Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Just as Jesus gave the direction to his disciples, we too at Fellowship Lutheran Church have received his direction to "go and make disciples." But how do we do this? We may not be missionaries, but we can show God's love for all people right here in our own backyards.

Fellowship developed Purpose and Vision statements and adopted Core Values to guide us in our corporate and individual lives. They are:

Fellowship's Purpose – To share God's love and grace through our words and actions.

Fellowship's Vision – Be a diverse, thriving community of faith where all are welcome to God's love and grace.

Fellowship's Core Values

Worshiping: Rooted in the Lutheran traditions and centered on Word and Sacrament.

Serving: Caring for each member and our neighbors in the greater community.

Welcoming: Striving to welcome and engage all by establishing meaningful relationships so that all feel part of our FLC community.

Education & Youth: Growing and sustaining our faith with ongoing education, for all members, while also involving youth of all ages and finding ways to integrate them.

Generosity: Sharing God's Word and God's abundance with others by being generous with the time and resources God has given us.

We can live out our Purpose, Vision, and Core Values every time we reach out to others: hold a door open for the mom struggling with a full grocery cart and young children, give to or work at a food pantry, give to charitable organizations such as Lutheran Social Services and Disaster Relief, the Red Cross, etc., and in so many other ways.

We hope that each of us finds ways to serve God daily by living Fellowship's Purpose, Vision, and Core Values, because **each of us is Fellowship Lutheran Church.**

Update of FLC Policies and Procedures - Fellowship's church council is currently reviewing the written Policies and Procedures for our church. Some of the policies and procedures date back to the late 1990s and early 2000s, and do not represent who we are now, how we are organized, and how we operate. We have set a goal of completing this task for all of our policies and procedures by the end of 2024 so that we have current operating systems in place.

Church Insurance – We have received our insurance rate for April 1, 2024 to April 1, 2025 from our current insurer, Church Mutual. The rate (\$5,258) is \$1,036 higher than our 2023-24 rate (\$4,222). We have asked for an alternative quote from Insurance Board to determine whether changing insurance carriers provides a financial advantage while providing comparable coverage for Fellowship as we strive to be prudent with our church's finances.
