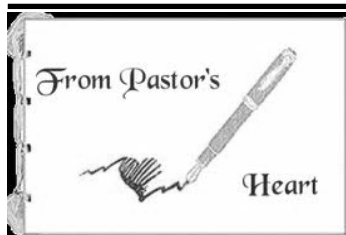

"There remains, then a Sabbath-rest for the people of God, for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his. Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest... Hebrews 4:9-11

A couple of weeks ago, I preached on the importance of the Sabbath and taking time each week for relaxation, rejuvenation, and renewal...and also, much needed rest. Sabbath rest is more than a nap. Sabbath rest is life-oriented and life-giving. Or, at least, that's in part what God had in mind.

God rests at the end of creation so that creation can continue. The Sabbath is created for life. And God rests for the sake of life. Not for a break. Not for some time out or time off. Not for a job well done. Not just to recoup. Not for the completion of a week worthy of reward but because rest is needed; it's essential for our physical, mental, and spiritual well being. And, because, Sabbath rest anticipates action for the sake of life once again.

This past month has been a busy month for me. I began the month at **Synod Assembly** in Lewis Center. Here are some of the highlights of the assembly:

Keynote Address, Fellowship Dinner and Synod-wide Worship

The Rev. Jerome Taylor brought the assembly to its feet as he closed his keynote address about Micah 6:8. His sermon prompted the resolution that was brought to the assembly later that day and overwhelmingly passed, asking that assembly participants urge the congregations of the Southern Ohio Synod to appeal to their congressional representatives expressing their concern regarding the injustice of the separation of children from their families seeking refugee status in the USA.

The Spirit continued Rev. Taylor's work into the evening of June 1 as over 240 people gathered for a fellowship dinner at All Saints Lutheran Church in Worthington, Ohio. Following the dinner, Bishop Suzanne Darcy Dillahunt preached and presided over the synod-wide worship to a crowd of about 300 voting members and guests. \$1,169 was raised during the offering to support the Reformation Ministries fund for new and renewing congregations.

The next day elections were held for synod council positions and the 2019 Churchwide Assembly. Excellent workshops on many topics were offered during the two days of the assembly. Books were also collected at the assembly which will be taken to Houston this week by the youth groups traveling by bus to the National Youth Gathering in Houston. The books will be used to assist Houston children to improve their reading skills and comprehension. More than 1,350 books were collected!

There will also be an assembly in June of 2019 as it is a bishop election year (the bi-annual assembly will resume in 2021). The 2019 Southern Ohio Synod Assembly is scheduled for June 7-8. The location is still to be determined as the synod keeps accessibility and cost in mind.

During the middle of the month, I took an excellent 8 hour course on Mental Health First Aid and obtained my three year certification. There were some very good guidelines and information given on many topics with which I often find myself involved while providing pastoral care and assistance.

And, I will end the month officiating up in the Cleveland area for my nephew's wedding. John and Jessie have visited Fellowship several times the last couple of months and it is an honor to be asked to co-officiate with Rabbi Susan Stone at this wedding, which blends the traditions of Lutheranism and Judaism. Hopefully after Amazing Grace Day Camp in July, I'll work on my own Sabbath rest...

Have you been able to take time this summer for rest and relaxation? As always, I pray that you will still keep worship a priority in the midst of your vacations and relaxing. We are all better for your presence! See you in church!

PPC and the Board of Administration are working on several strategic initiatives for Fellowship in the coming months. These are cross-board initiatives that are strategic and very important to Fellowship's mission and to its future. Two of them are focused on our outreach to our community and neighbors:

Amazing Grace Day Camp Inviting Day

This year's Amazing Grace Day Camp is scheduled for July 16 to 20. We have about 12 campers currently committed. We are continuing to do outreach for the camp. We have used Facebook ads, the local NextDoor website, flyers posted in the library, and other locations. For the camp, we have the Columbus Zoo coming on Monday the 16th to show off what the zoo does and some of its animals. This should be exciting for the children. We are using Thrivent Action Grants to help fund almost all of the expenses related to the day camp including the food, publicity, crafts, and a donation to the zoo. There are door hangers available in the narthex that you can use to invite some of your neighbors. Time is running out, but we are in pretty good shape relative to last year. Last year, at this time, we had only 3 campers signed up. What a difference we have with 3 weeks still to go. We still need some help with the camp, especially helpers for the counselors in each of the program sections. Let me or Pastor Robin know if you can help for a day, a few hours, or the whole week.

Inviting Day is scheduled for Oct. 7, the week after pumpkins arrive. The objective of the inviting day is for everyone to invite one person to come to church with them on Oct. 7. We are putting together a team to do the planning and execution for that day. We have acquired some resources to help us from books on inviting, Pastor Katie Kerrigan's workshop materials, and some materials from the *Invite Your One* program which is essentially what we are trying to duplicate. We hope that this will be an opportunity for all of us to take a try at inviting people to church. I know it is difficult for us Lutherans to go out and ask someone to come to church. But, we will be doing it together this time. So, hopefully a little support, some cheerleading, training and a little friendly peer-pressure will help buck up our courage. We are planning to do some special things that day to put our best foot forward. We are planning a cookout in the area of the pumpkin patch for the congregation and invitees following the service and some other special things.

God calls us to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. These two initiatives are focused specifically on that call. They are different in audience and method, but they fit with the Great Commission. This is why God put us here on Sawmill Rd.

"And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" Matthew 25:38-39

Who are immigrants and refugees? The pictures above represent 3 different eras of refugees and immigrants. Can you tell which is which?

Does this description sound familiar? "... the immigrants that xxxxxxx sent to the U.S. during that great migration wave ... were its poorest and least educated citizens." Or, how about, "he'd posed as a refugee in order to sneak into the country unnoticed. His case was rushed to trial." The first refers to immigrants arriving from Scandinavia (like my ancestors) between 1870 and 1910 (<https://tinyurl.com/y8r76pax>). The second refers to Jewish refugees on the SS Drottningholm in 1942, trying escape from Nazi Germany (<https://tinyurl.com/ybvfb4sj>). Sounds a lot like we hear today. In case you were wondering, the first picture is of Scandinavian immigrants, the second are the Jews on the Drottningholm, and third are Hondurans from current times.

Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS) is a Lutheran based organization that has been working with immigrants and refugees since 1939. It was founded to help with the immigrants and refugees created by World War II and has continued that work until today. In the last year they have had special focuses on refugees from Syria and other Arab and Muslim areas that have been affected by ISIS. Now they are trying to help deal with the refugees from Central American nations, especially Honduras, El Salvador and Nicaragua. The refugees are fleeing from government corruption, gangs, human traffickers, and general fear for their families' safety.

Of course, none of this is really new. Since 1939, there have been any number of refugee and immigration crises. There were refugees during and following WW II. Many from the defeated countries of Europe and the nations that Japan had conquered. After the Vietnam war, there were refugees from Vietnam. I remember while I was in high school my grandparents' church talking about helping refugees who were Kurds. At the time, I had no idea who Kurds were. It sounded like a slur to me, not knowing who they were. Of course, Kurds are from Kurdistan which straddles Turkey, Syria, Iraq, and Russia. Even today, Kurds are still some of the people affected by the fighting in Syria.

Now in these days with the Central American refugees, LIRS continues to work to find foster families for children, assistance with refugee resettlement, and continuing to help the refugees and immigrants navigate the US immigration system and supporting the families while they work through the system. LIRS operates from the following Core Values to help immigrants and refugees, especially families and children no matter where they are coming from:

Welcome

“When I was a stranger, you welcomed me.” Rooted in faith, LIRS believes that we are called to welcome those fleeing persecution and seeking refuge in the United States.

Prophetic Witness

Not all are prophets, but all are called to be prophetic witnesses. At LIRS, this means we are committed to speaking out boldly and standing up for the just treatment of those we serve.

Integrity

Driven by a desire to serve vulnerable refugees and migrants, we refuse to compromise our moral, economic, and political integrity as we carry out our mission to that end.

Innovation

Committed to bold action and continuous learning, LIRS invites others to join our mission, eager to embrace fresh perspectives and explore new ways to engage in this work of welcome.

Interdependence

LIRS depends on a diverse network of community partners, faith-based groups, and private entities to magnify our reach and impact – and they rely on our expertise and leadership.

The new policies on refugees and immigrants are causing significant increases in the demand for services that LIRS and other organizations provide. It is straining the resources of LIRS and organizations like it.

This is a controversial topic right now. There seems to be disagreement about the facts and people think different new organizations or governments have different interpretations of what the situation is. LIRS has a number of resources on its web page to help determine what is happening and how we might respond in a positive manner.
