
In-person Worship Masks are now optional. Please feel free to wear a mask if you are more comfortable with one on.

Outreach Team

The message to you in this newsletter, on behalf of the Outreach Team, is one of faith, generosity, thanks, and giving – the faith, generosity, thanks, and giving that all of you at Fellowship give to those in our neighborhood and community. In 2 Corinthians 9:8, we learn that we should ⁸ "speak out, judge righteously, defend the rights of the poor and needy, And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work."

Through your faith, you share your abundance, talent, and time to the Smoky Row Food Pantry with those who need food and resources, and you give to the Good Samaritan fund to provide grocery and gas gift certificates to individuals, couples, and families coming to the doors of our church. Through your faith, you donate funds to the Lutheran Social Services Food Pantry, deliver meals to homebound individuals, serve hot dogs to the young people who play basketball in the parking lot, and books to neighborhood readers in the Little Library. Your generosity is a gift to many.

People ask for help when they feel desperate, intensely fatigued, disheartened, or dejected. We have served many this year – individuals and families – who have entered the doors of our church. They receive your assistance with gratitude, humility, thankfulness, and hope. Your support gives them peace, connection, and relief, if only for a short time.

In Proverbs 18:16, we learn that ¹⁶ "a gift opens doors; it gives access to the great." Fellowship was one of several churches that received a donation of funds from the sale of the Grace Lutheran Church in Pennsylvania where Pete Cardimen, his brother, and parents worshipped during his youth. The responsibility of the Outreach Team to faithfully distribute these funds to those in need has required thoughtful reflection, and a process of evaluation. Through this year, we have identified 22 organizations who serve those in need, and developed a table describing their mission and values, address and contact information, and the way they utilize and distribute their funds.

The Grace Lutheran Church funds have enabled our outreach ministry to support and enrich youth, families, and adults in our community and the world. To-date, financial donations have been made to the Frebis Food Pantry, Smoky Row Food Pantry,

Worthington Resource Center, Dublin Food Pantry, Faith Mission, CHOICES, First English Lutheran Church, Meals-on-Wheels, Lutheran World Hunger and Disaster Relief, Family Mentor Foundation, Hopewood Outdoors, Oesterlen Service for Youth, and Thrivent Builds. In addition, funds have subsidized the Fellowship Good Samaritan Fund and the Blessing Bags.

The COVID pandemic and recovery has stressed the mental health, food security, and economic structure of individuals and families, many of whom were stretched prior to the pandemic. Members of Fellowship serve the increasing number of people receiving support from Meals-on-Wheels, the Smoky Row Food Pantry, and the Blessing Bags of items you donated and assembled. The Smoky Row Food Pantry serves an additional 1000 families each year. Fellowship members who invest in Thrivent Management, Inc., have secured Thrivent Action Grants to purchase needed food and cold weather apparel to stock the shelves of the pantry. Funds donated to First English Lutheran Church help buy food used to serve more than 300 meals each week to Columbus inner-city residents. In summary, YOU have contributed time, caring, and resources to these organizations to support the immediate need of our neighbors. Levitical Law reminds us that we ¹⁸ "should love your neighbor as yourself." (Leviticus 19:18)

THANK YOU for sharing your faith, generosity, and giving to our neighbors and community members. You are gifted, caring members of Fellowship who share God's love with persons inside and outside of our doors.

2022 proved to be a slowly getting back to normal year for Fellowship's Education & Youth program. After 2 years of inactivity due to the Covid 19 virus, we began a long awaited restart.

- · An in- person Sunday school class for preschool through 3rd grade commenced shortly after the start of the beginning of the year. This class was taught by Karen Harris and Dianna Roll, and continued through early June. Although only a few children attended, it was a welcome start.
- · Graduate recognition in June was held for Gwen Cardimen, Lorien Crispin and Hayden Laucher. We wish these young adults much success as they entered college in the fall of 2022.
- · No summer Vacation Bible School or Amazing Grace day camp was held in 2022, but students were welcomed to attend a nearby church VBS program.
- The Rally Day kick off for Sunday school in the fall of 2022 was very successful and well attended by adults and youth. The event included an ice cream social and a service project for "Helping Hands". During this project members packed giving bags for those in need of basic essentials. Pastor Robin uses these to share with people that visit FLC for assistance.
- · Fall 2022 classes included a preschool- 3rd class, Catechism class and Adult Sunday school. Pete and Lily Cardimen taught the school age class, Pastor Robin led Catechism and Susan Wolfe taught our adults. Much appreciation to these members for volunteering time and planning to our Education Program.

As we continue to hold onto our faith and trust that life with reach a more comfortable normal, we look forward to continuing classes at Fellowship throughout the upcoming 2023 year. We hope to provide a summer program during the summer of 2023 providing there is interest and individuals willing to plan and organize it.

Property Updates:

Wanted to take the time to thank all who have contributed to our fund \$\$\$ raiser for the roof over the classroom and also the funds raised for the lights, and that we are continuing to raise to hit our Goal as we are close - so far, we have raised

\$14,753 - awesomeness

We still have \$497 left to cover the expenses - so we are well within reach.

Current Projects still in the works and or on going

Jay Francis Electrical:

- His company repairs the outside lighting. He is scheduled weather permitting the last last week in December and or first 2 weeks in January. Repairs needed:
- 3 ground lights on the monument sign need replaced and will be upgraded to new lighting technology LED - which will save us \$\$\$ in the long run
- One tall parking lot light near the basketball hoop this along with 2 other pole lights will
 also be upgraded to the new LED package. Taking advantage of the one-time rental fee
 for the lift truck that will reach the lights. It is \$800 each time to rent (APPX).
- The outside security light facing the businesses behind the church. This will require new wiring and will be completed when he comes out for all other repairs.

Evolved Lighting:

• Zack Griffin for the sanctuary lighting- we completed a walk through. This is ongoing and waiting on the contract to have it signed

Other accomplishments:

- Trimmed the big obstruction bush down so you can see when you pull out of the backparking lot
- Put up 2 church entrance signs on the back entrance for more directional awareness
- Bill Lude and I did the fall clean up leaves trimming of plants
- Glued down the carpet that was splitting at the seams near the lady's restroom

New opportunity:

• A new Roof leak in the Narthex - Rugh Roofing has been notified and will be out soon when the snow melts off of the roof and warms up.

Ongoing:

• Classroom one ceiling (small area) needs sanded and re painted from an old leak
