¹⁷ So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. **2 Corinthians 5:17-21**

I recently attended a continuing education event by Ohio Health in Pickerington on "Understanding Addiction". The verses above were given as helpful scripture for the church when working with people affected by addiction, which is so prevalent in our society today. Pastor John Morris from Prince of Peace encouraged us to see addiction as a disease that needs medical assistance to help, and not as a behavioral problem...not as sin. The medical model of addiction takes the shame out of the situation and allows for healthy intervention. Pastor John also reminded us that **all** life is precious and holy - something that I think is easy to forget sometimes.

Our lives begin with the experience of forgiveness. God takes the initiative to offer us forgiveness before we have done anything to deserve it. We who are made a new creation in Christ are given the responsibility of being ambassadors of that reconciliation for the world. Like God's treatment of us, we are not to count people's sins as some debt that must be repaid. This is a dramatic step forward from the assumption that forgiveness is offered only after someone has demonstrated repentance and done penance.

In recent years there has been much debate in our society as to whether a person is sufficiently remorseful to deserve the forgiveness of society. Politicians and religious figures who have been publicly exposed have been central to this debate. To offer forgiveness only after a person has demonstrated remorse is a very human way of doing things, but "we regard no one from a human point of view." By taking the initiative to offer forgiveness, we allow God to shine through us. There will always be sin in the church and the world, and believers and nonbelievers will be tempted to judge others harshly. Jesus himself was subject to the judgmentalism of his peers. "He made him to be sin who knew no sin."

It was "in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them." The difficult challenge for Christians is to move beyond the world's simplistic capacity to judge the wrongs of others and to become ambassadors of God's amazing grace.

As I write this article, we are more than halfway through the season of Lent. We have been enjoying midweek fellowship with each other at our Wednesday Lenten suppers and services. As we approach Holy Week, I encourage you all to participate in our Maundy Thursday Agape Meal and service and our community ecumenical Good Friday service at Highlands Presbyterian. May we experience the anguish of the passion during "the three days" as we look forward to the joy of the resurrection on Easter Sunday!

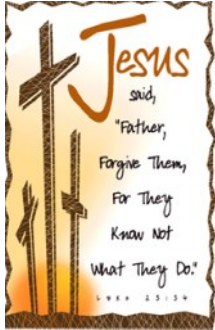

I want to thank everyone who was able to attend the March 3 congregational meeting. We had a quorum and were able to pass the proposed constitution in the first vote required to amend or create a constitution. The next step is a ratification vote that requires a 2/3 majority to ratify the new constitution. That vote is scheduled for Sunday, May 19. Please keep that date in mind and try to keep it open to be able to attend to ratify the constitution.

Your leadership team has been working on strategies for our congregation. We are using a book, *Power Surge*, by Rev. Michael W. Foss. Pastor Foss is an ELCA pastor who has focused on congregational leadership and vitality. The leadership team is working through this book reviewing and looking to apply the concepts to Fellowship. We are working on one chapter a month in our PPC meetings. I would recommend to anyone to get a copy of the book and read it through yourself.

The focus of the book is vitality of congregations and congregational leadership to achieve vitality. There is a little about congregational organization to support vitality. We have tried to structure the organization of our congregation along the lines that this book envisions. The key theme of the book is to enable and support discipleship within a congregation.

What does discipleship mean? What does it mean to be a disciple? Think about how Jesus called his disciples. Did he call them to be members of his group? No, he called them to be disciples. He called them to spread his teachings. He called them to be servants and to be selfless. He modeled that behavior for the disciples and mentored them. He used parables to illustrate what he meant. We remember that call to servant-hood and discipleship during our Maundy Thursday service where the leadership team wash the congregation's hands as they enter for the meal. Jesus calls his disciples to serve the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, and other downtrodden people. And he empowers them through his grace and forgiveness when they fail or don't measure up .

This is the point of the book and the idea that vital congregations are congregations of disciples who follow Jesus' call. We are free to do God's work because God is with us. He helps us, and he forgives us when we make mistakes. It aligns with our Purpose Statement to share God's love and grace through our words and actions. When congregations apply Jesus' call to their mission and ministry, the Holy Spirit gives them the energy, the talents and guides them as they apply them to the mission. What things are you good at? What gives you energy? What needs do you see in our community or our congregation? You can make things happen. We can make things happen together. When we do that, God will make us joyous and successful. And, we will make a difference.

Please consider your talents and assets and how you can support the mission and ministry of Fellowship. And don't be afraid to try something new. We have teams that need your help. What team(s) fit your passions and interests?

Sunday School News

In the adult class we will continue with the study of the New Testament from Matthew to Revelation. We will discover how historical research can illuminate the New Testament by a series of twenty lectures by the Professor of Religious Studies, Bart D. Ehrman at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Ehrman has crafted these lectures as a historical introduction to the 27 books of the New Testament to allow us to come to understand their content, meaning, and historical accuracy. Each lecture lasts about twenty-five minutes after which the class will discuss the lecture. Dr. Ehrman is outstanding! Hope to see you there!

Lutheran Disaster Response Responding to Tornadoes and Floods

"But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and all the domestic animals that were with him in the ark. And God made a wind blow over the earth, and the waters subsided; " Genesis 8:1 (NSRV)



The news in just the last couple weeks has been filled with natural disasters. There were tornadoes in the south, flooding in the Midwest and a cyclone in Southeast Africa. Lutheran Disaster Response is responding to them as you read this.

Cyclone Idal has affected more than 1.5 million people. Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is responding. They are working with their global partners and reaching out to local churches to help them respond to the needs of their communities. For example, in Zimbabwe, ACT Alliance members will be providing critical survival supplies such as blankets, hygiene kits, food, clothing and diapers for up to 6,000 adults and children.

Here at home in the Midwest, extremely heavy, early spring rains have hit Missouri, Nebraska, Wisconsin, and Iowa on top of heavy snowpacks. This has caused record-breaking flooding and serious damage to roads, bridges, cropland, homes, businesses and churches. LDR is responding through congregations, synods and other partner organizations to bring in help.

Alabama, Florida, and Georgia suffered severe damage in early March. 23 people died in Lee County Georgia. Over 1000 homes have been damaged or destroyed. And there has been significant damage to other property, like the unfortunate SUV pictured above. LDR is working with congregations in the Southern Synod to rush in relief.

As usual, one of the distinctions of LDR is that they provide longer term assistance, not just immediate, short-term help. They will be with these people for the longer term as they recover.

What can you do? You can pray for the communities who were impacted by these various storms -- "May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need." Pray that God will deliver comfort to those who mourn the loss of loved ones, homes and property, and strength to those who are working diligently to care for the affected communities.

You can also give to LDR. You can designate your gifts to support these specific needs.
