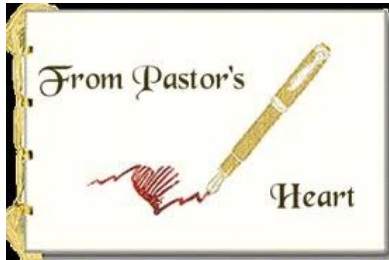

"Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming." Matthew 24:42

Happy New Year! No, I don't have the date wrong. On December 1st, we begin the new liturgical year with the season of Advent -- the coming of the Lord, the appearance of the Realm of God on the earth. In the church, we are looking toward the rule of God being made plain. While others are rushing about, driving themselves crazy planning parties, getting Christmas cards or e-mails designed and sent, getting gifts for everyone they think they should, and hiding the goodies from the kids until they can wrap them and put them under the tree, we are taking some time each day to prepare our hearts to be a place God can call home.

Or do we...

By the time Christmas is here, we will all be sick of "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer." But those hymns we love the most will be heard primarily in church, certainly not over the radio. And all those preparations will be done... or not. But when Christmas comes, the preparations will have to stop. And then we can take stock of our preparedness to accept God's vulnerability in coming to us as an infant, helpless as any other newborn.

We kick off the season of advent, the season of waiting and expectation, with hope. We know that Jesus is returning, not just at the end of time but in every time. Jesus is constantly knocking at the door of our lives, asking us to let him in. Our responsibility, especially in advent, is to be listening for the knock because it comes when we least expect it. In the Gospel of Matthew, using the symbolic, poetic language of his time, we learn:

... It can come when we are eating or drinking or when we are at a wedding reception, laughing and dancing.

... It can come when we are at work in the field or the factory, in the school or the office.

... It can come when things are going well or badly, when we are sick or when we are well, when we are happy or when we are disappointed. When we are up or when we are down.

Each year we begin Advent caught in the tension between the expectations of our faith and the ordinariness of life. Because we have been here so often before, it is hard to escape the routine of the season and open ourselves to the real expectations of the coming of the Son of Man. Advent is a season of hope that invites us to live as if Christ might come again this year. The celebration of the birth of Jesus is an affirmation that God does enter time in order to alter the course of events. But it is also a warning that most of the surrounding community will be unaware of the divine presence. Living with the expectation of divine visitation alters the way we perceive all events. If Christ were to come tomorrow, what would you want to be doing at the time of his coming? And how would a church want to be behaving?

Thank you to everyone who attended the congregation meeting on November 10. During the meeting, we approved a budget for 2020 that helps support our mission priorities. We also approved a resolution to return our benevolence policy to giving to the Southern Ohio Synod in an unrestricted state.

Financial Status

As of the end of October, our financial status is in line with our normal annual progression. We tend to have large giving in December, January and Easter-time. Other months, our income is often slightly below our actual income, but the surpluses in the high months gives us a cushion. As of Oct. 31, our Operating Fund balance was \$2,751 compared to \$3,501 last year. Our October income is \$440 more than I had estimated for our budget planning based on previous year's income patterns.

If you are a Thrivent Member, i.e., you have one or more Thrivent products such as Life Insurance, Long Term Care Insurance, or financial products, Thrivent has Choice Dollars and Thrivent Action Grants that are for giveback to charities. Choice Dollars are available once a year. You can designate which charity to send your Choice Dollars to. They also offer Action Grants to provide seed money for teams to use for service projects and other things. Action Grants are \$250 to spend to jumpstart a project. They are simple to apply for. We have used them to help offset some of our spending for event meals, like our Outdoor Service, Pumpkin Patch lunch, Amazing Grace Day Camp publicity and food, and others.

There are probably other rewards programs from credit cards to loyalty cards that can be directed to charitable organizations, that I am not aware of. If you know of any, let me know and we can let the congregation know.

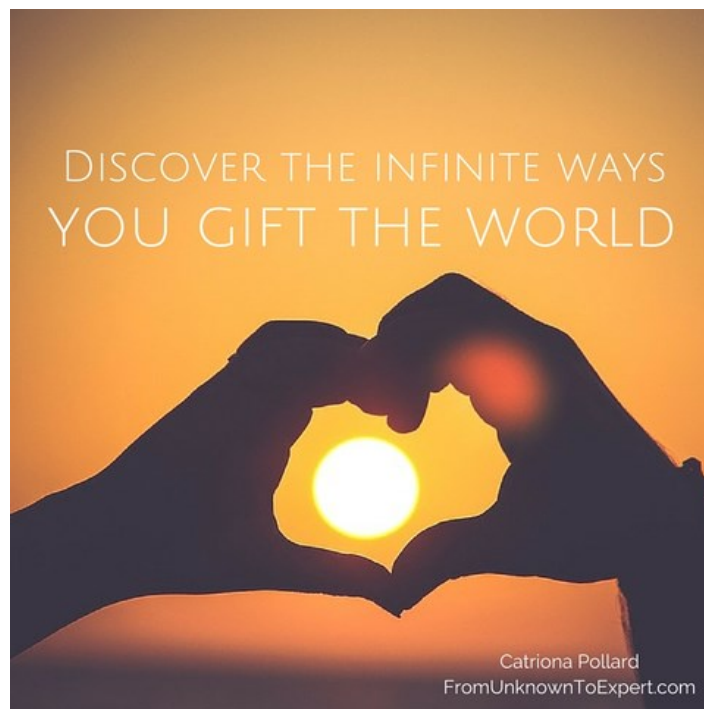
“From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.” Ephesians 4:16 (NRSV)

The ELCA has just completed its Always Being Made New campaign. The five-year campaign began in 2014. The goal was to raise \$200 million. The campaign had four priority areas:

- Congregations
- Hunger and Poverty
- Global church
- Leadership

ELCA ministries have seen record growth since the start of the campaign. Some of the key results have been funding for:

- 281 new-start congregations
- 453 Young Adults in Global Mission
- Scholarships for 1300 seminary students
- 135 long-term missionaries in more than 40 countries
- 11 new global ministry evangelism projects
- 29 renewing congregations grants
- 46 grants for youth and young adult ministries
- 953 hunger related ministries in the United States



Our congregation recently approved removing the restrictions on our benevolence to the Southern Ohio Synod so that the synod can forward part of our benevolence to be deployed to the ELCA. These programs are examples of the kinds of things that the ELCA is doing to spread God's word and do God's work in the United States and around the world.
