

First, I'd like to thank everyone who was at the congregational meeting on April 8. No matter your vote or your opinion, it was important that you were there. If you didn't hear, the congregation approved PPC's recommendation to refinance our mortgage to improve our cash flow and enable us to maintain and hopefully increase our mission work.

Second, the planning for the Amazing Grace Day Camp is moving along. We have most of our afternoon activities planned now. We will be packaging pet food for Sedona Grace as we did last year, and we are having the Columbus Zoo come over one of the days to talk to the children about the zoo, and will be bringing 6 animals over for them to experience. We have 2 campers already registered! If you have neighbors, friends, or relatives who could use a free summer day camp, please let them know that we have this opportunity daily from July 16 to July 20.

Third, dust off the inviting stuff Pastor wrote about last year. We are planning to do an inviting day in the fall. Details will be coming soon. In short, we will be asking everyone to try their hand at inviting someone to meet them at church on a specific Sunday. We'll probably do a cookout after the service and have some inducement for them to come. So, dust off Pastor's old inviting exercises and start practicing. Remember, the first practice was to us "my church is ..." in a sentence with a friend or neighbor at least once a week. You might also think about creating an Elevator Pitch about Fellowship. In some articles in prior months, there were some examples. An elevator pitch could be a good way to have a quick, planned thing to say about Fellowship to lead into an invitation. Here is an example of one of the ones I created:

My church is Fellowship Lutheran Church. We make amazing things happen by sharing God's love and grace through our words and actions. We are small, but mighty. Being small makes us very friendly. But, we can still do big things – like serving meals at First English on the near-east side, hosting a free summer day camp, and having a really good musical worship service.

While doing some spring cleaning, I came across an old Lutheran magazine which had a very interesting article called "Renew and Renovate". In this article it states many interesting facts which pertains to all the discussions and exercises Fellowship has been doing to be a more inviting congregation. In the article it states:

"Nearly 30.9 percent of ELCA churches reported an average attendance of fewer than 50 people in 2012. ELCA membership decreased 14.7 percent, according to ELCA Research and Evaluation. Declining membership means doors are often closed to new ideas and, even more important, energy. Many of the stalwart, faithful members who remain active are bound by a sense of tradition and duty. Some are more comfortable to continue ministries "the way we've always done it." But here is the problem: adhering to that tradition and duty formula is a sure-fire way to fizzle faith and fervor. "

So what do we do? In the same article, the answer to the problem is spiritual growth.

"That means teaching church members how to recognize God as a living, breathing, dynamic part of their lives, helping them to recover a sense of the vibrancy and activity of a God who can't stay away. The central part of a renewing church is renewing our spiritual life first, then mission work second, vibrancy third, and then growth. **Transforming and renewing our spiritual lives should be front and center as a focus of the church's work.**"

I continue to challenge every family to sign up for one slot on the 2018 host list. It is a very easy way for each of us to help bring our Fellowship family together.

I "borrowed" this month's newsletter article from our friends in the LCMS.

Our Father in heaven sent His Son, Jesus, to be our savior. His atoning sacrifice is the first fruits of all the dead, a pleasing aroma to His Father – and ours – so that His perfect life and death count for all who believe in Him.

He claimed us as His own children in Holy Baptism. He sustains and strengthens our faith with His Holy Word and His Body and Blood. As new creatures, who have put on Christ, we bear good fruit. We do the good works prepared for us, which He makes known to us in His Word.

By faith then, trusting in the Word of God, we do what he says because He does not lie and always keeps His promises. For "without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" (Heb. 11:6).

And so the Lord promises: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine" (Prov. 3:9-10).

How do we honor the Lord with the wealth that God has given us in His generosity? By giving it generously to those whom the Lord has called us to love and support: your family, your society, and your church. And His promise is that in so doing, you will never lack.

I can almost hear it now: "But that's from the Old Testament!" But our Lord Jesus Himself gives us similar promises in the New Testament. He says, at the conclusion of the parable of the talents, "For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance" (Matt. 25:29).

We have become conditioned against these promises because of their misuse by the peddlers of the prosperity gospel – the guys on TV who say you get rich by putting God in your debt. And thus, we miss out on the fact that God does reward temporal faithfulness in temporal matters with temporal blessings.

It's no quid pro quo. It's all from God's grace, His fatherly divine goodness and mercy. But those Bible passages just quoted do in fact say what they say! It's not the Old Testament's problem. It's ours. It is almost as if we have become so jaded against this that we think it a virtue to be stingy with our offerings.

But our Father in heaven still loves to bless those who bless others. He loves to give to those who give freely and generously. In fact, he challenges us to challenge Him: "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need" (Mal. 3:10).

And so, while we don't give so that we would get, we do receive from the Lord in order to give, and He will bless your giving with more receiving. For "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things" (Rom. 8:32)?

In May, we remember Pentecost, which commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church."

During this season, let's take time to express our thankfulness for membership in the body of believers at Fellowship Lutheran Church. Together, we can accomplish wonderful things.

Every three years, the ELCA hosts a youth gathering. This year, it is in Houston, Texas. Two of our youth are going, Jillian Mott and Laura Powell. This is an exciting opportunity for young people to grow their faith and have a terrific experience. They come back filled with the Holy Spirit.

The theme of this year's gathering is "This Changes Everything," and is based on the verse from Ephesians above.

Grace is foundational to the Lutheran faith. This undeserved gift from God changes lives and perspectives. Because of what Christ has done, all are called into the world to serve their neighbor and share the good news.

In her book "Woo: Awakening Teenagers' Desire to Follow in the Way of Jesus," Morgan Schmidt identifies the three central desires of teens. All youth desire:

Someone to become

Somewhere to belong

Something to do [that changes the world]

At the 2015 Gathering, evaluations and conversations with the attendees showed that our young people echo these desires. As young people for these things, the Gathering is a ministry that helps define some of that and opens up pathways of discovery. Ultimately, we want youth to understand the fierce love that God has for them, just as they are, and that by grace, through faith, they have been saved. When young people (or really any age person!) truly claim this reality, it indeed changes everything.
