

God's grace is not a status to be achieved, but simply a gift...a gift to be received. It is a promise to be trusted.

Thank you also to all those who participated in the three focus groups. We have some different opinions on some issues but I believe that it was obvious that we can disagree with each other but still love each other. We have our unity in Christ.

By the time you read this, we will have completed the Focus Groups and will have held the discussion with Dr. Cheryl Peterson from Trinity Seminary. These activities have been put together to help address the concerns that were discussed during the September Congregational Meeting. The objective of having Dr. Peterson speak with us was to address and clarify some of the concerns about the ELCA's theology that were brought up and have been referenced in some of the NALC's comments regarding the ELCA. The Focus Groups were workshops intended to get perspectives about the other concerns that were raised and to identify ways for the congregation to move forward. There will be some action items that come out of these groups that we will want to pursue in the coming months. Hopefully, once these tasks are complete, we will be able to increase our focus on inviting people to join us in experiencing God's Love and Grace here at Fellowship.

On November 11, we will be having our regular Congregational Meeting. The primary purpose will be to elect leadership for the next term starting in January. We will also review the results of the focus groups. As mentioned in a prior email, the slate of candidates that was put forward by the nominating committee was:

This slate mirrors the organizational structure that has been outlined in the updated constitution that is in progress. The Synod is currently reviewing our proposed constitution and, when they have completed their review, it will come to PPC and then go to the congregation for approval at a future congregational meeting.

Please make every effort to attend the congregational meeting so that we can get our new leadership team in place for the beginning of the year.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who participated in the Focus Groups and the meeting with Dr. Peterson. We identified some good things to work on, and we got to know each other better in the small group settings.

Stewardship & Service

Churches and places of worship have historically been known to be a community gathering place. What would you say about Fellowship? Are we part of the community or just in the community? This time of year more than other times the answer is very clear if you were in the Patch during delivery day or on any of the days following, selling and talking with those who come by.

Fellowship's Patch has been serving as a way to generate funds for nearly 20 years so the money raised has always helped in the community, but are we really part of the community? Do people come and gather here? Do they take anything away other than the pictures and pumpkins?

Earlier in 2018, Lilly our youngest, a student at Liberty Elementary, saw a kindergarten teacher with 27 kids in the car pool line and offered to help get them to their parents' cars. Her and a friend now do that on a daily basis, during their recess, each one taking 5 or 6. Lilly explained she has to let some of them grab fingers on the way to as she only has two hands. She saw a need and helped to solve a concern in her school, how does that relate to the patch? On Saturday 10-13, Lilly and I met about 10 families of all types including one of the kindergarteners that she helps each day, he came to the patch with his Mom. Jonah recognized Lilly and spoke briefly before he was bouncing between pumpkins trying to find the perfect one. His mom leaned over to Lilly gave her a hug and said "thanks for helping him get to the car each day, what you do matters".



Lilly and her friend were recognized by the school for helping out, but meeting the Parent of a kid she helps every day is something that happened out in the community, out in the Patch, it was the result of the community connecting with us. It could be said of too, what we do matters.



Two weeks prior, 2500 Pumpkins were unloaded. This was accomplished this year by some help from the community; some students from Dublin Scioto and the student athletes from the Worthington Kilbourne boys and girls cross country teams. The boys cross country team endured some coaching changes and had yet to gel as a team early in the season. In the trailer is Tanner, he was the last one to leave and doing one of the least glamourous of jobs on unloading day. Later in October the boys team would win their first league championship. Tanner and two other of the other top 5 finishers helped to unload pumpkins, in cross country you can be a very fast runner and you can in fact take first place, but your

team can not win with just one fast runner's score. So it is with unloading, you can have one very strong determined worker, but they themselves cannot unload 2500 pumpkins. One of the students who unloaded is accompanying Fellowship to First English on November 8th to serve some meals, as he wanted to see where some of the money goes. On October 27, the boys team competed in the regionals finishing 10th, on that same day Tanner qualified for states as an individual.

Is it possible working together and completing a big task helped the team with team building, it's certainly a possibility. Since they served we have heard from students that they had fun, will never look at pumpkins the same again, and possibly got as much out of serving as we did out of their service. That's how it is when your part of a community.

One last story, one of our members came by with her adult son who recalled working to unload as a kid, the most memorable part he said was when he " was old enough to work up in the truck" He remembered when he was able to help on a bigger level.

There can be no better lessons for us as we wind down Patch 2018, look to help on a bigger level, look to connect with those around you to do more as a group than you can do alone, let it be said of us that what we do matters, that we are not just in the community we are part of it. To that end Stewardship will be announcing a more aggressive Patch Proceeds distribution plan at the November congregational meeting, we want to get the funds out and into the greater community and have a plan to both fund our youth trips for the next 6 years and to distribute as much as possible in 2019 and the years to follow.

Theological Resources

Recent discussions and emails have discussed ELCA theology and assert contrasts between the ELCA and NALC. One suggestion that came up was to investigate the ELCA's theology. There is a resource available to anyone, but especially to Lutherans that discusses ELCA theology every month. That resource is *Living Lutheran* magazine. Over the past several years, Living Lutheran has run a series of articles on Lutheran theology featuring ELCA seminary professors and other Lutheran writers discussing specific theological concepts and questions. 
