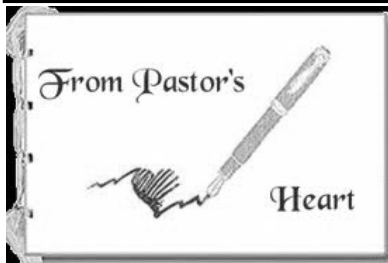

Martin Luther was convinced that the church had lost sight of this good news, one of the central truths of Christianity. Our salvation is a gift of God's grace through faith alone. Also on the 28th, we will celebrate the 38th anniversary of Fellowship and my 5th year anniversary as your pastor. I feel very blessed to be a part of this congregation!

Coming up on the first Sunday in November is All Saints' Sunday when we will remember and give thanks for all of our members, family and friends who have died since last year's All Saints Sunday. There will be a sign-up sheet soon on the table in the narthex. Also, don't forget to turn your clocks back an hour on November 4th!

As we form our focus groups this fall as a result of our fall congregational meeting, I encourage your participation if you are asked to serve on one of the groups. More information on this will be coming shortly.

*"But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood self-condemned; for until certain people came from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles. But after they came, he drew back and kept himself separate for fear of the circumcision faction. And the other Jews joined him in this hypocrisy, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. But when I saw that they were not acting consistently with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?" We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; yet we know that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. **Galatians 2:11-16 (NSRV)***

The Constitution Committee has been working diligently for the last year on updating our constitution that was last updated in 2004. Their work has finished. The Board of Administration then forwarded it on to the Southern Ohio Synod for review. Once they have reviewed it, they will send it back. PPC will review the final product. Then, it will be sent out to the congregation and we will vote on approving the update in an upcoming congregational meeting.

We also held the regular congregational meeting a week ago, as I write this. There were three major items on the agenda: 2019 budget, stewardship campaign, and discussion of our congregation, ELCA concerns and NALC. A preliminary budget was passed for 2019. According to our current constitution, the final budget will be approved at our January congregational meeting. So, any changes will be made and we will pass a final budget in January. The Stewardship Committee made a brief presentation of their plans for the stewardship campaign. They have described the process in the last newsletter and will be continuing the stewardship theme for the next couple months.

We also discussed the recent batch of email discussions during the meeting. Thanks to all who contributed to the discussion. As a result of the discussion, I committed PPC to do some kind of follow-up to those discussions. PPC met and decided to do a series of focus group discussions. We will have more than one focus group and will be inviting a cross-section of the congregation to attend. We hope to build on the work that was done in 2013 that related our congregational values to the ELCA and the congregation's response based on that. Following the tradition of Fellowship to *call* servants, we will be inviting or calling participants for the focus groups. As was done for the Call Committee to call a new pastor, we hope to have broad representation of the congregation to participate in the focus groups. We will work forward from the 2013 work and determine what is new in the intervening years and how Fellowship should respond. We will summarize the results and discuss at a congregational meeting in the near future. I hope we will get it all done in the next 2 months or so, but, it will depend on scheduling and time to review and compile the results. If you receive an invitation to participate in a focus group, I hope you will be able and interested in participating.

*Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on." **Mark 12:41-44 (NIV)***

Have you ever browsed the ELCA.org website? If you dig down to the Stewardship landing page, you'll find the following introduction to stewardship.

"As members of the ELCA, we believe that we are freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. How do we respond to God's call to serve and love our neighbors? We faithfully steward the gifts God has so abundantly given to us. Although some think of stewardship as only a financial response to God's love, stewardship encompasses so much more than money. It is about how we use all that God has entrusted to our care — our time, our talents and our treasures — to love God and our neighbors, both inside and outside of the church walls and our homes."

Our annual stewardship campaign theme is "We are Stewards, not Owners". It has been said that stewardship is far more about faith-raising than it is about fundraising. The primary purpose of a stewardship emphasis is to help us all grow spiritually. As we grow spiritually, yes, we do discover the joy of giving and a serendipitous effect will be that the church will have more money with which to fulfill the mission and ministry to which Christ calls us.

God is concerned how a person gives from his or her resources. "I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine... So give proof before the churches of your love and of our boasting about you to these men." [2 Cor 8:8, 24].

Martin Luther, wrote "There are three conversions necessary: the conversion of the heart, the conversion of the mind, and the conversion of the purse." Giving is conducted in faith that God will provide for those who give.

Mark 12:41-44 reminds us that there is a significant difference when we give from our wealth, rather than when we give abundantly from the little we have. As we look at the church today, we have more wealth than ever, but we give less than ever to the church! All that we have is given to us by God. *"Now Joseph was taken down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man; he was in the house of his Egyptian master. His master saw that the Lord was with him, and that the Lord caused all that he did to prosper in his hands." **Genesis 39:1-3***

Erika Storvik is a young Lutheran from Minnesota who chose to serve in Madagascar as a part of the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM). She felt overwhelmed her first night in Fianarantsoa. "It's probably the place that is the most different from Minnesota," she said of Madagascar. I think I felt similarly the first couple days in Haiti with the Haitian Timoun Foundation.



She spent a year in Madagascar along with local Malagasy companions teaching English to deaf elementary and secondary deaf students. The experience grew her faith. On that challenging first night, she recalls asking herself, "Why have I chosen to live on the other side of the world for an entire year?" She learned a lot from her students and other Madagasikara (people from Madagascar).

She learned the Malagasy spirit—being intentional with others, to the point where time and schedules take a back seat as one focuses on relationships—really filled her heart. "I was a very overscheduled, over-involved person before, so at first, my life felt empty if I didn't have something scheduled for every minute of every day," she said. "[But] you have so many more opportunities to grow if you don't schedule every minute."

It was challenging to live alone. She had to walk an hour each way to the deaf school. While at the school, she taught arts and crafts as well as English, while overcoming the language barrier and, at times, it was daunting, Storvik said.

But she stuck with it, said Kirsten Laderach, an ELCA pastor and YAGM country coordinator for Madagascar. Laderach's work with YAGM is primarily funded through Mission Support. "She just kept doing the work that you do when life's not easy, which I really appreciate about her," Laderach said.

Storvik said the community spirit she was shown by people she met helped made a lasting impression on her. "I think I'm a better person because I did YAGM," she said. "It's taught me that [from] the places and people I least expect, you can grow friendships, and even in very humbling situations ... [when] you know nothing or none of the answers—those are the places I saw God.
