer version of the Lord's Prayer, some the old. Some prefer one version of the Bible over another or more contemporary music over traditional hymns. With the possibility of having three or four generations worshiping together in the same space, there are bound to be differences.

Here at Fellowship, we have had two distinct services this past year to try to address some of those differences and preferences. Our 10:00 a.m. service is a traditional Lutheran Service of Holy Communion with quarterly liturgy changes. Our later service at 5:00 pm is a worship and praise service and has a more contemporary and informal order of worship. Since I have been your pastor, I have thoroughly enjoyed presiding and worshiping at both services.

The traditional service evokes the time-tested order of worship that can be traced back to some of the earliest days of the Christian church. So, for me, who was raised in a traditional structured service, it touches me deeply. Here is the familiar hymnody that has blessed Christians over the centuries, especially for our Lutheran part of God's vineyard where the power of hymns and music are an integral part of the gathered congregation. Here too we have been blessed by our church choir, band, and our many talented musicians.

The Worship and Praise service picks up with praise and some traditional songs played on the piano. The relaxed, more intimate atmosphere of the service allows one to concentrate on the music, the word, and time around the table of the Lord with a small group of people and encourages the sharing of joys, prayer concerns, and God-moments. It really helps those who connect with more praise type music and culture to hear, worship and respond to God, as God speaks to them. So many of the songs speak of our relationship with God, our desire to draw close to God, and God's love for us. I find God's presence in this service, and feel blessed to be part of the worship team. Another plus for the 5:00 service is that it is available if one has plans on Sunday mornings or just wants to sleep in once in a while, and it is a "come as you are" 45-50 minute service. We are committed to offering our 5:00 service through September at which time we will reevaluate the need for this type of service.

I am grateful that our church offers a choice for worship preferences and hope you are too!

Following April's vote on refinancing our mortgage, The Board of Administration has finalized the loan and the congregation is in the process of moving its bank accounts and all of the associated automatic deposits, payments, etc. The new bank has been very helpful in making this process as painless as possible. I would like to say a special thanks to Tracey Nave for making all of the details come together with the bank. When we closed on the mortgage, the rate was a little less than the last quote that they had given me, so we are going to save just about \$12,000 a year on the mortgage payments. This makes a significant improvement in our overall cash flow.

The Board of Administration and PPC continue to look for opportunities to reduce expenses elsewhere in our budget. Our copier lease comes to an end in the next couple months and we have started to look into a replacement. Like much of electronic technology these days, the cost of similar function goes down over time, so we are anticipating a savings in our lease payments for a replacement copier when this lease runs out. We have also identified a few other cost saving areas and are implementing them as we find them. Thanks to all the Boards for their diligence in looking for opportunities. We are also using Thrivent Action Team grants for as much as we can to offset expenditures. We will be able to fund nearly all of the costs of the Amazing Grace Day Camp, the Teacher Appreciation luncheon and other activities that we can fit into Thrivent's guidelines with these grants. Some of these things offset our operating expense and some enable us to do things that we hadn't counted in our regular budget, expanding our ministries.

As I write this, Pastor Bob Abrams had brought greetings from the Synod to our congregation and delivered the sermon for May 27. His sermon focused on inviting, and that lines up with the plans that PPC has in mind coming up over the next few months to do an intentional inviting event. We are looking to use the Fishing For People workshop and other resources to help us each be able to be more comfortable inviting people to visit with us at Fellowship. A couple of Pastor Bob's suggestions today of ways to start a conversation like that were: to be able to say why you come to church; and offer to pray for someone who is hurting in some way. Ask yourself that question, why *do* you come to church? You don't have to come to church, but you do. The reason could be why someone else might want to come. As to asking someone how to pray for them, as he said, it offers a way to show that God cares about them (and us) and it is a simple way to show you care and start a healing conversation.

I invite you to try out your inviting. Go back to the exercises that Pastor Robin gave us last summer. Try a 30 second elevator pitch about Fellowship. Think about why you come to Fellowship and tell someone. Offer to pray for or with them. Invite them to an activity like First English, or Men's breakfast, or the outdoor service, or something else that we do that you like. Our enthusiasm really can be contagious.

ELCA Always Being Made New Campaign





"Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:20-21

This is last year of the 5 year ELCA Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA. The goal was to raise \$198 million to invest in the future of the ELCA. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton said, "Through this first ever campaign, we made a commitment to invest in the future of the ELCA -- and working together to do so. Something we learned and saw with the Malaria Campaign is that every gift counts. It is so important for us to do this together, because, together we can do more. Together, we are deepening our relationships and expanding ministries that serve our neighbors and communities here at home and around the globe."

What has been the result so far? The campaign has supported:

- ~11 New global ministry evangelism projects across the globe
- ~18 new congregational starts
- ~518 projects supporting sustainable solutions to hunger and poverty
- ~521 seminary students with ELCA Fund For Leadership scholarships
- ~125 International Lutheran women with academic scholarships and training
- ~315 Young Adults in Global Mission in 15 different countries
- ~230 missionaries working in more than 40 countries to proclaim the Gospel and raise up new leaders with our companion organizations
- ~26 Renewing Congregations grants in the United States
- ~ELCA World Hunger programs in 62 countries, including the United States
- ~21 new or improved youth and young adult ministries
- ~32 grants for workshops, training, education, and camps for the disabled through Disability Ministries

Here's one example from these many things, Rev. Seth Nelson, Fund for Leaders said, "Oftentimes, discernment can feel kind of lonely. You think, "Am I the only one asking these questions in this particular way?" But, If people are putting money behind you and placing value on what you're doing, that's very encouraging, in more ways than just financially.
